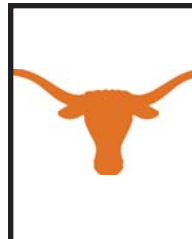

PLAYER TO WATCH

Senior RB Allen Patrick is one of three Oklahoma rushers with more than 25 attempts, but he has made the most of his 52 tries. The South Carolinian, who sat out the first game with an ankle injury, has 401 net yards for 7.7 yards per carry. Patrick has five touchdowns, including bursts from 69, 34 and 29 yards. After catching no passes last season, he has three receptions for 32 yards in 2007. Patrick came to OU as a defensive back. He has eight career starts at running back with six 100-yard efforts.



THE GAME

Oklahoma and Texas both carry national rankings heading into the 101st Red River Rivalry, but for the first time since 1999 both teams enter the game after a loss. OU dropped a last-second decision at Colorado, 27-24, while Texas lost to Kansas State in Austin by a 41-21 count.

THE SERIES

Texas leads it by a 57-39-5 count and has won the last two. Prior to that, Oklahoma reeled off five straight win in the series. This series moved to Dallas on a permanent basis in 1929. In that time, the Longhorns have a 45-34-4 advantage.

THE COACHES

Oklahoma: Bob Stoops (Iowa '83) is 90-20 in his ninth season with the Sooners. He is 4-4 in bowls, 3-3 in January Bowls, 2-3 in BCS games, 56-12 vs. the Big 12, 31-8 vs. the Big 12 South, 25-4 vs. the Big 12 North, 4-1 in the Big 12 title game, 33-8 vs. non-conference opponents, 50-2 at home, 26-109 on the road, 13-8 on neutral fields and 25-10 vs. ranked foes. He is 5-3 vs. Texas. **Texas:** Mack Brown (Florida State '74) is 97-23 in his 10th year at UT, 193-97-1 in 24 years overall.

THE PROGRAM

■ Oklahoma's all-time record stands at 772-293-53. ■ The Sooners own seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000). ■ OU has 40 bowl appearances (No. 7 nationally) with 24 victories (No. 3 nationally). ■ Oklahoma has won 40 conference titles. ■ Since WWII, Oklahoma is the most successful college football program with 528 victories. ■ Some 142 All-Americans and four Heisman Trophy winners have come from the Oklahoma program.

WEEKLY MEDIA LUNCHEON

Each Tuesday during the season OU hosts a media luncheon inside the Kerr McGee Stadium Club (east side) at Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. The luncheon begins at 11:15 a.m., with comments from the head coach of OU's opponent that week (by speaker phone if the coach is available). Lunch is served at 11:30 a.m., and OU head coach Bob Stoops steps to the podium at 12:05 p.m. A limited number of Sooner players are on hand for interviews.

CREDENTIALS

Requests for credentials are accepted online. To receive the link to the web site, e-mail Kenny Mossman at kmossm@ou.edu. Requests must be submitted by a sports director/editor at least eight days prior to the contest. Media attending games will have passes scanned and must show government issued photo identification upon entering the stadium. If the name on the credential and the photo ID do not match, the credential will be voided.

The University of Oklahoma Athletics Media Relations office has opened a media-only website to assist in covering Sooner sports. PRACTICE

All practice sessions are closed to media and public unless otherwise posted. On days when post-practice interviews are conducted, media should gather outside the practice site 10-15 minutes before the workout is complete. Requests for interviews will be recorded at that time and members of the athletics media relations staff will escort media into the practice facility at the appropriate time.

INTERVIEWS

- **Head Coach** Bob Stoops will do general interviews following practice on Monday. All other requests must be submitted to Kenny Mossman.
- **Assistant Coaches:** The coaches are available after the Monday-Wednesday practices (coordinators who appear at the Tuesday luncheon are not available that day).
- **Players:** All interviews with players will take place at the media luncheon or after practice on Monday and Tuesday. Media should request players at least 24 hours in advance. Those who attend the media luncheon are not available after Tuesday's practice.
- **Post-Game:** The OU locker room is closed at all times. Head coach Bob Stoops and several Sooner players will be brought to designated areas. After home games, the interview area is the Switzer Center's Red Room, located under the south end zone grandstand.

The media relations office extends a special thank-you to Mike Brooks. Mike, an employee of the United States Postal Service, resides in Blanchard, Okla., and possesses what is likely the most comprehensive statistical database on Sooner football. MORE ON THE SERIES

Played in the venerable Cotton Bowl, this game takes place during the State Fair of Texas. The two teams played six games in Dallas from 1912-1919, then settled there in 1929 ...

■ This marks the 79th consecutive year that the game as taken place in Dallas, which, according to Mapquest.com, is 189.9 miles from Norman, 196.7 miles from Austin.

■ The school that wins this game takes home the Golden Hat Trophy, which resides each year with the winner. The Governor's Cup also stays with the winner, but is in the possession of the state's highest elected official.

■ Overall: Texas leads, 57-39-5; At Dallas: Texas leads 45-35-5; At Norman: Texas leads, 3-1; At Austin: Texas leads, 7-2-1; At Oklahoma City: The series is tied 1-1. OU's Widest Margin of Victory: 65-13 in 2003; Texas' Widest Margin of Victory: 40-7 in 1941.

■ Oklahoma won five straight games in the series before dropping the last two contests ... this marks the 57th time that at least one of the teams has entered this game with a national ranking, the 33rd time that both were ranked ... the lower-rated team has prevailed 15 times.

TIES WITH THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT

■ Texas head coach Mack Brown was Oklahoma's offensive coordinator in 1984.

■ Oklahoma co-defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach Bobby Jack Wright was on the Texas staff as an assistant coach from 1986-97.

■ For the ninth straight year, an Austinite appears on OU roster. QB Hays McEachern is one of the 10 Austin natives that have played for Oklahoma. McEachern is the son of Randy McEachern, a UT quarterback from 1977-78. His mother, Jenna, was a Longhorn cheerleader.

CLOSE SHAVES

Oklahoma's loss at Colorado last Saturday marked the fourth time in the last five Sooner setbacks that the game was decided on the game's final play: 2007 Colorado (CU field goal), 2007 Fiesta Bowl (Boise State TD), 2006 Oregon (blocked Oklahoma field goal attempt) and 2005 Texas Tech (TTU touchdown). Those four losses were by a total of seven points (27-24 at Colorado, 43-42 to Boise State, 34-33 at Oregon and 23-21 at Texas Tech), and all were away from Norman.

SOONERS DIGGING THE LONG BALL

OU has 38 plays, offense and defense, of 20 yards or longer (not including special teams) ...

■ **Plays of 20-29 Yards** -- Offense (16): 12 passes, four rushes. Defense (2): Two INT returns.

■ **Plays of 30-39 Yards** -- Offense (4): One pass, three rushes. Defense (1): INT return.

■ **Plays of 40+ Yards** -- Offense (13): Nine passes, four rushes. Defense (2): One INT, one FR.

Notes: Four Sooners have a rush of 41 yards or longer ... OU has a 53-yard FG from Garrett Hartley ... OU's opponents have 12 plays (10 passes) of 20+ yards ... OU's longest play was a 92-yard TD run by DeMarco Murray vs. Utah State ... he also had an 81-yard KOR at Tulsa.

OKLAHOMA A BUNCH OF SELLOUTS

When the game at Tulsa sold out, it marked the 92nd to do so in Bob Stoops' 110 games as the OU head coach. During those nine years, 7,941,559 fans have been in attendance for Sooner games. Some 83.6% of Stoops' games sold out as compared with 83.7 (136-of-190) for Barry Switzer and 37.1% (66-of-178) for Bud Wilkinson. All 52 home games on Stoops' watch sold out with a total of 4,159,261 witnessing those contests. That current string of sellouts is the second-longest in school history trailing a string of 69 straight from the historic 1971 to 1984.

MISCELLANY

■ OU opponents are 19-of-82 on third down for 23.1%. OU is 26-of-57 for 45.6%.

■ OU opponents have 28 more pass attempts than the Sooners with three fewer completions.

■ OU ran between 69 and 73 total plays in its first four games, then had only 46 snaps at CU.

■ OU and its foes are separated by four penalties thus far -- 32 for OU, 36 for the opposition.

■ Rushing thus far -- OU 202 attempts for 1,127 yards; opponents 182 for 338.

■ Due in part to a quick-strike offense, OU is at a 10:32 deficit in time of possession.

■ Oklahoma has 10 turnovers as opposed to 12 by the opponents. OU scored 59 points (8 TD, 1 FG) off the turnovers, the opponents have 30 (3 TD, 3 FG).

OKLAHOMA'S MOST RECENT GAME

Oklahoma watched a 24-7 lead evaporate as Colorado rallied to win at Boulder, 27-24 ...

- CU's Kevin Eberhart made a 45-yard field goal on the game's final play.
- OU's D.J. Wolfe picked off two passes. It marked the eighth time in the last six years that a single Sooner tallied more than one pick in a game.
- Four Oklahoma defenders had career highs in tackles -- Curtis Lofton (18), Ryan Reynolds (15), Reggie Smith (13) and Nic Harris (10).
- Colorado's Hugh Charles rushed 24 times for 110 yards, while CU quarterback Cody Hawkins completed 22-of-36 passes for 220 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions.
- OU's Allen Patrick carried 18 times for 96 yards and had a 34-yard touchdown run.
- Sam Bradford had his first sub-.500 completion percentage of the season (8-of-19). He threw one touchdown pass and two interceptions, his first multiple interception game.
- TE Joe Jon Finley had the longest reception of his career, a 43-yarder.
- The loss snapped a five-game winning streak for Oklahoma over Colorado.
- After going three games with no touchdowns, Juaquin Iglesias, the team's leading receiver, caught one six-pointer at Colorado and now has three over the last two games.
- For the first time this season Malcolm Kelly did not have a reception.

THE SOONERS BRIEFLY

- Oklahoma was tabbed for a second-place finish in the Big 12's South Division in a preseason polling of league media. Defensive back Reggie Smith was named the league's preseason defensive player of the year.
- There are 34 players on this team with previous experience as a starter for OU. That's up from 10 from the same time last season.

SOONER STUFF

- Oklahoma is 50-2 at Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium under Bob Stoops and has won its last 14 in a row there and 34 of its last 35. During Stoops's tenure, which included home winning streaks of 19 and 17 games, OU has registered six shutouts on Owen Field.
- The last 60 Oklahoma games have been televised. A very small number of those were carried on a pay-per-view or tape-delayed basis, but the vast majority were either over the air or on cable through widely recognized networks.
- Oklahoma has played exclusive Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly I-A) opposition since Bob Stoops' opener in 1999 (a 49-0 win over I-AA Indiana State). The entire 2007 schedule is comprised of FBS competition.

STOOPS ERA YIELDING RECORD-SETTING ATTENDANCE NUMBERS

Oklahoma has drawn 4,159,261 for Bob Stoops' 52 home games (started in 1999) ...

- All 52 have been sold out and the Sooners have prevailed 50 times.
- Last year's average home attendance of 84,561 was the largest in school history. The top seven seasons for OU home attendance have come on Stoops' watch.
- The crowd of 85,357 for this year's Miami game is the largest in school history. The 84,472 for this year's North Texas game was the largest ever for an OU opener
- OU has exceeded its listed capacity of 82,112 in 26 consecutive games.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE

■ Under Stoops, Oklahoma has produced its career leader in passing and receiving, while turning out the No. 3- and No. 4-ranked rusher in school history and the school record holder for single-season rushing.

■ OU has scored at least one touchdown in every game dating back to Nov. 7, 1998.

■ Under Stoops, OU has rushed for 200 yards 35 times, including 29 over the last five seasons.

■ In the Stoops era, OU has 116 TD of 25+ yards and 238 scoring drives of less than 2:00.

■ OU's 2006 team missed perfect offensive balance by just 202 yards (2,682 passing, 2,480 rushing). The 2005 team missed it by just one yard and the 2003 squad was off by only 160.

BRADFORD HAS SPECIAL TIES TO OU AND THE STATE

Sam Bradford earned the starting job in August ...

■ Bradford is a certified Cherokee Indian. His great, great grandmother (father's side) was Susie Walkingstick. Oklahoma is home to more Native Americans (250,000+) than any other state.

■ Bradford's father, Kent, was an offensive lineman at OU. He lettered in 1977 and 1978.

■ Bradford completed his last 18 passes of the North Texas game and his first four against Miami. That string of 22 straight broke Jason White's school record of 18 and challenged the NCAA record of 24 set by Tennessee's Tee Martin. Bradford came back to hit his last 10 against Miami and his first 11 versus Utah State for a string of 21 in a row.

NATIONAL NUMBERS

Oklahoma's offense has vaulted itself to the upper echelon of the NCAA statistical categories ...

■ No. 3 in scoring with 54.0 per game.

■ No. 1 in passing efficiency at 191.9.

■ No. 10 in total offense with 495.8 yards per game.

■ No. 5 in sacks allowed at .60 per game.

■ No. 14 in rushing offense with 225.4 yards per game.

■ No. 26 in passing offense with 270.4 yards per game.

■ Sam Bradford is No. 1 in passing eff. (194.4), DeMarco Murray is No. 9 in scoring (10.8)

and Curtis Lofton is No. 11 in tackles (11.6) and Juaquin Iglesias is No. 22 in all-purpose yards (158.6) and No. 25 in receiving yards (91.8).

KEEN ON JUAQUIN IGLESIAS

■ He entered the season with 60 career receptions for 804 yards and four touchdowns.

Through four games of 2007, he has 29 grabs for 459 yards and three scores. His longest reception coming into this season was 37 yards. He already has four for longer distances in '07.

■ Career high eight receptions vs Utah State and Tulsa. His 142 yards and two TD at Tulsa were both career bests too.

■ He's averaging 26.4 yards per kickoff return with a long of 44.

■ Iglesias' 793 all-purpose yards are 350 more than the next highest figure on the team.

TIGHT END TANDEM

OU features tight ends Joe Jon Finley (6-6, 261) and Jermaine Gresham (6-5, 263). Last season, the two combined to average 1.9 receptions/game. Thus far in '07, they're averaging 4.2. In 2006, the tight ends had four touchdown grabs. In 2007 they already have four.

O-LINE OF HISTORICAL PROPORTIONS

With an average height of nearly 6-5 (76.6 inches) and 322.4 pounds this is one of the biggest offensive lines in OU history. During the Stoops era (since 1999) this is the heaviest line. By height, it is the third-tallest line of the Stoops era. The 2002 and 2003 lines both measured 77.2 inches. By weight it is the second-heaviest in the country to Texas Tech.

■ At 6-8, Phil Loadholt is tied as the tallest football player on record at Oklahoma, and the tallest starter. The only previous player at 6-8 was Chris Watkins, recruited in 1988 from Amarillo (Texas) HS. Watkins lettered in 1991, but never started. There have been 17 OU players at 6-7 (for research, only measurements from a player's final season at Oklahoma were used).

■ Oklahoma has surrendered just three sacks, which is tied for second nationally, but is No. 2 among teams with five games played.

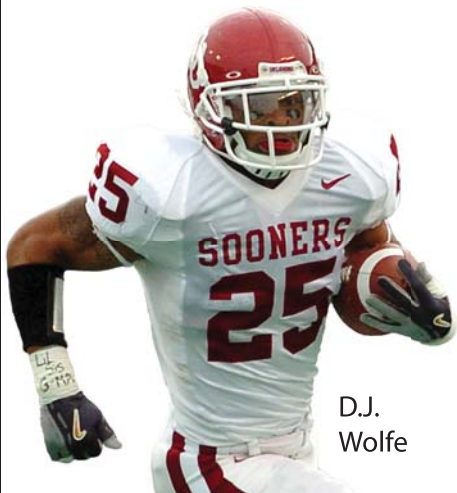

ABOUT THE SOONER DEFENSE

- OU has forced at least one turnover in 99 of Bob Stoops' 110 games and has at least one interception in 73 of the last 96. There have been multiple picks in 29 of their last 66 outings.
- Opponents completed 50% or more of their passes in less than half of their games (54-of-110) against Stoops' teams.
- Oklahoma has nine shutouts under its current head coach. Opponents failed to score more than seven points 28 times and scored less than 14 in 54 games.
- OU has given up just 74 points through its first five games, the second-lowest total for that span during the Stoops era. The 2004 squad gave up just 57 tallies over its first five.
- Last season, only two of the 14 opponents reached their scoring average in games against Oklahoma and just two were able to exceed their average total yardage figure.

DEFENSE SURGING IN NCAA RANKINGS

- No. 3 in tackles for loss at 10.4 per game.
- No. 7 in rushing defense at 67.6 yards per game.
- No. 6 in total defense at 263.6 yards per game.
- No. 5 in sacks at 3.8 per game.

- Curtis Lofton ranks No. 11 in tackles (11.6), Ryan Reynolds No. 20 in tackles for loss (1.5) and Auston English No. 30 in sacks (0.80).

ENGLISH LESSON

Sophomore defensive end Auston English redshirted after his true freshman season, but is back from that year away from competition in a big way. He leads the Sooners in sacks with four and in tackles for loss with seven.

PAPER OR PLASTIC?

Oklahoma is averaging 3.8 sacks per game. That average over a 12-game schedule would amount to 47 sacks. The school record of 48 was set in 1986.

TOUCHY, FEELY DEFENSE

OU defenders have touched the ball 28 times with 16 PBUs, nine interceptions and three fumble recoveries. OU is averaging 19.8 yards on INT/fumble returns with three touchdowns.

STOOPS ERA STAPLE: RUN DEFENSE

Eighteen times, Bob Stoops-coached Oklahoma teams have held opponents under 40 rushing yards in a game. Four times the total has resulted in negative yards. Last season, thanks in part to five sacks, the Sooners limited Baylor to -48 yards on the ground. That was the best single-game rushing defense performance by any team in the nation in 2006 and the best by an Oklahoma team during the Stoops Era.

■ OU has ranked no worse than 23rd in national rushing defense over the last seven seasons. Three times in that span it ranked among the top 10 and six times it was among the top 20.



LOFTY ACHIEVEMENT

LB Curtis Lofton has registered double-digit tackles in three straight games with 12 vs. Utah State, 14 at Tulsa and a career-high 16 at Colorado. It marks the first time any Sooner has had 10 or more stops in three straight games since Lance Mitchell did it in 2002 against South Florida (11), Missouri (15) and Texas (16). That's a three-game total of 42, the same number Lofton, a junior, had in his last three outings.

ABOUT THE SOONER SPECIAL TEAMS

Oklahoma's special teams under Bob Stoops ...

- There have been 25 special teams TD, including 18 in the last 59 regular season games. Those 18 came via five different kinds of plays -- 10 punt returns, two faked FGs, two blocked punts, three kickoff returns and a faked punt. Special teams also own one safety in that span.
- In total, OU has returned six kickoffs and 14 punts for TDs on Stoops' watch (since 1999).
- The Sooners have blocked 20 kicks.

HARTLEY SHOWING OFF BIG LEG

Garrett Hartley, who made a 53-yard field goal vs. Utah State, is averaging 67.9 yards per kick-off (ball lands at the two yard line) with nine touchbacks in 45 attempts. To put that in perspective, opposing kickers average 61.0 yards per kickoff with one touchback.

- Opposing teams are averaging just 20.0 yards per return after Hartley's kickoffs. OU is averaging 28.5 yards per kickoff return.
- Hartley tied a school record when he made 11 point after touchdown kicks in the opener.
- Hit a 28-yard field goal at Colorado had has now made 15 of his last 16.

MANY HAPPY RETURNS

GOT-R-COVERED

- Over the last three seasons, OU's average rank in NCAA KO return coverage was No. 10. The 2005 team was No. 15 and the 2004 team was No. 4. Last season, the Sooners ranked No. 13. Prior to Bob Stoops' arrival, opposing teams averaged at least 22 yards/KO return in five straight seasons. Since he arrived, the best opposing average was 18.9 in 2001.
- OU has ranked among the top 10 in punt return defense in five of the last seven seasons. Last season, the team ranked No. 9 at 4.2 yards per punt return. The longest punt return by an opposing player was 14 yards. The 2006 campaign marked the third in a row in which the Sooners held their opponents to less than 5.0 yards per punt return.

TWO-HEADED PUNTER

Oklahoma used two punters last season and both return ...

- Michael Cohen handled long kicks and averaged 41.0 yards. He had a long of 75 yards and another of 72. Nine of his kicks traveled at least 50 yards and he spread those over six games.
- Mike Knall kicked on a short field and averaged 39.7 yards per boot with nine of his 11 tries downed inside the 20. He had only one touchback.

SOONERS HAVE HART-LEY

K Garrett Hartley was one of three finalists for the Lou Groza Award and is on the watch list for that award again this year ...

- Hartley was 19-of-20 on field goals and 49-of-50 on PATs in 2006. His lone field goal miss was a blocked kick at Oregon. He kicked off 78 times with 31 touchbacks.
- His field goal made percentage of .950 was tops in the nation among kickers with at least 10 makes. He made his last 11 attempts of the season.
- Hartley ranked No. 20 nationally in field goals made per game with 1.36 and was No. 21 in scoring with 7.57 points per game.
- Hartley made a career-high four field goals at Oregon.
- Hartley has four career makes of 50 yards or longer. His long last season was 46 yards, which he accomplished twice.

History is one tough customer at Oklahoma. The tradition, so rich and so long-standing, is as daunting as it is impressive. To be among the best at Oklahoma is to be among the best in college football.

Such dramatics are lost on Bob Stoops. The Sooner head coach befriended the would-be albatross of OU's successful past from his first day on campus and remains steadfastly focused on tomorrow and the championship it holds.

It falls then to the observers and experts of the game to define Stoops' impact. Rarely have the pundits had it so easy.

Under Stoops, Oklahoma has won 90 games (90-20), been ranked for 123 weeks in the AP Poll (69 consecutive at one point) and 120 in the USA Today Coaches Poll, played in seven bowl games, four of the BCS variety, and captured three Big 12 crowns. His 2000 team won the national championship. On a playing field leveled by scholarship limits and parity, this era stares down the Oklahoma standard and does not blink.

The achievement dulls the memory of what Stoops inherited. When he arrived in Norman, the proud Sooner program was five years removed from a winning record, four from bowl play. Those atypical days of angst are so forgotten now that they might as well be mentioned with the land rush and dust bowl.

Stoops has been characterized as a grounded family man, brilliant big-game coach, relentless recruiter, disciplined leader and a person with uncommon perspective. His success emanates from a disciplined style true to his roots in the Steel Valley of Ohio, but he is far from inflexible. The principles to which he holds are the tried and true axioms of the sport ... mixed with cutting edge strategy and an appreciation for the calculated risk.

During his time, OU has produced record-setting passers and receivers, three 1,000-yard rushers, suffocating defense and special teams units that rank among the most dynamic in the land. Every facet has been impacted.

His players have snagged 16 national awards, including the 2003 Heisman Trophy won by Jason White. There have been 58 academic honorees, 53 All-Big 12 players, 22 All-Americans and 32 NFL draft choices.

Stoops has won a total of 10 national coach of the year awards and has been consensus Big 12 Coach of the year in three times.

The son of a coach, Stoops was a four-year starter at Iowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry. He worked through the ranks until he became co-defensive coordinator at

Kansas State (1991-95) during Bill Snyder's rein.

With the Wildcats, he played a key role in an impressive turnaround. During his final four seasons there, K-State was 35-12 with three bowl appearances. Eventually, he left for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. In 1996, he was part of a national championship team. It was with the Gators that the spotlight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession.

Stoops, who was born Sept. 9, 1960, in Youngstown, Ohio, graduated from Iowa in 1983 with a degree in marketing. He and his wife, Carol, have three children: daughter, Mackenzie, and twin sons, Drake and Isaac.
