PLAYER TO WATCH

FS Darien Williams is coming off an outstanding performance against Iowa State. The sophomore had nine tackles, two sacks and an interception with a return for 35 yards. It was the first multiple-sack game by an Oklahoma DB since another OU Williams, Roy, had two vs. Arkansas in the 2002 Cotton Bowl (2001 season). Earlier this season, the current Williams had a career-high 13 tackles in the 37-20 win over Washington.

THE GAME

Oklahoma plays the second of two straight games against the Big 12 North when Colorado visits for the Sooner Homecoming. OU will recognize the 1956 National Championship team and honor the late Prentice Gautt, a member of that '56 squad, and the first black football player at OU.

THE SERIES

Oklahoma leads the series with Colorado, 38-16-2, including a 19-7 advantage in Norman. OU has won four straight over the Buffaloes.

THE COACHES

Oklahoma: Bob Stoops (Iowa '83) is 79-18 in his eighth season with the Sooners. He is 4-3 in bowls, 3-2 in January Bowls, 2-2 in BCS games, 50-11 vs. the Big 12, 28-8 vs. the Big 12 South, 22-3 vs. the Big 12 North, 3-1 in the Big 12 title game, 29-7 vs. non-conference opponents, 45-2 at home, 21-9 on the road, 13-7 on neutral fields and 22-9 vs. ranked opponents. He is 4-1 vs. Colorado.
Colorado: Dan Hawkins (UC-Davis '84) is 1-6 in his first season at CU, 93-29 in 11 years overall.

THE PROGRAM

■ Oklahoma's all-time record is 761-291-53. ■ The Sooners own seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000). ■ OU has 39 bowl appearances (No. 7 nationally) with 24 victories (No. 3 nationally). ■ Oklahoma has won 39 conference titles. ■ Since WWII, Oklahoma is the most successful college football program with 515 victories. ■ Some 141 All-Americans and four Heisman Trophy winners have come from the Oklahoma program.

WEEKLY MEDIA LUNCHEON

Each Tuesday during the season OU hosts a media luncheon inside the Kerr McGee Stadium Club (east side) at Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. The luncheon begins at 11:15 a.m., with comments from the head coach of OU's opponent that week (by speaker phone if the coach is available). Lunch is served at 11:30 a.m., and OU head coach Bob Stoops steps to the podium at 12 p.m. A limited number of Sooner players are on hand for interviews.

CREDENTIALS

Requests for credentials are taken online. To receive the link to the web site, e-mail Kenny Mossman at kmossm@ou.edu. Requests must be submitted by a sports director/editor at least eight days prior to the contest. Media attending games will have passes scanned and must show government issued photo identification upon entering the stadium. If the name on the credential and the photo ID do not match, the credential will be voided.

FOR MEDIA ONLY

The University of Oklahoma Athletics Media Relations office operates a media-only website to assist in covering Sooner sports. The site is valuable for reporters, but also to desk personnel needing stock photographs or similar support. For information on accessing the site, contact Kenny Mossman.

PRACTICE

All practice sessions are closed to media and public unless otherwise posted. On days when post-practice interviews are conducted, media should gather outside the practice site 10-15 minutes before the workout is complete. Requests for interviews will be recorded at that time and members of the athletics media relations staff will escort media into the practice facility at the appropriate time.

INTERVIEWS

All interview requests should be submitted to the OU Athletic Media Relations Office ...

- **Head Coach** Bob Stoops will do general interviews following practice on Monday. All other requests must be submitted to Kenny Mossman.
- **Assistant Coaches:** The coaches are available after the Monday-Wednesday practices (coordinators who appear at the Tuesday luncheon are not available that day).
- **Players:** All interviews with players will take place at the media luncheon or after practice on Monday (offense) and Tuesday (defense). Media should request players at least 24 hours in advance. Those who attend the media luncheon are not available after Tuesday's practice.
- **Post-Game:** The OU locker room is closed at all times. Head coach Bob Stoops and several Sooners players will be brought to designated areas. After home games, the interview area is the Switzer Center's Red Room, located under the south end zone grandstand.

OU HONORS GAUTT



This season, Oklahoma honors the late Prentice Gautt. It was 50 years ago this season (1956) that Gautt became the first black football player at OU. Gautt, an Academic All-American during his playing days, went on to a successful career as a college administrator. He wore No. 38 on his jersey at Oklahoma. That number was not issued for this season. The Sooners are wearing a No. 38 decal (pictured below) on their helmets.



A SPECIAL HOMECOMING

This week's Homecoming game features special events related to OU football of the past ...

- Oklahoma will recognize the late Prentice Gautt, a Sooner in the mid 1950's. He was the first black football player at OU and later earned wide acclaim as an administrator in both the Big 8 and Big 12 Conference offices. Gautt's No. 38 was not issued at OU this season. On Saturday, the 38-yardline on each end of the field will be highlighted in crimson in recognition of Gautt. Members of his family will be on hand for the game.
- Also set to be recognized is the 1956 team, which celebrates its 50th anniversary since winning the National Championship. Gautt was a member of that team. Thirty-four players from the '56 squad are scheduled to attend. Among those are former Sooner All-Americans Bill Krisher, Tommy McDonald and Clendon Thomas

THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT

Colorado picked up its first victory of the season last, 30-6, over Texas Tech in Boulder. Among its first six games were four that were decided by less than 10 points and one that went to triple overtime. The Buffs are under the direction of first-year coach Dan Hawkins.

TIES WITH THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT

- Oklahoma assistant coach Chris Wilson was on the CU staff from 2000-2004.
- The Oklahoma roster includes Coloradoans Jon Cooper (starting center, Fort Collins) and Zach Latimer (starting linebacker, Denver).

TRENDS

- After committing 11 penalties and five turnovers against, Texas, Oklahoma came back against Iowa State with three penalties and no turnovers. It ended a string of seven straight games in which the Sooners had turned the ball over at least once.
- Oklahoma has rushed for at least 100 yards in 12 straight games.
- In three games since allowing 501 total yards at Oregon, Oklahoma has surrendered a total of just 568 yards in games against Middle Tennessee and Texas. That's an average of just 188.3 yards per game.
- OU opponents have only one first down by penalty.
- Oklahoma has run less than 60 plays just once this season (first game). OU opponents haven't run more than 54 plays in any of the last three games.
- Eight of Oklahoma's nine sacks have come over the last four games.
- Visiting teams have converted just 10-of-50 third downs in Norman this year and only one team (Washington) converted more than two.

STREAKING AGAINST THE NORTH

Oklahoma has swept its three regular season games against Big 12 North Division teams in four consecutive seasons. The regular season streak against the North stands at 13 games while the overall streak, including the Big 12 title game stands at eight.

- Under Bob Stoops, OU is 23-3 against the North.
- Stoops' home mark against the North stands at 12-0. Oklahoma scored more than 30 points in 11 of those games and won 11 by double digits.

HOME FIELD HONCHOS

Oklahoma is 45-2 at Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium under Bob Stoops and has won its last nine in a row and 28 of its last 29 in the venue. The two longest home field winning streaks under Stoops were 19 and 17 games.

TRUE FROSH SEEING TIME

Last season, Oklahoma ranked No. 7 nationally by playing 12 true freshmen. Through four games this season, seven true freshman have made it to the field. Those seven are C Chase Beeler (the only one with a start, Middle Tennessee), OT Corey Brandon, WR Brandon Caleb, DB Quinton Carter, TE Jermaine Gresham, WR Adron Tennell and OT Trent Williams.

- Twenty of the 51 players (39%) who saw action in last week's game have at least two years of eligibility remaining after this season.

THE SOONERS BRIEFLY

- Oklahoma was tabbed to win the Big 12's South Division in a preseason polling of league media. Sooner players Adrian Peterson, a running back, and Rufus Alexander, a linebacker, were selected as the league's preseason offensive and defensive players of the year, respectively.
- This Sooner team has just 11 seniors, the lowest number of Bob Stoops' tenure. The previous low was 12 by the 2001 squad.
- There are 24 players on this team with previous experience as a starter for OU. That's up from seven over the same time last season.
- Last season, OU was 8-4 overall and 6-2 in the Big 12 South. The Sooners played the most difficult schedule in NCAA Division I-A as the opponents were a combined 84-38. The 2005 season culminated with OU's win over then-No. 6 Oregon in the Holiday Bowl, 17-14.

OKLAHOMA'S MOST RECENT GAME

Oklahoma pummeled Iowa State, 34-9, in Norman last Saturday ...

- Adrian Peterson rushed for 183 yards and tacked on 45 more in receptions, but suffered a broken left collar bone on a 53-yard touchdown run and could miss the remainder of the season.
- FS Darien Williams was brilliant with nine tackles, two sacks and an interception he returned 35 yards.
- Iowa State entered the game averaging 22.3 points and 349.7 yards, but managed just nine (two on a safety) and 238, respectively.
- Paul Thompson completed seven of his first eight and finished 16-of-27 for 195 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions.

CROWDED HOUSE

With 337,610 in attendance for the first four home games of 2006, Oklahoma has now drawn 3,897,876 for Bob Stoops' 47 home games (started in 1999). All 47 have been sold out. OU has exceeded its listed capacity of 82,112 in 21 consecutive games. Since Stoops became the head coach, Oklahoma has increased the seating capacity of Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium by 9,347 seats.

TAKING A DIFFERENT POSITION

During Bob Stoops' tenure 14 players have moved from one position to earn a starting job at another. Perhaps most notable of those was OT Jammal Brown who moved from the defensive line. He went on to win the 2004 Outland Trophy and was a first-round draft pick of the New Orleans Saints. Like Brown, eight of those who have moved went from one side of the ball to the other. This team includes 10 players who have switched positions since arriving at Oklahoma.

STOOPS' COACHING TREE

There are four head coaches currently on the Division I-A level that were hired from Bob Stoops' Oklahoma staff -- Mike Leach at Texas Tech, Mark Mangino at Kansas, Mike Stoops at Arizona and Chuck Long at San Diego State.

OKLAHOMA TACKLES FULL SLATE OF I-A FOES ... AGAIN

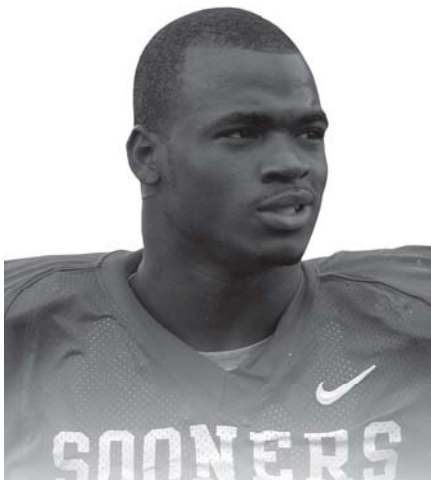
For the seventh straight season OU is playing a schedule comprised entirely of NCAA Division I-A opponents. The Sooners have played exclusive I-A since Bob Stoops' opener in 1999 (49-0 over I-AA Indiana State).

- This season, OU is the only program in the Big 12 with a full I-A slate. At present, the Sooners have played the 15th-most difficult schedule in I-A. That rank second in the Big 12 to Texas Tech.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE

- Under Stoops, OU produced its career leader in passing and receiving, while producing the fourth and fifth-ranked rusher in school history and the record-holder for single season rushing.
- Oklahoma has scored at least one touchdown in every game dating back to Nov. 7, 1998.
- On Stoops' watch, OU has 29, 200-yard rushing games with 24 over the last five years.
- Also under their current head coach, the Sooners have 98 touchdowns of 25-plus yards and 215 scoring drives that lasted less than two minutes.

RUNNING GAME OPTIONS

With RB Adrian Peterson with a broken collarbone, OU looks elsewhere in the running game ...

- Junior Allen Patrick has been listed No. 2, but has no career starts. He converted from CB last season. Patrick has 43 career rushing attempts for 198 yards and two touchdowns. This season, he has 18 tries for 62 yards and no touchdowns. His career best for rushing attempts is 15 (2005, Baylor) while his top rushing performance was 52 yards (2006, Middle Tennessee). The speedster's TD runs came from 28 yards vs. Texas A&M and 27 yards vs. Oklahoma State, both last season. He has four career receptions for 8 yards and four kickoff returns for 69.
- Junior Jacob Gutierrez has two career starts, both last season. His career numbers are 50 attempts for 271 yards and two touchdowns. He started vs. Baylor last season and got 30 carries for 173 yards and two TD. Gutierrez has two career receptions for 11 yards, but none this season. He underwent knee surgery after an ACL injury sustained in the 2005 Holiday Bowl.
- The true frosh are Chris Brown, Mossis Madu and DeMarco Murray. None have played.

SANS AD

Because of injury, Adrian Peterson was out for all of last year's Baylor game and more than half of games against Kansas State, Texas and Kansas. OU rushed for 232 vs. K-State (Peterson had 51 before spraining an ankle), 77 vs. Texas (Peterson had 10), 95 vs. Kansas (Peterson had -4) and 205 vs. Baylor (Peterson DNP). Peterson missed no games in 2004.

- OU was 3-1 in those games and out-rushed three of the four opponents.
- At the time of his injury this season, Peterson was No. 2 nationally in rushing and all-purpose yards and No. 4 in scoring.

PT CRUISIN'

Paul Thompson, who moved to WR last season, did not return to the QB role until Aug. 3 ...

- His completion rate is 60.5% with 10 TD and five INT. His average/completion is 14.5 yards.
- Over the last 45 years, most of which were run-dominated, there have been only four in which a Sooner QB completed 60% of his passes -- two by Jason White and two by Josh Heupel.
- He has at least one TD pass in five of the six games and multiple scoring throws in four.

SUPER SOPHS CATCHING ON

Two sophomores are leading a solid receiving corps ...

- Malcolm Kelly went over 500 career receiving yards with six catches for a career-high 121 yards against Washington. He has TD receptions in all but two games. Ranks No. 8 nationally in yards per reception, 21.6 (among players with 20 receptions).
- Juaquin Iglesias has 21 catches for 257 yards with four or more grabs in four straight games.
- Manuel Johnson has four receptions in each of the last two games.

TRENCH TALK

Oklahoma lost four seniors (two were drafted) who gobbled up 41 starts last season in the offensive line, but there are returnees who either started or saw extensive action ...

- Oklahoma's offensive line is young by any standard with four sophomore starters, but that is magnified by the fact that none of the four redshirted. Of the nine players who have seen action on the line this year, all but one have at least two years of eligibility remaining.
- Chase Beeler became the second true freshman in as many seasons to play center when he saw action at Oregon. He started the Middle Tennessee game.

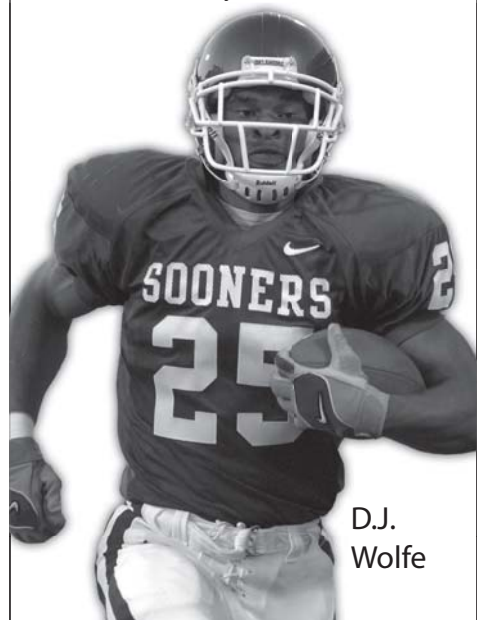

ABOUT THE DEFENSE

■ Oklahoma has forced at least one turnover in 86 of Bob Stoops' 97 games and has at least one interception in 63 of the last 84. OU has multiple picks in 23 of its last 53 outings.

■ Opponents completed 50 percent or more of their passes in less than half of their games against Stoops-coached teams -- 46 times in 97 games.

■ Oklahoma has nine shutouts under its current head coach. During that time period, the opponents failed to score more than seven points 27 times. Foes have scored less than 14 points 49 times against OU in the Stoops era.

■ With 11 starters in 12 games last season there were 132 combined starting assignments. Ninety-six of those return among the personnel on hand for the 2006 season.

THEN AND NOW

In the three games (Middle Tennessee, Texas and Iowa State) since giving up 501 yards of total offense to Oregon, the Sooners have tightened things up defensively. During this three-game span, OU's foes ...

■ Have averaged just 188.3 total yards (a total of 564 yards).

■ Have completed 31-of-63 passes (49.2%) for an average of 110 yards with three touchdowns and four interceptions.

■ Have converted just 5-of-33 third downs (15.2%).

■ Have committed seven of their 13 turnovers for the season.

END ALL, BE ALL

A look at one of OU's deepest positions, defensive end ...

■ **C.J. Ah You** was the consensus Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year in 2005. He also captured Defensive MVP honors at the Pacific Life Holiday Bowl.

■ **Calvin Thibodeaux** started every game last season and led the team with 10 sacks.

■ **Larry Birdine** missed the first 11 games in '05 with a biceps injury, but is still on the Hendricks Watch List. In 2004, he did not start a game while working behind Dan Cody and Jonathan Jackson, yet finished No. 3 in the Big 12 with seven sacks.

■ **John Williams** is thought to have huge upside. After redshirting in 2004, he had four tackles, a sack and a fumble recovery before injuring a knee in the 2005 opener vs. TCU. He missed the rest of the season.

■ **Alonzo Dotson** is the nephew of former Baylor and Green Bay Packers great Santana Dotson. He sat out last season but will see playing time in 2006.

RIP AND RUN

Oklahoma has six interceptions with a return average of 11.3 yards and one touchdown. Last year, Oklahoma returned its 13 interceptions for 220 yards, an average of 16.9 yards per return. Three of the 13 went for touchdowns. The return average was the third-highest in the Stoops era. The 2003 team set the standard with a 21.5-yard average on 24 picks. This year, the four interceptions have gone for 8.2 yards and one TD.



BUTKUS AWARD NO. 5?

Oklahoma linebacker **Rufus Alexander** is vying to become the Sooners' fifth Butkus Award winner.

With Brian Bosworth winning two, Rocky Calmus one and Teddy Lehman one, OU can lay claim to the title "Linebacker U.," as no other school in the country can lay claim to so many Butkus winners.

Alexander has 41 tackles thus far along with two fumbles forced, one fumble recovery, two pass break-ups and one sack.

He now has 226 career tackles and is No. 18 on the school's career tackle list for linebackers. He needs just 20 to move past Mark Driscoll for the 17th spot.

When Alexander recorded five tackles for loss in this year's game against Middle Tennessee, he tied an OU record held by Teddy Lehman, Jimmy Wilkerson, Brian Bosworth, Tony Casillas, Keith Gary and Greg Sellmeyer.

ABOUT THE SPECIAL TEAMS

Oklahoma's special teams under Bob Stoops ...

- There have been 23 special teams TD, including 16 in the last 50 regular season games. Those 16 came via five different kinds of plays -- 10 punt returns, two faked FG, two blocked punts, a kickoff return and a faked punt. The special teams also own one safety in that span.
- In total, OU has returned five kickoffs and 13 punts for TD on Stoops' watch (since 1999).
- The Sooners have blocked 19 kicks.
- Last season OU ran a trick play, blocked a kick or tackled a punter in five of the 12 games.

MANY HAPPY RETURNS

Information on returns during the Stoops era ...

- Kickoff Returns -- 43 returns of 25 yards or more with five touchdowns.
- Punt Returns -- 43 returns of 15 or more yards with 14 touchdowns.
- Interceptions Returns -- 55 returns of 10 or more yards with 15 touchdowns.
- Fumble Returns -- Three returns of 15 or more yards with three touchdowns.

THE 2006 RETURN GAME

Oklahoma is averaging 24.1 yards on kickoff returns and 11.3 on punt returns. Last season, the Sooners averaged 18.2 yards on kickoff returns and 7.4 on punt returns.

- Reggie Smith has 20 punt returns for a 11.3-yard average. In the Washington game, he picked up an 82-yard punt and returned it 62 yards. He has two of 25 yards or longer. At Oregon, he had a 55-yard kickoff return. He had a 61-yard return for a touchdown against Middle Tennessee. Smith ranks No. 16 nationally in punt returns.
- Juquin Iglesias has been an effective kickoff returner with five for a 29.4-yard average. Four of his returns exceeded 30 yards.
- The coverage teams allow just 6.2 yards on punt returns, 18.9 on kickoff returns.

THE LONG AND SHORT OF THE PUNTING GAME

Michael Cohen is handling the long punts for OU and Mike Knall the short ...

- Cohen got all of the punts against Washington and has six of OU's seven on the season. He is averaging 41.2 yards with four downed inside the 20 (one at the 1).
- Knall has nine punts downed inside the 20 for the season. Used only in short field situations, he has only one touchback in six kicks.

MCEACHERN GETS A GRIP

Back-up QB Hays McEachern, whose father played at Texas and whose mother was a cheerleader for the Longhorns, is the holder. He is the first QB to hold since Patrick Fletcher in 2000.

CRIMSON SNAPPER

OU lost Jacob Rice to graduation. He was the long snapper for all 52 games of his career. Derek Shaw has taken over the duties. The true freshman is perfect in 49 snaps this season.

SOONERS HAVE HART-LEY

K Garrett Hartley is in his third season in the starter's role. He won the job in the regular season finale of his true freshman season (2004) ...

- Hartley is 12-of-13 on field goal attempts and 23-of-23 on PATs this season. He has kicked off 42 times (one sky kick) with 19 touchbacks.
- He made a career-high four field goals at Oregon.
- Last season, Hartley had 67 kickoffs (including squibs) with 33 touchbacks for an average of 58.5 yards per kick. He had five touchbacks vs. Kansas State, three against Texas (on four kicks) and Texas A&M.
- His 52-yard FG at Texas last year was the longest ever by a Sooner against the Longhorns. It also was his career best. He made 50-yarders against Nebraska and TCU.
- Last season, Hartley made 14-of-22 field goals and 37-of-38 PATs.

History is one tough customer at Oklahoma. The tradition, so rich and so long-standing, is as daunting as it is impressive. To be among the best at Oklahoma is to be among the best in college football.

Such dramatics are lost on Bob Stoops. The Sooner head coach befriended the would-be albatross of OU's successful past from his first day on campus and remains steadfastly focused on tomorrow and the championship it holds.

It falls then to the observers and experts of the game to define Stoops' impact. Rarely have the pundits had it so easy.

Under Stoops, Oklahoma has won 79 games (79-18), spent 69 consecutive weeks in the national rankings, played in seven bowl games, four of the BCS variety, and captured three Big 12 crowns. His 2000 team won the national championship. On a playing field leveled by scholarship limits and parity, this era stares down the Oklahoma standard and does not blink.

The achievement dulls the memory of what Stoops inherited. When he arrived in Norman, the proud Sooner program was five years removed from a winning record, four from bowl play. Those atypical days of angst are so forgotten now that they might as well be mentioned with the land rush and dust bowl.

Stoops has been characterized as a grounded family man, brilliant big-game coach, relentless recruiter, disciplined leader and a person with uncommon perspective. His success emanates from a disciplined style true to his roots in the Steel Valley of Ohio, but he is far from inflexible. The principles to which he holds are the tried and true axioms of the sport ... mixed with cutting edge strategy and an appreciation for the calculated risk.

During his time, OU has produced record-setting passers and receivers, three 1,000-yard rushers, suffocating defense and special teams

units that rank among the most dynamic in the land. Every facet has been impacted.

His players have snagged 16 national awards, including the 2003 Heisman Trophy won by Jason White. There have been 54 academic honorees, 47 All-Big 12 players, 21 All-Americans and 29 NFL draft choices.

Stoops has won a total of 10 national coach

of the year awards and has been Big 12 Coach of the year in three of his six campaigns in Norman.

This is one of the finest coaches in the history of one of college football's most storied traditions.

The son of a coach, Stoops was a four-year starter at Iowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry. He worked through the ranks until he became co-defensive coordinator at Kansas State (1991-



95).

With the Wildcats, he played a key role in their impressive turnaround. During his final four seasons there, K-State was 35-12 with three bowl appearances. Eventually, he left for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. In 1996, he was part of a national championship team. It was with the Gators that the spotlight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession.

Stoops, who was born Sept. 9, 1960, in Youngstown, Ohio, graduated from Iowa in 1983 with a degree in marketing. He and his wife, Carol, have three children: daughter, Mackenzie, and twin sons, Drake and Isaac.

OU trailed only once, 17-14, but scored on its first play after falling behind on the swing pass from Thompson to Peterson.

The two teams combined for just 110 plays, a record for fewest plays in a game over the last 50 seasons.

NORMAN, Okla. -- Rarely has an Oklahoma victory been so painful for the Sooners as was this 34-9 triumph over Iowa State.

Oklahoma dominated the visiting Cyclones, but on its final touchdown of the day lost running back Adrian Peterson to a broken collarbone. It came at the end of a 53-yard gallop that had the crowd of 84,152 whipped into a frenzy.

Moments later, doctors on the sideline determined the severity of the injury.

While still searching for perfection, OU head coach Bob Stoops had to admit that the victory was comprehensive. The Sooners, behind 183 yards from Peterson, rushed for 185 on the day to complement a passing game that yielded another 195.

QB Paul Thompson was efficient, completing 16-of-27 for two touchdowns and no interceptions.

Oklahoma's defense was strong too. FS Darien Williams spearheaded with nine tackles, two sacks and one interception, which he returned 35 yards.

Iowa State mustered just 238 total yards, while converting only 1-of-12 third-down tries.
