THE GAME

Oklahoma and Texas meet for the 101st time in the storied history of the AT&T Red River Rivalry. For the Sooners, who were off last week, this game also represents the Big 12 opener. The Longhorns own a 1-0 conference mark after defeating lowa State on Sept. 23.

THE SERIES

Texas snapped a five-game losing streak to OU last season and leads the series, 56-39-5. At Dallas, the Longhorns hold a 44-35-4 advantage. Since the Big 12 formed (1996), OU has a 6-4 lead.

THE COACHES

Oklahoma: Bob Stoops (Iowa '83) is 78-17 in his eighth season with the Sooners. He is 4-3 in bowls, 3-2 in January Bowls, 2-2 in BCS games, 49-10 vs. the Big 12, 27-7 vs. the Big 12 South, 22-3 vs. the Big 12 North, 3-1 in the Big 12 title game, 29-7 vs. non-conference opponents, 44-2 at home, 21-9 on the road, 13-6 on neutral fields and 22-8 vs. ranked opponents. He is 5-2 vs. Texas. **Texas:** Mack Brown (Florida State '74) is 87-20-0 in his ninth season with the Longhorns.

THE PROGRAM

■ Oklahoma's all-time record is 760-290-53. ■ The Sooners own seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000). ■ OU has 39 bowl appearances (No. 7 nationally) with 24 victories (No. 3 nationally). ■ Oklahoma has won 39 conference titles. ■ Since WWII, Oklahoma is the most success college football program with 515 victories. ■ Some 141 All-Americans and four Heisman Trophy winners have come from the Oklahoma program.

WEEKLY MEDIA LUNCHEON

Each Tuesday during the season OU hosts a media luncheon inside the Kerr McGee Stadium Club (east side) at Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. The luncheon begins at 11:15 a.m., with comments from the head coach of OU's opponent that week (by speaker phone if the coach is available). Lunch is served at 11:30 a.m., and OU head coach Bob Stoops steps to the podium at 12 p.m. A limited number of Sooner players are on hand for interviews.

CREDENTIALS

Requests for credentials are taken online. To receive the link to the web site, e-mail Kenny Mossman at kmossman@ou.edu. Requests must be submitted by a sports director/editor at least eight days prior to the contest. Media attending games will have passes scanned and must show government issued photo identification upon entering the stadium. If the name on the credential and the photo ID do not match, the credential will be voided.

FOR MEDIA ONLY

The University of Oklahoma Athletics Media Relations office operates a media-only website to assist in covering Sooner sports. The site is valuable for reporters, but also to desk personnel needing stock photographs or similar support. For information on accessing the site, contact Kenny Mossman.

PRACTICE

All practice sessions are closed to media and public unless otherwise posted. On days when post-practice interviews are conducted, media should gather outside the practice site 10-15 minutes before the workout is complete. Requests for interviews will be recorded at that time and members of the athletics media relations staff will escort media into the practice facility at the appropriate time.

INTERVIEWS

All interview requests should be submitted to the OU Athletic Media Relations Office ...

- Head Coach Bob Stoops will do general interviews following practice on Monday. All other requests must be submitted to Kenny Mossman.
- Assistant Coaches: The coaches are available after the Monday-Wednesday practices (coordinators who appear at the Tuesday luncheon are not available that day).
- Players: All interviews with players will take place at the media luncheon or after practice on Monday (offense) and Tuesday (defense). Media should request players at least 24 hours in advance. Those who attend the media luncheon are not available after Tuesday's practice.
- Post-Game: The OU locker room is closed at all times. Head coach Bob Stoops and several Sooners players will be brought to designated areas. After home games, the interview area is the Switzer Center's Red Room, located under the south end zone grandstand.

OU HONORS GAUTT



This season, Oklahoma honors the late Prentice Gautt. It was 50 years ago this season (1956) that Gautt became the first black football player at OU. Gautt, an Academic All-American during his playing days, went on to a successful career as a college administrator. He wore No. 38 on his jersey at Oklahoma. That number was not issued for this season. The Sooners are wearing a No. 38 decal (pictured below) on their helmets.



MORE ON THE SERIES

Played in the venerable Cotton Bowl, this game takes place during the State Fair of Texas. The two teams played six games in Dallas from 1912-1919, then settled there in 1929. Here is more on the game ...

- This marks the 78th consecutive year that the game as taken place in Dallas, which, according to Mapquest.com, is 189.9 miles from Norman, 196.7 miles from Austin.
- The school that wins this game takes home the Golden Hat Trophy, which resides each year with the winner. The Governor's Cup also stays with the winner, but is in the possession of the state's highest elected official.
- Overall: Texas leads, 56-39-5; At Dallas: Texas leads 44-35-5; At Norman: Texas leads, 3-1; At Austin: Texas leads, 7-2-1; At Oklahoma City: The series is tied 1-1. OU's Widest Margin of Victory: 65-13 in 2003; Texas' Widest Margin of Victory: 40-7 in 1941.
- Oklahoma won five straight games in the series before dropping last year's contest ... this marks the 56th time that at least one of the teams has entered this game with a national ranking ... the lower-rated team has prevailed 15 times in this series.

TIES WITH THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT

- Texas head coach Mack Brown was Oklahoma's offensive coordinator in 1984. He is the brother of Watson Brown, also a former OU assistant, whose UAB team lost in Norman earlier this season.
- Oklahoma co-defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach Bobby Jack Wright was on the Texas staff as an assistant coach from 1986-97.
- For the eighth straight year, an Austinite appears on OU roster. QB Hays McEachern and WR Fred Strong are two of the 10 Austin natives that have played for Oklahoma. McEachern is the son of Randy McEachern, a UT quarterback from 1977-78. His mother, Jenna, as a Longhorn cheerleader.
- Kellen Coleman, a sophomore student assistant in the OU Athletics Media Relations office, is the son of Lance Coleman, a Texas Ranger who serves as one of the main game day security guards for Longhorn coach Mack Brown. The younger Coleman was a high school classmate with Sooner QB Paul Thompson at Leander, Texas.

TRENDS

Through four games ...

- Oklahoma has a 208-yard advantage in returns, 545-337.
- Oklahoma is now +2 in turnover margin and is +6 over the last two games.
- OU opponents have only one first down by penalty.
- OU increased its rushing attempts in each game, from 29 in the opener to 44 in game four.
- After finishing the opener with a deficit of 10:28 in time of possession, the Sooners now have an advantage of 16 seconds.

SOUTH OF THE BORDER SUCCESS

Oklahoma has won 24 of its last 28 games against schools based in the state of Texas.

TRUE FROSH SEEING TIME

Last season, Oklahoma ranked No. 7 nationally by playing 12 true freshmen. Through four games this season, seven true freshman have made it to the field. Those seven are C Chase Beeler (the only one with a start, Middle Tennessee), OT Corey Brandon, WR Brandon Caleb, DB Quinton Carter, TE Jermaine Gresham, WR Adron Tennell and OT Trent Williams.

GOOD USE OF PREP TIME

When Oklahoma plays in this year's Red River Rivalry, it will have been 14 days since the Sooners' most recent game. That hasn't happened for Oklahoma in this series since 1984.

OU has had more than the standard six days of preparation for 26 previous games during the Stoops era and is 22-4 in those contests ...

THE SOONERS BRIEFLY

- Oklahoma was tabbed to win the Big 12's South Division in a preseason polling of league media. Sooner players Adrian Peterson, a running back, and Rufus Alexander, a linebacker, were selected as the league's preseason offensive and defensive players of the year, respectively.
- This Sooner team has just 11 seniors, the lowest number of Bob Stoops' tenure. The previous low was 12 by the 2001 squad.
- There are 24 players on this team with previous experience as a starter for OU. That's up from seven over the same time last season.
- Last season, OU was 8-4 overall and 6-2 in the Big 12 South. The Sooners played the most difficult schedule in NCAA Division I-A as the opponents were a combined 84-38. The 2005 season culminated with OU's win over then-No. 6 Oregon in the Holiday Bowl, 17-14.

OKLAHOMA'S MOST RECENT GAME

Oklahoma dismantled Middle Tennessee, 59-0, on Sept. 16 in Norman ...

- Oklahoma scored on six of its first seven offensive possessions and also got a defensive touchdown on Middle Tennessee's fourth possession. OU was up by a 45-0 count at halftime.
- It was the worst loss for Middle Tennessee in the Blue Raiders's I-A era (began in 1999).
- The length of the game was a brisk 2:43, the shortest since a two-hour, 40-minute game against Oklahoma State in 1991 (span of 176 games).
- Adrian peterson carried 27 times for 128 yards and three touchdowns.
- Paul Thompson connected on 13-of-18 psses for 257 yards with three TD and no INT.
- WR Malcolm Kelly caught five passes for 164 yards and one touchdown. His three grabs for 134 yards broke a 44-year old record for receiving yards in a guarter by a Sooner.
- LB Rufus Alexander tied a school record with five tackles for loss. He also forced one fumble.
- LB Zach Latimer got the first interception of his career and returned it 22 yards for a TD.
- Reggie Smith had a 61-yard punt return for a touchdown.

CROWDED HOUSE

With 253,458 in attendance for the first three home games of 2006, Oklahoma has now drawn 3,560,266 for Bob Stoops' 46 home games (started in 1999). All 46 have been sold out. OU has exceeded its listed capacity of 82,112 in 20 consecutive games. Since Stoops became the head coach, Oklahoma has increased the seating capacity of Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium by 9,347 seats.

TAKING A DIFFERENT POSITION

During Bob Stoops' tenure 14 players have moved from one position to earn a starting job at another. Perhaps most notable of those was OT Jammal Brown who moved from the defensive line. He went on to win the 2004 Outland Trophy and was a first-round draft pick of the New Orleans Saints. Like Brown, eight of those who have moved went from one side of the ball to the other. This team includes 10 players who have switched positions since arriving at Oklahoma.



STOOPS' COACHING TREE

There are four head coaches currently on the Division I-A level that were hired from Bob Stoops' Oklahoma staff -- Mike Leach at Texas Tech, Mark Mangino at Kansas, Mike Stoops at Arizona and Chuck Long at San Diego State.

OKLAHOMA TACKLES FULL SLATE OF I-A FOES ... AGAIN

For the seventh straight season OU is playing a schedule comprised entirely of NCAA Division I-A opponents. The Sooners have played exclusive I-A since Bob Stoops' opener in 1999 (49-0 over I-AA Indiana State). This season, OU is the only program in the Big 12 with a full I-A slate.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE

- Under Stoops, OU has produced its career leader in passing and receiving, while producing the fourth-ranked rusher in school history and the record-holder for single season rushing.
- Oklahoma has scored at least one touchdown in every game dating back to Nov. 7, 1998.
- On Stoops' watch, OU has 29, 200-yard rushing games with 24 over the last five years.
- Also under their current head coach, the Sooners have 96 touchdowns of 25-plus yards and 212 scoring drives that lasted less than two minutes.

PETERSON CHALLENGES MARK

RB Adrian Peterson, the No. 2 rusher in Division I-A, is pursuing OU's career rushing mark. That honor now resides with Billy Sims, who ran for 4,118 yards from 1975-79. Peterson entered 2006 with 3,033 yards, the best two-year total in school history. He is 442 yards shy

of Sims' mark. On the season, Peterson has 90 carries for 515 yards and four TD. This is the best start to a season for A.D., (short for "All Day," the nickname given him by his father). Through three games in 2004 he had 400 yards and through two last season he had 341.

- The nation's No. 3 rusher (160.8/game) and the only one of the top five that has not played against a I-AA opponent.
- Last season, he gained 1,104 yards despite missing all or parts of four games with an ankle injury. During that stretch, he got 16 carries for 57

yards. He still finished second in Big 12 rushing and was ahead of every other RB in the league (Missouri QB Brad Smith was the leader).

THOMPSON BACK AT QB

Paul Thompson, who moved to WR last season, did not return to the QB role until Aug. 3, but is off to a good start nevertheless.

- He has completed 62.2% of his passes with eight touchdowns and three interceptions. His average per completion is 15.2 yards.
- Over the last 45 years, most of which were run-dominated, there have been only four in which a Sooner QB completed 60% of his passes -- two by Jason White and two by Josh Heupel.
- Ranks No. 13 nationally in pass efficiency at 162.78.

SUPER SOPHS CATCHING ON

Two sophomores are leading a solid receiving corps ...

- Malcolm Kelly went over 500 career receiving yards with six grabs for a career-high 121 yards against Washington. He has three touchdown grabs over the last two games. Ranks No. 10 nationally with 94.8 yards/game, No. 3 in yards per reception, 22.3.
- Juaquin Iglesias has 12 catches for 132 yards this year after hauling in five for 78 at Oregon.

THE RETURN OF THE TIGHT END

OU's tight ends have eight receptions for 141 yards. Six of those grabs and 117 of those yards belong to junior Joe Jon Finley. He had 13 catches for 150 yards in 2005.

■ Last season, the Sooner tight ends had 20 catches for 260 yards, an average 1.6 receptions for 21.7 yards per game. This year's per game averages are 2.7 for 47.0, respectively.

- Oklahoma's offensive line is young my any standard with four sophomore starters, but that fact is magnified by the fact that none of the four redshirted. Of the nine players who have seen action on the line this year, all but one have at least two years of eligibility remaining.
- Chase Beeler became the second true freshman in as many seasons to play center when he saw action at Oregon. He started the Middle Tennessee game.



ABOUT THE DEFENSE

- Oklahoma has forced at least one turnover in 85 of Bob Stoops' 95 games and has at least one interception in 62 of the last 82. OU has multiple picks in 22 of its last 51 outings.
- Opponents completed 50 percent or more of their passes in less than half of their games against Stoops-coached teams -- 44 times in 95 games.
- Oklahoma has nine shutouts under its current head coach. During that time period, the opponents failed to score more than seven points 27 times. Foes have scored less than 14 points 49 times against OU in the Stoops era.
- With 11 starters in 12 games last season there were 132 combined starting assignments. Ninety-six of those return among the personnel on hand for the 2006 season.

END ALL, BE ALL

A look at one of OU's deepest postions, defensive end ...

- C.J. Ah You was the consensus Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year in 2005. He also captured Defensive MVP honors at the Pacific Life Holiday Bowl.
- Calvin Thibodeaux started every game last season and led the team with 10 sacks.
- Larry Birdine missed the first 11 games in '05 with a biceps injury, but is still on the Hendricks Watch List. In 2004, he did not start a game while working behind Dan Cody and Jonathan Jackson, yet finished No. 3 in the Big 12 with seven sacks.
- John Williams is thought to have huge upside. After redshirting in 2004, he had four tackles, a sack and a fumble recovery before injuring a knee in the 2005 opener vs. TCU. He missed the rest of the season.
- Alonzo Dotson is the nephew of former Baylor and Green Bay Packers great Santana Dotson. He sat out last season but will see playing time in 2006.

RIP AND RUN

Last year, Oklahoma returned its 13 interceptions for 220 yards, an average of 16.9 yards per return. Three of the 13 went for touchdowns. The return average was the third-highest in the Stoops era. The 2003 team set the standard with a 21.5-yard average on 24 picks. this year, the four interceptions have gone for 8.2 yards and one TD.

AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

- Oklahoma's 2005 defense ranked No. 13 in total yards. The Sooners have been among the nation's top 20 in total defense in each of Bob Stoops' seven seasons in Norman.
- Last year's team was No. 4 nationally against the rush (90.6). That was the best ranking by a Sooner defense in Stoops' tenure. The 2005 team had four of the 12 best performances against the rush under Stoops. The best outing came against Kansas when the Jayhawks got just 11 yards. Oklahoma State got 13, Nebraska 16 and Kansas State 22.

POINT(S) WELL TAKEN

In the five years before Bob Stoops arrived, Oklahoma gave up an average of 27.08 points per game. Over the last five seasons, the Sooners have surrendered on average just 16.06.



BUTKUS AWARD NO. 5?

Oklahoma linebacker **Rufus Alexander** is vying to become the Sooners' fifth Butkus Award winner.

With Brian Bosworth winning two, Rocky Calmus one and Teddy Lehman one, OU has a number that no other school can match.

Alexander has 29 tackles through two games of '06 to o with two fumbles forced, one fumble recovery, two pass break-ups and one sack.

Last Saturday, Alexander notched his 200th career tackle. He now has 214 and is No. 20 spot on the school's career tackle list for linebackers. He needs just six to move past Lance Mitchell for the 19th spot.

When Alexander recorded five tackles for loss in this year's game against Middle Tennessee, he tied an OU record held by Teddy Lehman, Jimmy Wilkerson, Brian Bosworth, Tony Casillas, keith Gary and Greg Sellmeyer.

ABOUT THE SPECIAL TEAMS

Oklahoma's special teams under Bob Stoops ...

- There have been 23 special teams TD, including 16 in the last 48 regular season games. Those 16 came via five different kinds of plays -- 10 punt returns, two faked FG, two blocked punts, a kickoff return and a faked punt. The special teams also own one safety in that span.
- In total, OU has returned five kickoffs and 13 punts for TD on Stoops's watch (since 1999).
- The Sooners have blocked 19 kicks.
- Last season OU ran a trick play, blocked a kick or tackled a punter in five of the 12 games.

MANY HAPPY RETURNS

Information on returns during the Stoops era ...

- Kickoff Returns -- 42 returns of 25 yards or more with five touchdowns.
- Punt Returns -- 43 returns of 15 or more yards with 14 touchdowns.
- Interceptions Returns -- 54 returns of 10 or more yards with 15 touchdowns.
- Fumble Returns -- Three returns of 15 or more yards with three touchdowns.

THE 2006 RETURN GAME

Oklahoma is averaging 26.4 yards on kickoff returns and 13.9 on punt returns. Last season, the Sooners averaged 18.2 yards on kickoff returns and 7.4 on punt returns.

- Reggie Smith has 10 punt returns for a 15.9-yard average. In the Washington game, he picked up an 82-yard punt and returned it 62 yards. He has two of 25 yards or longer. At Oregon, he had a 55-yard kickoff return. Smith ranks No. 11 nationally in punt returns.
- Juaquin Iglesias has been an effective kickoff returner with four for a 31.8-yard average. All four of his returns totaled between 31 and 33 yards.
- Oklahoma's coverage teams have been good, allowing just 6.1 yards on punt returns and 19.8 on kickoff returns.

THE LONG AND SHORT OF THE PUNTING GAME

Michael Cohen is handling the long punts for OU and Mike Knall the short ...

- Cohen got all of the punts against Washington and has six of OU's seven on the season. He is averaging 42.5 yards (No. 13 nationally) with two downed inside the 20 (one at the 1).
- Cohen's punting average has improved each game from 40.7 to 44.3 to 45.6.
- Knall had two punts inside the 30 vs. Middle Tennessee (one at three, one at the 15).

MCEACHERN GETS A GRIP

Back-up QB Hays McEachern, whose father played at Texas and whose mother was a cheer-leader for the Longhorns, is the holder. He is the first QB to hold since Patrick Fletcher in 2000.

CRIMSON SNAPPER

OU lost Jacob Rice to graduation. He was the long snapper for all 52 games of his career. Derek Shaw has taken over the duties. The true freshman is perfect in 30 snaps this season.

SOONERS HAVE HART-LEY

K Garrett Hartley is in his third season in the starter's role. He won the job in the regular season finale of his true freshman season (2004) ...

- Hartley is 9-of-10 on field goal attempts and 18-of-18 on PATs this season. He has kicked off 31 times (one sky kick) with 14 touchbacks.
- He made a career-high four field goals at Oregon.
- Last season, Hartley had 67 kickoffs (including squibs) with 33 touchbacks for an average of 58.5 yards per kick. He had five touchbacks vs. Kansas State, three against Texas (on four kicks) and Texas A&M.
- His 52-yard FG at Texas last year was the longest ever by a Sooner against the Longhorns. It also was his career best. He made 50-yarders against Nebraska and TCU.
- Last season, Hartley made 14-of-22 field goals and 37-of-38 PATs.

The tradition, so rich and so long-standing, is as daunting as it is impressive. To be among the best at Oklahoma is to be among the best in college football.

Such dramatics are lost on Bob Stoops. The Sooner head coach befriended the would-be albatross of OU's successful past from his first

day on campus and remains steadfastly focused on tomorrow and the championship it holds.

It falls then to the observers and experts of the game to define Stoops' impact. Rarely have the pundits had it so easy.

Under Stoops, Oklahoma has won 78 games (78-17), spent 69 consecutive weeks in the national rankings, played in seven bowl games, four of the BCS variety, and captured three Big 12 crowns. His 2000 team won the national champion-

ship. On a playing field leveled by scholarship limits and parity, this era stares down the Oklahoma standard and does not blink.

The achievement dulls the memory of what Stoops inherited. When he arrived in Norman, the proud Sooner program was five years removed from a winning record, four from bowl play. Those atypical days of angst are so forgotten now that they might as well be mentioned with the land rush and dust bowl.

Stoops has been characterized as a grounded family man, brilliant big-game coach, relentless recruiter, disciplined leader and a person with uncommon perspective. His success emanates from a disciplined style true to his roots in the Steel Valley of Ohio, but he is far from inflexible. The principles to which he holds are the tried and true axioms of the sport ... mixed with cutting edge strategy and an appreciation for the calculated risk.

During his time, OU has produced record—setting passers and receivers, three 1,000-yard rushers, suffocating defense and special teams

units that rank among the most dynamic in the land. Every facet has been impacted.

His players have snagged 16 national awards, including the 2003 Heisman Trophy won by Jason White. There have been 54 academic honorees, 47 All-Big 12 players, 21 All-Americans and 29 NFL draft choices.

Stoops has won a total of 10 national coach

of the year awards and has been Big 12 Coach of the year in three of his six campaigns in Norman.

This is one of the finest coaches in the history of one of college football's most storied traditions.

The son of a coach, Stoops was a four-year starter at lowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry. He worked through the ranks until he became co-defensive coordinator at Kansas State (1991-

95).

With the Wildcats, he played a key role in their impressive turnaround. During his final four seasons there, K-State was 35-12 with three bowl appearances. Eventually, he left for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. In 1996, he was part of a national championship team. It was with the Gators that the spotlight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession.

Stoops, who was born Sept. 9, 1960, in Youngstown, Ohio, graduated from lowa in 1983 with a degree in marketing. He and his wife, Carol, have three children: daughter, Mackenzie, and twin sons, Drake and Isaac.

NORMAN, Okla. -- Adrian Peterson rushed for one touchdown and caught another as Oklahoma withstood a stubborn UAB team, 24-17. A crowd of 84,555, the largest ever to see an OU opener, witnessed the game.

Like the 2005 opener, when the Sooners lost to TCU, 17-10, Oklahoma committed four turnovers. Peterson had one of those, a fumble, but atoned with a four-yard touchdown run and a 69-yard TD reception.

Paul Thompson got the start at quarterback and was impressive. He completed eight of his first 10 and finished 14-of-24 for 227 yards. He was picked off twice, but also had a pair of scoring tosses.

OU trailed only once, 17-14, but scored on its first play after falling behind on the swing pass from Thompson to Peterson.

The two teams combined for just 110 plays, a record for fewest plays in a game over the last 50 seasons.

NORMAN, Okla. -- Paul Thompson threw for a career-high 227 yards and Adrian Peterson plowed through Washington's defense for 165 more as Oklahoma thwarted Washington before a gathering of 85,577.

Washington scored on its first play from scrimmage, a 54-yard bolt by Kenny James before the teams settled into a tight first half. The score was tied at 13-all at halftime.

The Sooners then put the game away with 24 unanswered points. The flurry started with a 35-yard pass from Thompson to Kelly, their second hook-up of the day for a touchdown.

Garrett Hartley then added the third of his three field goals before Peterson ran in from 17 yards and one yard to settle the issue.

Kelly posted six grabs for a career-high 121 yards. Hartley made all three field goals, all four PAT kicks and launched touchbacks on seven of his eight kickoffs (the exception was a sky kick in the fourth quarter).

FS Darien Williams led OU with 13 tackles. LB Rufus Alexander added 10. LB Zach Latimer had one of the biggest plays when he forced a fumble at the Sooner eight. Oklahoma trailed early, then built a 33-20 lead in the fourth quarter. A defense that had played well through the second and third periods, faltered in the fourth and wound up surrendering 501 yards on the day.
