PLAYER TO WATCH

OU strong safety D.J. Wolfe, who played running back as a freshman, now has five takeaways this season including four in the last five games. The senior from Lawton, Okla., leads the Sooners with four interceptions. He added his first fumble recovery last Saturday when the Sooners rolled past Texas A&M, 42-14. Wolfe entered this season with three interceptions and one fumble recovery for his career.



THE GAME

Oklahoma plays back-to-back home games for the first time since September when the Sooners host Baylor. The visiting Bears hope to pick up their first Big 12 win of the season and end a six-game skid.

THE SERIES

Oklahoma leads it 16-0 with a 9-0 advantage in Norman. Last season, the Sooners posted a 36-10 victory at Waco, Texas. Baylor's last visit to Owen Field (2005) resulted in a 37-30 OT win for OU.

THE COACHES

Oklahoma: Bob Stoops (Iowa '83) is 94-20 in his ninth season with the Sooners. He is 4-4 in bowls, 3-3 in January Bowls, 2-3 in BCS games, 60-12 vs. the Big 12, 33-8 vs. the Big 12 South, 27-4 vs. the Big 12 North, 4-1 in the Big 12 title game, 33-8 vs. non-conference opponents, 52-2 at home, 27-10 on the road, 14-8 on neutral fields and 27-10 vs. ranked foes. He is 8-0 vs. Baylor.
Baylor: Guy Morriss (TCU '73) is 18-38 in his fifth year at Baylor, 27-52 in his seventh season overall. He is 0-4 vs. Oklahoma.

THE PROGRAM

■ Oklahoma's all-time record stands at 776-293-53. ■ The Sooners own seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000). ■ OU has 40 bowl appearances (No. 7 nationally) with 24 victories (No. 3 nationally). ■ Oklahoma has won 40 conference titles. ■ Since WWII, Oklahoma is the most successful college football program with 532 victories. ■ Some 142 All-Americans and four Heisman Trophy winners have come from the Oklahoma program.

WEEKLY MEDIA LUNCHEON

Each Tuesday during the season OU hosts a media luncheon inside the Kerr McGee Stadium Club (east side) at Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. The luncheon begins at 11:15 a.m., with comments from the head coach of OU's opponent that week (by speaker phone if the coach is available). Lunch is served at 11:30 a.m., and OU head coach Bob Stoops steps to the podium at 12:05 p.m. A limited number of Sooner players are on hand for interviews.

CREDENTIALS

Requests for credentials are accepted online. To receive the link to the web site, e-mail Kenny Mossman at kmossm@ou.edu. Requests must be submitted by a sports director/editor at least eight days prior to the contest. Media attending games will have passes scanned and must show government issued photo identification upon entering the stadium. If the name on the credential and the photo ID do not match, the credential will be voided.

FOR MEDIA ONLY

The University of Oklahoma Athletics Media Relations office has a media-only website to assist in covering Sooner sports. The site is valuable for reporters, but also to desk personnel needing stock photographs or similar support. To access the site, contact Kenny Mossman.

PRACTICE

All practice sessions are closed to media and public unless otherwise posted. On days when post-practice interviews are conducted, media should gather outside the practice site 10-15 minutes before the workout is complete. Requests for interviews will be recorded and members of the athletics media relations staff will escort media into the facility at the appropriate time.

INTERVIEWS

All interview requests should be submitted to the OU Athletic Media Relations Office ...

- **Head Coach** Bob Stoops will do general interviews following practice on Monday. All other requests must be submitted to Kenny Mossman.
- **Assistant Coaches:** The coaches are available after the Monday-Wednesday practices (coordinators who appear at the Tuesday luncheon are not available that day).
- **Players:** All interviews with players will take place at the media luncheon or after practice on Monday and Tuesday. Media should request players at least 24 hours in advance. Those who attend the media luncheon are not available after Tuesday's practice.
- **Post-Game:** The OU locker room is closed at all times. Head coach Bob Stoops and several Sooner players will be brought to designated areas. After home games, the interview area is the Switzer Center's Red Room, located under the south end zone grandstand.

LAST YEAR'S GAME

Oklahoma committed a season-high five turnovers, yet still pulled out a 36-10 win at Baylor ...

- The Sooner defense stymied the Bears, holding them to -48 yards on the ground, mostly due to five sacks that forced 61 yards in losses.
- Chris Brown, making his first career start, logged the first 100-yard game of his career with 24 attempts for 169 yards. OU was playing without running backs Adrian Peterson and Allen Patrick, both of whom were out with injuries. Despite that, the Sooners rushed 41 times for 236 yards.
- The defense and special teams got into the scoring act. DB Reggie Smith had a 42-yard interception return for a TD, DE Alonzo Dotson got a sack for a safety and Juaquin Iglesias added an 88-yard kickoff return for six.
- BU's lone touchdown came on a 56-yard fumble return by Braelon Davis.

OKLAHOMA'S MOST RECENT GAME

Oklahoma dispatched Texas A&M, 42-14, last Saturday at Norman ...

- QB Sam Bradford tied a school record with five touchdown passes, four of which went to TE Jermaine Gresham, who tied Trent Smith's OU mark for TD receptions in a game.
- Bradford had five touchdown passes and no interceptions for the second time this season. He also accomplished the feat against Miami.
- Allen Patrick and DeMarco Murray both had 15 rushes for 70 yards. For the first time this season, a back, Murray, took direct snaps. Murray scored on a two-yard hand-off while a third running back, Chris Brown, got a touchdown on a 14-yard reception.
- The Sooners won comfortably. For the second straight home game, a visiting team punched in a meaningless touchdown with less than one minute remaining.
- SS D.J. Wolfe equaled his career high with 12 tackles and also had one fumble recovery.
- Texas A&M's offense went three and out four times and had two other five-play, non-scoring drives. Three Aggie possessions netted negative yardage.
- A crowd of 85,044, the third-largest in school history, witnessed the game.

SOONERS DIGGING THE LONG BALL

OU has 52 plays, offense and defense, of 20 yards or longer (not including special teams) ...

- **Plays of 20-29 Yards** -- 35 plays and seven touchdowns.
- **Plays of 30-39 Yards** -- 20 plays and six touchdowns
- **Plays of 40+ Yards** -- 22 plays and 11 touchdowns.
- **OU's Big-Play (20+ yards) Breakdown** -- 33 passing (13 TD), 12 rushing (7 TD), six interceptions (two TD), one fumble return (one TD).

Notes: Four Sooners have a rush of 41 yards or longer ... OU has a 53-yard FG from Garrett Hartley ... OU's opponents have 19 plays (15 passes) of 20+ yards ... OU's longest play was a 92-yard touchdown run by DeMarco Murray vs. Utah State ... he also had an 81-yard kickoff return at Tulsa ... Juaquin Iglesias has the most plays of 20 or more yards with 23 with 13 of those on kickoff returns ... from scrimmage, Malcolm Kelly leads with 12, seven of which were TD.

MISCELLANY

- Oklahoma has scored in 30 of 34 quarters this season.
- Oklahoma has had a 100-yard receiver in five games this season.
- DeMarco Murray and Allen Patrick both have 100-yard rushing games this season. It marks the fifth consecutive season that more than one tailback achieved the feat in the same year. Those two average 6.1 and 5.7 yards per carry, respectively.
- OU has four, one-play scoring drives. Three of those plays were rushes and the shortest, a rush, was 17 yards.
- OU has two, 90-yard scoring drives: 96 against Utah State and 94 against Texas.
- OU opponents are 41-fo-138 on third down for 30.0%. OU is 62-of-119 for 52.0%.
- Oklahoma opponents are 6-of-29 on third down in the fourth quarter.
- OU ran between 67 and 73 plays in its eight wins, 46 in its loss. The Sooners ran 73 plays in five games this season, 72 in another.
- Rushing -- OU 364 attempts for 1,734 yards (4.8/carry); opponents 309 for 679 (2.2/carry).

THE SOONERS BRIEFLY

- Oklahoma was tabbed for a second-place finish in the Big 12's South Division in a preseason polling of league media. Defensive back Reggie Smith was named the league's preseason defensive player of the year.
- There are 34 players on this team with previous experience as a starter for OU. That's up from 10 over the number that returned last season.

HOME FIELD HONCHOS

- Oklahoma is 52-2 at home under Bob Stoops and has won its last 16 in a row there and 36 of its last 37. During Stoops's tenure, which included home winning streaks of 19 and 17 games, OU has registered six shutouts on Owen Field.
- The Sooners are 28-1 against the Big 12 at home under Stoops and have won their last 19 conference games on Owen Field.

GREAT SLATE

- Oklahoma has played exclusive Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly I-A) opposition since Bob Stoops' opener in 1999 (a 49-0 win over I-AA Indiana State) or for 113 consecutive games.
- Under Stoops, Oklahoma has played regular season games against Notre Dame, UCLA (twice), Alabama (twice), Oregon (twice), Miami, Louisville, North Carolina, Air Force and Washington. Future slates feature Miami, Washington, Tennessee, Notre Dame, LSU and Florida State.

CLOSE SHAVES

Oklahoma's loss at Colorado marked the fourth time in the last five Sooner setbacks that the game was decided on the game's final play: 2007 Colorado (CU field goal), 2007 Fiesta Bowl (Boise State TD), 2006 Oregon (blocked Oklahoma field goal attempt) and 2005 Texas Tech (TTU touchdown). Those four losses were by a total of seven points (27-24 at Colorado, 43-42 to Boise State, 34-33 at Oregon and 23-21 at Texas Tech), and all were away from Norman.

STOOPS ERA YIELDING RECORD-SETTING ATTENDANCE NUMBERS

- Oklahoma has drawn 4,329,346 for Bob Stoops' 54 home games (started in 1999) ...
- All 54 have been sold out and the Sooners prevailed 52 times. The current string of sellouts is second-longest in school history trailing a string of 69 straight from 1971 to 1984.
 - Last year's average home attendance of 84,561 was the largest in school history. The top seven seasons for OU home attendance have come on Stoops' watch.
 - The crowd of 85,357 for this year's Miami game is the largest in school history. The 84,472 for this year's North Texas game was the largest ever for an OU opener
 - OU has exceeded its listed capacity of 82,112 in 28 consecutive games.
 - When the game against Texas A&M sold out, it marked the 95th (home, away and neutral) to do so in Bob Stoops' 114 games as the OU head coach.
 - During those nine years, 8,241,515 fans have been in attendance for Sooner games.
 - Some 83.3% of Stoops' games sold out as compared with 83.7 (136-of-190) for Barry Switzer and 37.1% (66-of-178) for Bud Wilkinson.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE

- Under Stoops, Oklahoma has produced its career leader in passing and receiving, while turning out the No. 3- and No. 4-ranked rusher in school history and the school record holder for single-season rushing, passing and receiving yards.
- OU has scored at least one touchdown in every game dating back to Nov. 7, 1998.
- Under Stoops, OU has rushed for 200 yards 35 times, including 29 over the last five seasons.
- In the Stoops era, OU has 120 TD of 25+ yards and 243 scoring drives of less than 2:00.
- OU's 2006 team missed perfect offensive balance by just 202 yards (2,682 passing, 2,480 rushing). The 2005 team missed it by just one yard and the 2003 squad was off by only 160.

BRADFORD HAS SPECIAL TIES TO OU AND THE STATE

Sam Bradford earned the starting quarterback job in August ...

- Bradford is a certified Cherokee Indian. His great, great grandmother (father's side) was named Susie Walkingstick.
- Bradford's father, Kent, was an offensive lineman at OU. He lettered in 1977 and 1978.
- He completed his last 18 passes vs. North Texas and his first four vs. Miami. That string of 22 broke Jason White's OU record of 18 and challenged the NCAA mark of 24 set by Tennessee's Tee Martin. Bradford then hit his last 10 vs. Miami and first 11 vs. Utah State for a string of 21.
- Multiple TD passes in seven games, school record (tied) five TD passes vs. Miami and Texas A&M, hit at least 65% in eight games, no INT in five games, at least one 30-yard pass in every game.

NATIONAL NUMBERS

Oklahoma's top 25 rankings in the NCAA offensive statistics ...

- No. 2 in passing efficiency at 175.1.
- No. 3 in scoring with 44.2 per game.
- No. 3 in sacks allowed at 0.89 per game.
- No. 19 in total offense with 451.4 yards per game.
- Sam Bradford is No. 2 in passing efficiency (175.15).

LINE OF DEMARCATION

Adrian Peterson was a true frosh in '04 (age 19; DeMarco Murray a redshirt in '07 (age 19) ...

- Peterson rushed for 15 touchdowns in 2004, one every 22.6 attempts. Murray has 10, one every 9.5 attempts. All of Peterson's TDs came via the rush. Murray has a 11th on a KO return.
- Peterson's long frosh rush was 80 yards vs. Oklahoma St. Murray went 92 yards vs Utah St.
- Peterson had five receptions as a freshman; Murray has 11.

JUA-KEEN IGLESIAS

- The junior entered the season with 60 career receptions for 804 yards and four touchdowns. In 2007, he has 45 grabs for 676 yards and four scores. His longest reception coming into this season was 37 yards. He already has five for longer distances in '07.
- Career bests in catches (8 vs. Tulsa, Utah St.), yards (142 vs. Tulsa) and TD (2 vs. Tulsa).
- He's averaging 28.2 yards per kickoff return (No. 22 nationally) with a long of 44.
- Iglesias' 1,186 all-purpose yards are 333 more than the next highest figure on the team.

TIGHT END TANDEM

Last season, Joe Jon Finley and Jermaine Gresham combined to average 1.9 receptions/game and scored four touchdowns. In '07, they're averaging 4.3 receptions and have 11 TD.

O-LINE OF HISTORICAL PROPORTIONS

With an average height of 6-5 (76.6 inches) and 322.4 pounds this is one of the biggest offensive lines in OU history. In the Stoops era this is the heaviest line and the third-tallest. The 2002 and 2003 lines measured 77.2 inches.

- At 6-8, Phil Loadholt is tied as the tallest football player ever at OU, and the tallest starter.

KEEPING THE QB CLEAN

OU allows 0.89 sacks per game. The school record for fewest sacks allowed in a season was set last season at 1.1 (sacks record tracked only on teams with at least 100 passing attempts).

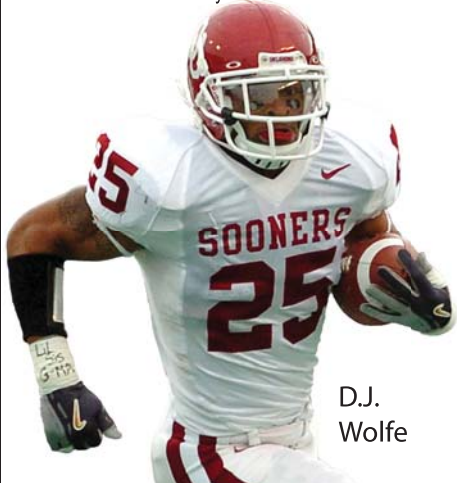

ABOUT THE SOONER DEFENSE

■ OU has forced at least one turnover in 103 of Bob Stoops' 114 games and has at least one interception in 76 of the last 100. There have multiple picks in 30 of their last 70 outings.
■ Oklahoma has nine shutouts under its current head coach. Opponents failed to score more than seven points 29 times and scored less than 14 in 55 games.

DEFENSE SURGING IN NCAA RANKINGS

Oklahoma's top 25 rankings in the NCAA defensive stats ...

- No. 5 in rushing defense at 75.4 yards per game.
- No. 5 in tackles for loss at 8.6 per game.
- No. 11 in sacks at 3.2 per game.

- Curtis Lofton ranks No. 8 in tackles (11.2) and Auston English No. 6 in sacks (1.1) and No. 16 in TFL (1.4).

ENGLISH LESSON

Sophomore DE Auston English redshirted after his true freshman season, but is back from that year away from competition in a big way. He leads the Sooners in sacks with 8.5 and in tackles for loss with 12.

■ With 8.5 sacks, English is tied with Torrance Marshall (1999) for the 14th-best single season total in school history. The OU record of 14 is held by Martin Chase (1997) and Cedric Jones (1994). The best total in the Stoops era was 10 by Calvin Thibodeaux (2005) and Dan Cody (2004, 2003).

PAPER OR PLASTIC?

Oklahoma is averaging 3.4 sacks per game. That average over a 12-game schedule would amount to 41 sacks. The school record of 48 was set in 1986. The sack high for this season is six vs. North Texas and Tulsa.

WHAT HAVE YOU DONE FOR ME LATELY?

- With 239 INT return yards, OU has exceeded its total for each of the last three years.
- With 28 sacks through eight games, OU is three ahead of its 14-game total in 2006.

TOUCHY, FEELY DEFENSE

OU defenders have touched the ball 49 times (5.4 times per game) with 28 PBUs, 14 interceptions and seven fumble recoveries. To put that in perspective, opposing teams have just 30 touches in 14 break-ups, 10 fumble recoveries and six interceptions. OU is averaging 14.9 yards on INT/fumble returns with four touchdowns, which is one shy of the school record set in 1956 and 2001.

STOOPS ERA STAPLE: RUN DEFENSE

This season, six opponents rushed for 66 or fewer yards. Eighteen times, Bob Stoops-coached Oklahoma teams have held opponents under 40 rushing yards in a game. Four times the total has resulted in negative yards.

- Sooner opponents have just 30 rushing first downs.



LOFTY ACHIEVEMENT

LB Curtis Lofton ranks No. 5 nationally with 11.6 tackles per game. His 93 stops include six double-digit games and a career-high 18 vs. Missouri. He also has a pair of TD with a 45-yard interception return (Utah State) and a 12-yard fumble return (Missouri).

- In total, OU has returned six kickoffs and 14 punts for TDs on Stoops' watch (since 1999).
- The Sooners have blocked 20 kicks.

MORE ON THE RETURNS

- DeMarco Murray ran 81 yards for a touchdown against Tulsa on the second kickoff return of his college career. His first came earlier in the same game.

TWO-HEADED PUNTER

Oklahoma used two punters last season and both return ...

- Michael Cohen handles the long punts and is averaging 42.1 yards per boot. Five of his boots covered 50 or more yards with a long of 59 yards at Colorado. He had three 50-yard punts against Texas and now has a 50-yarder in three of the last five games.
- Mike Knall kicks when it is a short field. He's averaging 35.2 yards with two of fsix downed inside the 20 yardline.

HARTLEY SHOWING OFF BIG LEG

Garrett Hartley, who made a 53-yard field goal vs. Utah State, is averaging 66.5 yards per kick-off (ball lands at the three yard line) with 17 touchbacks in 69 attempts. To put that in perspective, opposing kickers average 59.9 yards per kickoff with two touchbacks in 32 tries.

- Opposing teams are averaging just 21.3 yards per return after Hartley's kickoffs. OU is averaging 22.0 yards per kickoff return.
- Hartley tied a school record when he made 11 point after touchdown kicks in the opener.
- He has made 16 of his last 18 field goal attempts, including a 43-yarder at Iowa State.

SOONERS HAVE HART-LEY

K Garrett Hartley was one of three finalists for the Lou Groza Award and is on the watch list for that award again this year ...

- Hartley ranks No. 5 in career kick scoring at OU (266), No. 6 in career field goals (40) and No. 7 in career PAT (146).
- Hartley made 19-of-20 FG and 49-of-50 on PAT in 2006. His lone field goal miss was a block at Oregon (made a career-high four FG in that game). He kicked off 78 times with 31 touchbacks.
- His FG made percentage of .950 was tops in the nation among kickers with at least 10 makes. He made his last 11 attempts of the season.
- Hartley ranked No. 20 nationally in field goals made per game with 1.36 and was No. 21 in scoring with 7.57 points per game.
- Hartley has four career makes of 50 yards or longer, including a 53-yarder against Utah State this season. He made a long of 46 yards twice last season.

History is one tough customer at Oklahoma. The tradition, so rich and so long-standing, is as daunting as it is impressive. To be among the best at Oklahoma is to be among the best in college football.

Such dramatics are lost on Bob Stoops. The Sooner head coach befriended the would-be albatross of OU's successful past from his first day on campus and remains steadfastly focused on tomorrow and the championship it holds.

It falls then to the observers and experts of the game to define Stoops' impact. Rarely have the pundits had it so easy.

Under Stoops, Oklahoma has won 94 games (94-20), been ranked for 127 weeks in the AP Poll (69 consecutive at one point) and 124 in the USA Today Coaches Poll, played in seven bowl games, four of the BCS variety, and captured three Big 12 crowns. His 2000 team won the national championship. On a playing field leveled by scholarship limits and parity, this era stares down the Oklahoma standard and does not blink.

The achievement dulls the memory of what Stoops inherited. When he arrived in Norman, the proud Sooner program was five years removed from a winning record, four from bowl play. Those atypical days of angst are so forgotten now that they might as well be mentioned with the land rush and dust bowl.

Stoops has been characterized as a grounded family man, brilliant big-game coach, relentless recruiter, disciplined leader and a person with uncommon perspective. His success emanates from a disciplined style true to his roots in the Steel Valley of Ohio, but he is far from inflexible. The principles to which he holds are the tried and true axioms of the sport ... mixed with cutting edge strategy and an appreciation for the calculated risk.

During his time, OU has produced record-setting passers and receivers, three 1,000-yard rushers, suffocating defense and special teams units that rank among the most dynamic in the land. Every facet has been impacted.

His players have snagged 16 national awards, including the 2003 Heisman Trophy won by Jason White. There have been 58 academic honorees, 53

All-Big 12 players, 22 All-Americans and 32 NFL draft choices.

Stoops has won a total of 10 national coach of the year awards and has been consensus Big 12 Coach of the year in three times.

The son of a coach, Stoops was a four-year starter at Iowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry. He worked through the ranks until he became co-defensive coordinator at

Kansas State (1991-95) during Bill Snyder's rein.

With the Wildcats, he played a key role in an impressive turnaround. During his final four seasons there, K-State was 35-12 with three bowl appearances. Eventually, he left for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. In 1996, he was part of a national championship team. It was with the Gators that the spotlight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession.

Stoops, who was born Sept. 9, 1960, in Youngstown, Ohio, graduated from Iowa in 1983 with a degree in marketing. He and his wife, Carol, have three children: daughter, Mackenzie, and twin sons, Drake and Isaac.

NORMAN, Okla. -- A game that was supposed to be an early-season classic turned into a lop-sided Oklahoma triumph when the Sooners easily thwarted Miami, 51-13. A record crowd of 85,357 witnessed the game.

OU quarterback Sam Bradford completed 19-of-25 passes for 205 yards and five touchdowns with no interceptions. Three TD strikes went to Malcolm Kelly.

OU extended an early lead to 21-3 when Reggie Smith returned a fumble 61 yards for a touchdown. Then Miami mustered a bit of a rally to close the margin to 21-13. That's when the Sooners rattle off 30 unanswered points to end any doubt.

Oklahoma's defense was dominant, limiting the Hurricanes to just 52 rushing yards on 35 attempts, and styming the UM passing game to the tune of 11-of-24 for just 87 yards.

Oklahoma trailed 7-0 at intermission, but got untracked in the second half thanks to a pair of Chris Brown touchdowns. He scored from eight and four yards out before Garrett Hartley drilled a 43-yard field goal into the wind with just 1:34 remaining.

D.J. Wolfe and Curtis Lofton both logged 11 tackles for OU. The two combined on a key fourth-quarter play when Lofton tipped a pass that Wolfe intercepted. That sequence occurred with 6:54 remaining and the Sooners protecting a 14-7 advantage.
