**The Game**

- Oklahoma (No. 5 USA Today/Coaches, No. 5 Associated Press, No. 5 BCS) looks to stay undefeated away from home this year with its fifth trip of the season away from Norman. The Sooners have won their last eight away from home dating back to last season including their last five true road games. The game marks the first for OU in two weeks after a week off following its 41-25 win over Texas A&M on Nov. 5.
- Baylor (No. 25 Associated Press, No. 22 BCS) won its second straight Big 12 game of the season and its third overall last week with a 31-30 overtime win at Kansas.

**The Series**

- Oklahoma leads the series with Baylor, 20-0, including a 10-0 mark in Waco. The Sooners defeated the Bears in Waco in 2010, 53-24, as the win was the second of five straight to end the 2010 season.

**The Coaches**

- Oklahoma: Bob Stoops (Iowa '83) is 137-32 in his 13th season. He is 90-20 vs. the Big 12 including a 7-1 record in the Big 12 title game, 47-12 vs. non-conference opponents, 76-3 at home, 38-16 on the road and 23-13 on neutral fields. Stoops is 12-0 against Baylor.
- Art Briles (Texas Tech '79) is 21-25 in his fourth season with the Bears. He is 0-4 vs. Oklahoma, 0-3 at Baylor and 0-1 at Houston (2004).

**The Program**

- Oklahoma's all-time record stands at 819-305-53 in 117 seasons. Since WWII, OU leads the nation with 580 victories.
- The Sooners have captured seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000).
- OU has 44 bowl appearances (No. 7 nationally) with 26 bowl victories (No. 4 nationally).
- OU has 43 conference championships, including seven Big 12 titles overall (no other school has more than three)
- OU has 152 All-Americans and five Heisman winners. Sooners have also won the Bednarik (1), Butkus (4), Camp (4), Lombardi (3), Maxwell (2), Nagurski (2), O'Brien (3), Outland (5), Tatupu (1), Thorpe (3) and Unitas (1) Awards.
- OU leads the nation with 32 seasons in which the program has won 10 or more games.

### Oklahoma's Most Recent Game

Oklahoma returned home for the first time since a 39-home game winning streak was snapped and responded with a 41-25 victory over Texas A&M on Nov. 5 in front of the largest crowd in stadium history, 85,709 ...

- The win was a costly one for the Sooners as NCAA receptions record holder Ryan Broyles was lost for the season with a torn ACL. Broyles finished the season with 83 receptions for 1,157 yards and 10 touchdowns. The senior also led the Big 12 in punt returns with 18 returns for 188 yards.
- The Oklahoma defense forced at least four turnovers in a game for the third time this season.

- OU outscored the Aggies 28-0 in the third quarter to expand a 13-10 halftime lead to 41-10. OU has outscored its opponents 118-10 in the third stanza this season.
- The Sooner defense also recorded more than eight tackles for loss for the fifth straight game.
- Jaz Reynolds extended his streak of games with a touchdown to three games with a third-quarter score against the Aggies.
- Tress Way had four punts of 50-plus yards to give him 53 career punts over 50, breaking the OU program record in the stat category.

### Marquee Games Await

- Under Bob Stoops, OU has already played Florida State (twice), Cincinnati (twice), Louisville, Notre Dame, North Carolina, Alabama (twice), UCLA (twice), Oregon (twice), Washington (twice), South Florida, BYU and Miami (Fla.) (twice) in regular season contests.
- Seven of those were played on the road and one on a neutral field. The Sooners are 14-5 in those games.

### Fun in the Sun

Oklahoma is playing its first home day game of the season and only its third in 2011. In its previous two, the Sooners knocked off a pair of unbeaten, Texas and Kansas State, by an average score of 56.5 to 17. OU suffered its only loss of the season at night.

### Miscellany

- Among active FBS coaches with at least 100 victories, Bob Stoops has the best winning percentage at .811.
- OU's defense has produced 15 sacks over the last four games, while the offense has surrendered just one.
- OU has the same or fewer penalties than the opponent in seven of nine games.
- OU has 23 three-and-outs, (high of seven vs. Texas A&M) while the opponents have 41 (8, Ball State and Kansas).

### Stoops Era Yielding Record-Setting Attendance Figures

Oklahoma has drawn 6,538,399 fans for Bob Stoops' 79 home games (started in 1999) and all have been sold out.

- The Sooners are 76-3 on Owen Field under Stoops.
- The current string of sellouts is the longest in school history, eclipsing a mark of 69 from 1971-84.
- The top 10 seasons for attendance at Oklahoma during Stoops' tenure as head coach.
- The largest OU home crowd was 85,709, for the 2011 Texas A&M game.
- The 85,620 on hand for this year's Tulsa game represented the largest season-opening crowd ever at Oklahoma.
- OU has exceeded the seating capacity of 82,112 at Gaylord Family-Oklahoma Memorial Stadium in 58 straight games.
- Oklahoma has played before sellout crowds in 133 of the 169 games (79 home, 29 away, 16 neutral) since Stoops became the head coach. During that time, a total of 12,171,530 (average of 72,020) have watched the Sooners.

**About the Offense**

- Under Bob Stoops, OU has produced career leaders in passing, receiving and all-purpose yards, four top 10 career rushers and season record holders in rushing, passing and receiving yards.
- Stoops-led Sooner teams have set 47 offensive school records. Those offenses have 176 touchdowns of 25 or more yards and 344 scoring drives of two minutes or less.
- OU has scored in 171 consecutive games since 11/7/98.
- OU rushed for 200 yards 48 times under Stoops.
- Oklahoma is the highest scoring college program in history. In 1,222 games, the Sooners have scored 31,707 points. Michigan is next at 30,595 points in 1,268 games.

**Keeping up With Jones**

This season, QB Landry Jones has moved from No. 3 to No. 1 on the school's career passing yards list. He jumped over a pair of Heisman winners to claim the spot.

- At Kansas State, Jones set a school record for passing yards in a game at 505. He broke a mark that he previously held jointly with Sam Bradford.
- Also at KSU, he surpassed Bradford's record for career touchdown passes. He now has 92.
- Among active players, Jones is No. 2 in career passing yards/game (321.9), No. 3 in completions (920), No. 4 in yards (11,265), No. 4 in TD passes (92), No. 7 in total offense (11,046) and No. 6 in TDs responsible for (95).
- Has a completion rate of 60% in every game but two this season and has been over 350 yards in all but two.
- He has 12 TD throws over the last three games.
- Jones holds OU records with 20, career 300-yard games and eight, 400-yard games.

**The Record Book Broyles**

Ryan Broyles, lost for the year with a torn ACL, is the NCAA's career leader in receptions and the Big 12 leader for career receptions and career touchdown receptions ...

- Broyles set the NCAA career receptions record at Kansas (2nd qtr.) on a 57-yard touchdown catch. On that same play, he set the Big 12 record for career TD catches. He now has 349 receptions and 45 touchdown grabs.
- At Kansas State, he surpassed Rashaun Woods as the Big 12's career leader in receiving yards. He has 4,586.
- He also is the NCAA career leader among active players in TD receptions (45), receiving yards (4,586), punt return yards (1,194) and touchdowns (48).
- With 45 career TD catches, he is No. 4 on the NCAA list behind Rice's Jarrett Dillard (60), La. Tech's Troy Edwards (50) and Marshall's Darius Watts (47). He is already has the highest total by any player at a BCS school.
- He is No. 2 for NCAA in career receiving yards behind Nevada's Trevor Insley (5,005), and already surpasses all BCS players.
- Had 100+ yards receiving in 19 of his final 26 games and a TD grab in 17 of the final 25.
- Had at least one catch in his last 48 games, the second-longest string nationally (Houston's Tyron Carrier, 49).

**Now *That's* a Receiving Corps**

Oklahoma has seven different players with at least 10 receptions and an average of more than 10.0 yards per catch ...

- Fourteen different Sooners have a reception this season. That's the total number that had catches over last year's 14-game schedule. Twelve have at least five grabs.
- Kenny Stills has three, 100-yard receiving games this season and averages a touchdown every 5.1 receptions.
- After posting no catches in the first two games, Jaz Reynolds, who is up 30 pounds since his arrival on campus, now has 32 for 578 yards and five TDs. His 18.1 yards per catch average leads the team.
- OU's tight ends had their best day of the season at Kansas State when James Hanna and Trent Ratterree combined for four catches for 71 yards and one TD.

**Rapid Roy**

With Dominique Whaley out for the season, much of the running back load has shifted to the diminutive Roy Finch, who has more than responded ...

- Already, he's No. 4 on the team, No. 1 among running backs, in receptions with 23. Ten of those 23 grabs resulted in a Sooner first down.
- His 5.6 yards per carry average is 0.1 ahead of Whaley's though it should be noted that Whaley has 49 more attempts.

**Whaley Out for Season**

Oklahoma's lost its leading rusher, Dominique Whaley, on the first play of the Kansas State game to a broken bone in his left ankle.

- It is believed the previous record for rushing yards by a walk-on at OU was 423 yards by Jim Culbreath in 1975. Whaley finished the campaign with 627.

**Where There's a Will, There's a Trey**

Oklahoma FB Trey Millard busted off a 61-yard TD romp at Kansas State. It was the longest run by a Sooner fullback since 1986, when Lydell Carr went for 61 yards against Iowa State.

**For Whom the Bell Tolls**

A 6-6, 245 lb., quarterback, redshirt-freshman Blake Bell has been inserted into the Oklahoma lineup several times this season, usually in short yardage situations.

- Of Bell's 20 carries, nine have gone for a first down while three have gone for touchdowns, including two vs. Texas A&M.

**And ...**

- Oklahoma has given up only four sacks and just 38 tackles for loss. The Sooners have absorbed 102 negative yards for an average of just 11.3 per game. OU opponents average 39.1 negative yards per game.
- Oklahoma, somewhat a victim of its own efficiency, ranks No. 79 nationally in time of possession. With quick strikes and three defensive TDs, the Sooners had a season-low 22:06 against Texas, a deficit of 13:48. Only four times in nine games has OU exceeded its opponent in possession time.

### About the Sooner Defense

- OU has forced at least one turnover in 148 of Stoops' 169 games and has at least one interception in 109 of the last 148 with multiple picks in 68 of the last 120 outings.
- Oklahoma has 13 shutouts under its current head coach. Opponents failed to score more than seven points in 35 games and scored less than 14 in 65 games.

### Lewis Ascends OU Tackle List

- With his 423 career tackles (the second-highest total by a Bob Stoops player at OU), senior WLB Travis Lewis has cracked the career top 10 tackle list at OU. The record is held by the late Daryl Hunt at 530. Lewis, now at No. 6 (tied with Brian Bosworth), trails No. 5 Rod Shoate by three. He needs nine tackles to move ahead of Rocky Calmus in the Stoops era.
- Has 423 career stops, the third-best total among active players nationally.
- Lewis, who suffered a broken bone in the big toe of his left foot in preseason drills, missed the opener vs. Tulsa.
- Lewis has led Oklahoma in tackles in each of his first three seasons and has become only the sixth player in school history to lead the team in three consecutive years. The last to do it was Rocky Calmus, the Butkus Award winner in his senior campaign, from 1999-01. No player has had the lead in four seasons. With 55 tackles, Lewis is the 2011 team leader by three.
- As a freshman in 2007, Lewis had 144 tackles to break Brian Bosworth's OU freshman record of 133.
- Lewis has double-digit tackle totals in 16 of his 49 career games.
- He registered his eighth career interception against Nebraska in last season's Big 12 Championship Game. That equals the most by a linebacker in Sooner history. He has 156 career return yards on those picks, an average of 19.5 per return. Lewis had three takeaways in that game against the Cornhuskers including two fumble recoveries.

### Defensive TDs Up to 42 in Stoops Era

With a school-record three defensive touchdowns against Texas, Oklahoma now has 42 in Bob Stoops 12+ seasons.

- Thirteen of those touchdowns came via a fumble return.
- The defense has scored a touchdown in each of Stoops' 13 seasons, and in nearly one-fourth of the games he has coached at OU (39 of 168 games for 23%). That's an average of one every 4.9 games.

### Rip and Run

OU has 314 return yards on 12 interceptions (217) and eight fumbles (97), an average of 15.7 yards per return.

- Oklahoma has 12 interceptions this season for a whopping 217 yards in returns. That's an average of 18.1 yards per return. The top interception return average of the Bob Stoops era was 21.1 in 2002 when the Sooners logged 516 yards on 24 picks.

### The End(s) of the Line

DEs Frank Alexander and Ronnell Lewis are having dominant seasons. Alexander has 13.5 tackles for loss including 7.5 sacks thus far while Lewis has 12.5 TFLs and 5.5 sacks.

- Alexander has been credited with at least half a sack in six of the nine games in addition to a team-leading six break-ups, an interception, two forced fumbles, a recovered fumble and six hurries.
- In the opener against Tulsa, Alexander had two passes broken up and an interception, which he returned 27 yards.
- Against Texas, Alexander had six tackles, three sacks for -26 yards, four tackles for 30 yards in losses, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a break-up. He was named the Walter Camp Foundation's Defensive Player of the Week.
- Lewis has at least five tackles in every game this season and picked off his second career pass vs. Texas A&M.
- With Alexander and Lewis' interceptions, it marks the first year in OU history for two DEs to have INTs.
- The two have a combined 11 PBUs, the most ever by a DE duo since
- During portions of this season, Oklahoma played a front four comprised entirely of defensive ends. Alexander lined up at a tackle, David King at noseguard and Lewis and R.J. Washington at the end spots.

### Paper or Plastic?

Oklahoma has 34 sacks, including eight against Texas, through nine games ...

- OU started logging sacks in 1982. This team is trying to become the ninth to get at least 40. The school record of 48 was set in 1991.
- These Sooners have 74 tackles for loss and are trying to become the 12th OU team to reach 100 in a season since the stat began at the school in 1970. The Oklahoma record is 126 in 2002.
- Eleven players have at least half a sack this season.
- LB Corey Nelson has 5.5 sacks, which is three off the OU record for season sacks by a linebacker. Torrance Marshall set that mark with 8.5 in 1999.
- The 34 sacks have gone for 251 yards in losses, or an average of 7.4 per sack. The Sooners were held without a sack vs. Texas A&M. Prior to that, the lowest sack total in a game so far this season was two against Missouri.
- OU has 36 over their last six games away from Norman (seven vs. Nebraska in 2010 Big 12 Championship game, three vs. UConn in Fiesta Bowl, six at Florida State, eight vs. Texas, five at Kansas and seven at Kansas State).
- The Sooners are averaging 8.2 tackles for loss per game.

### OU Improves in Pass-Happy Era

Despite this pass-happy era, only once under Bob Stoops has OU allowed a season completion rate of 60% or higher. The 2010 finished at just 54.6%.

- This season, Sooner opponents are completing just 53.2% of their passes (175-of-329).
- Only two opponents have thrown for 300 yards this year.

## About the Sooner Special Teams

- There have been 27 special teams touchdowns, including 21 in the last 83 regular season games. Those 21 came via five different kinds of plays -- 12 punt returns, two faked field goals, two blocked punts, four kickoff returns and a faked punt. Special teams also own one safety in that span.
- Oklahoma has returned eight kickoffs and 16 punts for touchdowns.
- The Sooners have blocked 24 kicks.

- Kickoff Returns -- 99 returns of 25 yards or more with eight touchdowns.
- Punt Returns -- 66 returns of 15 or more yards with 16 touchdowns.
- Interception Returns -- 89 returns of 10 or more yards with 24 touchdowns.
- Fumble Returns -- eight returns of 15 or more yards with 12 touchdowns.

## Foot Facts

Oklahoma has used two kickers this season for placements with both Jimmy Stevens and Michael Hunnicutt handling the role. Hunnicutt has settled into the duty for now. Combined, the two are 18-of-21 on field goal attempts...

- Over the last two seasons, Oklahoma has made 41-of-50 field goals (82%).
- Hunnicutt took over in the Missouri game and has remained in the position as Stevens was forced out with a muscle pull. Hunnicutt is 14-of-17, including a 2-of-2 mark beyond 40. His 53-yarder at Kansas State was a career high and the longest by a Sooner since Garrett Hartley's 53-yarder in 2007 against Utah State. It marked the longest under Bob Stoops and the seventh longest in school history. Hunnicutt's kick was also the 22nd field goal in OU history of 50 or more yards. His previous best was a 44-yard field goal against Ball State.
- Stevens has made 16 of his last 17 field goals, all over his last five games played.
- At Oklahoma, Stevens ranks No. 6 all-time with 42 field goals made and No. 2 with 180 points after touchdown. He's No. 6 in kick scoring at 306.
- Patrick O'Hara has settled into the kickoff role for the Sooners. He has 69 thus far with 14 touchbacks. He averages 65.2 yards per kickoff and opponents are averaging 19.4 yards per return.

## Stops the Rock Too

Trey Millard does more than just offense, the fullback leads Oklahoma with 14 special teams tackles. Ronnell Lewis is second on the squad with 12 special teams stops, all on kickoffs.

## Way Good at Punter

- Way has 53 punts of 50+ yards in his career to set the OU program record. Jeff Ferguson (1998-01), previously held the OU record with 52.
- Way is No. 9 among active NCAA punters with a career average of 43.9. He maintains that average on more kicks than any of the players ahead of him. He has 175.
- This season, Way has played a central role in field position with 25 of 41 punts downed inside the 20. Only three of Way's punts have resulted in a touchback, all coming versus Texas A&M.
- In 2010, P Tress Way had 19 boots of 50+ yards with 18 inside the 20 and an average of 44.0 yards on 73 kicks. His average ranked No. 20 nationally, but he had more attempts than anyone ahead of him on that list.

## Replacing Ryan

- PR Ryan Broyles has more punt returns (108), more average returns per game (2.3) and more total punt return yards (1,194) than any other active players in NCAA FBS play but will now be replaced at the position after going down with a torn ACL in the Texas A&M game.
- He ranks No. 7 among active NCAA punt returners with an average of 11.1 yards per return.
- He had four punt returns this season that exceeded 20 yards, including a season-long 36 at Kansas.
- The only other player on the Oklahoma roster with a punt return this season is Kenny Stills who had one return for 13 yards vs. Ball State. Stills also had one punt return in 2010, a 16-yarder vs. Iowa State.
- Roy Finch will step in as the backup behind Stills.

**FRANK ALEXANDER • DE • 84**

Senior has 27 career starts at defensive end ... led all returners with seven sacks in 2010 ... picked off first career pass vs. Tulsa ... wore No. 12 vs. Florida State ... collected a career high three sacks vs. Texas along with a fumble recovery and a forced fumble that was returned for an OU TD ... named the Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week following the performance ... has a sack in five games and a half sack in a sixth ... now has 19.5 career sacks, ninth best in Oklahoma history.

Inserted in at Kansas State in jumbo type package designed for the bigger QB ... finished with five carries, seven yards and one touchdown ... had 12 carries for 37 yards and two touchdowns vs. Texas A&M ... twelve of his 20 carries have gone for either a first down or touchdown.

**JAYDAN BIRD • LB • 55**

A main player on special teams and backup at middle linebacker ... has appeared in 35 career games ... stepped in for Tom Wort vs. Texas and finished with a career-high six tackles, two of which went for a loss, and one sack ... played the entire second half at Kansas and finished with five tackles.

**RYAN BROYLES • WR • 85**

Suffered a torn ACL in OU's Nov. 5 win over Texas A&M ... owns 10 Oklahoma records, nine that were set in 2010 ... had a reception in 48 consecutive games ... had over 100 yards receiving in 19 of his last 26 games and scored a TD in 17 of last 25 ... has had at least 10 receptions in 14 career games ... has six games with three receiving TDs and 11 games with two ... Big 12 career leader in receptions (349), receiving yards (4,586) and receiving touchdowns (45) ... ranks eight in Big 12 history and third in OU history with 1,187 career punt return yards ... broke the previous NCAA record for career receptions of 316 at Kansas and ended with 349 career receptions ... is the 12th player in FBS history to record more than 4,000 career receiving yards ... second all-time on NCAA career receiving yards list with 4,586 yards ... is 420 yards from the NCAA record for career receiving yards ... broke his own single-game school record with 217 receiving yards at Kansas, topping the 208 yards he had vs. Colorado in 2010 ... reeled off a 33-yard punt return vs. Kansas, his longest of the season ... named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week following his performance at Kansas ... is second all-time on OU's career all-purpose yards list with 5,990 yards ... had 37 receptions for 610 yards and five touchdowns over his final four games.
