OPENING KICK

- ▶ In a matchup of the two most successful programs of the Big 12 era. No. 10/9 Oklahoma plays Texas for the 110th time on Saturday at 11 a.m. CT. The game, to be played in Dallas for the 87th straight year, will be televised by ABC. OU has claimed eight of 19 Big 12 championships, while UT ranks second with three
- ▶ Including this year, Oklahoma has been ranked in the AP Top 25 when playing Texas in 15 of head coach **Bob Stoops**' 17 seasons (was not ranked for 1999 or 2005 meetings). This marks just the third time during that span that Texas enters its game against the Sooners unranked by the AP (each the last three seasons).
- ▶ The Sooners are coming off a 44-24 home win over then-No. 23/21 West Virginia on Saturday. OU ran 28 fewer plays but outgained the Mountaineers 427 yards to 369 (7.4 yards per play to 4.3). Junior quarterback **Baker Mayfield** threw for 320 yards and three touchdowns against a WVU defense that entered the game surrendering a Big 12-low 154.0 passing yards per game and that had allowed just two passing touchdowns in its first three games. OU forced five turnovers and logged seven sacks, both program highs since the 2014 Sugar Bowl.
- ▶ Texas, which went 6-7 last season and lost to Arkansas (31-7) in the Texas Bowl. is off to a 1-4 start with its lone victory at home versus Rice (42-28). The Longhorns have lost at Notre Dame (38-3), at home to California (45-44) and Oklahoma State (30-27), and at TCU (50-7). Those four teams are a combined 19-1.
- ▶ Big 12 Conference teams have registered two wins against top-25 teams (at the time of competition) this season and OU owns both (31-24 at No. 23/23 Tennessee in double overtime and 44-24 vs. No. 23/21 West Virginia).
- ▶ This is the 12th time in 17 seasons (third straight and fifth in the last six vears) under Stoops that OU has started 4-0. The Sooners have begun a season with a 5-0 record nine times during his tenure.
- ▶ Oklahoma is 40-5 since the start of the 2010 season against teams unranked in the AP Top 25 Poll.
- ▶ An OU win on Saturday would give the Sooners five victories in their last six meetings against Texas and six in the last nine matchups.

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

▶ Texas is the only Big 12 program with a winning record against the Sooners. Oklahoma is 44-60-5 in the series, but owns a 23-18-3 advantage since 1971. In the Big 12 era, OU is 11-8 against the Longhorns, while head coach **Bob Stoops** boasts a 10-6 record in the series. The Sooners have won four of the last five meetings, including a 31-26 contest last year in which OU was outgained 482-232 but got touchdowns on a 91-yard kickoff return by Alex Ross and a 43-yard interception return by Zack Sanchez.



Senior outside linebacker Eric Striker is coming off a career-high-tying 12-tackle effort against West Virginia in which he registered three tackles for loss, two sacks and a forced fumble that was returned for a touchdown. He was named the AutoNation National Defensive Player of the Week (selected by the FWAA).

OU-TEXAS: THE STOOPS ERA

Saturday's game will mark the 17th between Oklahoma and Texas during the Bob Stoops era. Here's a breakdown of the last 16 meetings.

- ▶ Oklahoma's defense, which ranks first in the Big 12 by allowing only 5.8 yards per opponent pass attempt on the season, will be facing a Texas offense that ranks last in the league in passing offense (167.2 yards per game). On the other side of the ball, OU ranks second in the Big 12 in yards per pass attempt (10.0), while Texas ranks ninth in passing defense (296.6 yards per game).
- ▶ Junior QB **Baker Mayfield** ranks second among FBS players in points responsible for per game (25.5), fourth in passing TDs per game (3.25), fifth in passing efficiency rating (178.5), sixth in total offense per game (380.0) and eighth in passing yards per game (345.5). He has thrown for at least three touchdowns in all four games and has run for at least one in three contests.
- ▶ 0U has scored at least 55 points against Texas four times in the first 16 years of the Stoops era (63-14 in 2000, 65-13 in 2003, 55-17 in 2011 and 63-21 in 2012). The Sooners never reached the 55-point mark in the previous 93 matchups.

RECAPPING THE WIN OVER WEST VIRGINIA (STATISTICAL RECAP ON PAGE 28)

- ▶ West Virginia entered Saturday's game in Norman ranked first nationally in scoring defense (12.7 ppg) and turnover margin (+3.0 per game), and first in the Big 12 in passing defense (154.0 ypg). But Oklahoma reversed all of those trends in a 44-24 victory, the Sooners' fourth in four tries since WVU joined the Big 12. OU passed for 320 yards and forced five turnovers while committing two.
- ▶ Junior quarterback **Baker Mayfield** registered his third 300-yard passing game and threw for three touchdowns. His 71-yard TD pass to **Durron Neal** late in the third quarter capped a three-play, 95-yard drive and was OU's second-longest play from scrimmage this season. It also put the Sooners up 34-24.
- ▶ Oklahoma ran 28 fewer plays than the Mountaineers but outgained them 427 yards to 369 (7.4 yards per play to 4.3). West Virginia entered the game averaging 6.8 yards per play.
- ▶ The Sooners took a 24-7 lead to halftime after freshman running back **Joe Mixon** scored on a 35-yard run with 2:16 left in the second quarter. It was OU's second-longest rush of the season and the longest by a running back. WVU had not surrendered a first-half point in its first three games. The Mountaineers outscored OU 17-3 to start the third quarter before Neal's TD.
- ▶ Oklahoma added seven sacks to its five takeaways, both program highs since the Sugar Bowl win over Alabama to end the 2013 season. Senior linebacker **Eric Striker** tied career highs with 12 tackles and three tackles for loss (including two sacks) while also forcing a fourth-quarter fumble that was returned 41 yards by junior linebacker **Jordan Evans** for OU's final TD.
- ▶ West Virginia quarterback **Skyler Howard** had one interception entering the game, but the Sooners picked him off three times. Sophomore cornerback **Jordan Thomas** registered his first two career interceptions, while junior safety **Ahmad Thomas** added the second of his career. OU entered the game with one interception on the year.
- ▶ Senior receiver **Sterling Shepard** and redshirt-freshman receiver **Mark Andrews** each caught their third TD pass of the season. Shepard's 28-yard score was the 18th of his career while Andrews scored from 17 yards out.
- ▶ True freshman **Austin Seibert** made all three of his field goal tries and all five of his point-after attempts to remain perfect on the year (7 field goals, 21 extra points). He also averaged 43.4 yards on his five punts (two went 50-plus yards and three were downed inside the 20-vard line). Seibert was named Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week.

SCOUTING TEXAS

- ▶ Texas (1-4, 0-1) has faced one of the most difficult schedules in the nation, already playing four teams that are ranked in the current AP Top 25 Poll. The Longhorns' only win was a 42-28 home victory over Rice in their second game of the year.
- ▶ UT ranks ninth in the Big 12 in scoring offense (24.6 ppg), eighth in scoring defense (38.2 ppg), 10th in total offense (338.6 ypg) and eighth in total defense (507.2 ypg).
- ▶ Texas leads the Big 12 and ranks ninth nationally with its 21.4 yards per punt return. Senior wide receiver **Daje Johnson** averages 17.6 yards per punt return to pace the league and rank 13th nationally. He was named Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week on Sept. 14 with 119 punt return yards against Rice, including one return that went for 85 yards and a TD.
- ▶ Redshirt freshman quarterback **Jerrod Heard** leads Texas with his 63.6 yards rushing and 132.2 yards passing per game. He is rushing for 4.7 yards per attempt and has scored three TDs. Heard is completing 55.3 percent of his pass attempts and has two TDs and two interceptions. In a 45-44 loss to California on Sept. 19, Heard set a school record with 527 yards of total offense (364 passing and 163 rushing). He became the first UT freshman quarterback to throw for 300 yards since **Colt McCoy** in 2006.
- ► Sophomore running back **D'Onta Foreman** is averaging 42.2 yards per game on the ground and is coming off a 112-yard effort against TCU (6.2 yards per carry). Johnson has caught a team-high 14 passes for an average of 40.2 yards per game.
- ▶ Senior linebacker Peter Jinkens leads the team and ranks sixth in the Big 12 with his 8.0 tackles per game. He has registered 4.0 tackles for loss, 1.0 sack and three quarterback hurries.
- ▶ Charlie Strong (Central Arkansas, '82) is in his second season as head coach at Texas (7-11 record) and sixth year as a head coach overall (44-27 record). Prior to arriving in Austin, Strong went 37-15 in four seasons at Louisville. He also served as Florida's interim head coach in 2004 in the Peach Bowl.

LAST YEAR AT THE COTTON BOWL

- ▶ Oklahoma was outgained 482 yards to 232 and watched Texas register a 24-11 advantage in first downs, but still managed to claim the Golden Hat Trophy for the fourth time in five years by fending off the Longhorns in Dallas last season, 31-26.
- ▶ Alex Ross returned a kickoff 91 yards for a TD and Zack Sanchez returned an interception 43 yards for a score as the Sooners took a 17-13 lead to halftime despite amassing only 29 yards of offense.
- ▶ OU took a 31-13 lead following a **Sterling Shepard** 24-yard TD pass from **Trevor Knight** and a **Samaje Perine** 13-yard scamper before Texas responded with a pair of fourth-quarter TDs to make things interesting. Shepard led OU with four catches for 63 yards while Perine paced the Sooners with 62 yards on 18 carries.
- ▶ The game featured 17 punts (nine by Oklahoma) and only one turnover.
- ▶ Knight completed 12 of 20 pass attempts for 129 yards and a score while Texas quarterback **Tyrone Swoopes** was 27 for 44 for a career-high 334 yards and two TDs (he also ran for one).
- ► Texas ran 84 plays to Oklahoma's 50 and outgained the Sooners 5.7 yards per play to 4.6.

SOONERS LOOKING FOR NINTH BIG 12 TITLE

- ▶ Oklahoma's performance in the Big 12 Conference since **Bob Stoops** took over as head coach in 1999 has been nothing short of dominant. The Sooners have won eight Big 12 titles in Stoops' first 16 seasons, with no other program during that span winning more than two.
- ▶ Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed eight league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each) and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each).
- ▶ OU owns a league-best 105-28 (.789) record in regular season Big 12 games since the Stoops era began. Texas ranks second with a 97-37 (.724) record during the same span and Kansas State ranks third with a 75-58 (.564) mark. See the complete list in the chart to the right.
- ▶ During Stoops' OU tenure, the Sooners have racked up a Big 12-leading 36.9 points per game. During the same span, Texas Tech ranks second among other current Big 12 programs by averaging 35.7 points and is followed by Texas (35.0), Oklahoma State (33.8), Kansas State (33.4), TCU (33.3), West Virginia (31.0), Baylor (28.3), Kansas (24.3) and Iowa State (23.2).

MAYFIELD'S HOT START

- ▶ Junior quarterback **Baker Mayfield** is off to a strong start in his first year of competition with the Sooners. A former walk-on at Texas Tech who transferred to Oklahoma (also as a walk-on) without talking to OU coaches after being named Big 12 Offensive Freshman of the Year as a Red Raider, Mayfield ranks second among FBS players in points responsible for per game (25.5), fourth in passing TDs per game (3.33), sixth in total offense per game (380.0) and eighth in passing yards per game (345.5).
- ▶ Mayfield is tied with **Josh Heupel** for most total TDs (17) in the first four games of an OU career. He has passed for 13 scores and run for four (see chart above).
- ▶ According to ESPN Stats and Info, Mayfield, who is now on scholarship, became the first FBS player since at least 2000 with three or more passing TDs and one or more rushing TD in each of his team's first three games of a season.

- ▶ Mayfield entered the Heisman Trophy conversation, ranking fifth in ESPN's voting after week three.
- ▶ Last week against a West Virginia defense that allowed just 7.7 points, 154.0 passing yards and 0.7 touchdown passes per game, Mayfield threw for 320 yards and three scores in a 44-24 win.
- ▶ Mayfield set the OU single-game record for total offense (572 yards) against Tulsa two games ago and tied the school record by accounting for six TDs (four passing, two rushing). His 487 passing yards stand as the fourth most in OU single-game history. He was 32 for 38 through the air, and his 226.6 pass efficiency rating was the highest by a Sooner with more than 30 attempts in a game.
- ▶ At then-No. 23 Tennessee in the season's second game, Mayfield engineered a comeback from a 17-0 deficit by leading the Sooners to TDs on their final four possessions for a 31-24 double-overtime victory in front of 102,455 fans (the most to ever see an OU game).
- ▶ In his first game as a Sooner, Mayfield set the OU record for passing yards in a season opener (388) in a 41-3 win over Akron.

PERINE RETURNING TO FORM

- ▶ After averaging 55.5 rushing yards per game (3.3 yards per carry) in OU's first two contests this year, sophomore running back **Samaje Perine** is averaging 108.5 yards over the last two outings against Tulsa and West Virginia (5.7 yards per carry).
- ▶ Against WVU on Saturday, Perine became the sixth Sooner under **Bob Stoops** (31st in OU history) to rush for 2,000 yards in a career. He reached the mark faster than any other player under Stoops (326 carries). For his career, Perine is averaging 6.1 yards per rush.
- ▶ Last year, Perine became the first freshman in Big 12 history to lead the league in rushing, averaging 131.8 yards per game. That average ranked him eighth nationally.

FASTEST TO 2,000 UNDER STOOPS

Six Sooners under head coach Bob Stoops have rushed for 2,000 yards in a career. But Samaje Perine did it in fewer carries than anyone else.

- ▶ The 1,713 net rushing yards for Perine were sixth most by a freshman in FBS history and second most in Big 12 and OU freshman annals, behind **Adrian Peterson's** 1,925 yards in 2004. Perine's total was fifth highest in a season in OU annals.
- ▶ Perine, who bench presses 440 pounds, tied for second in OU history with three 200-yard rushing games last year. He was one of six players, and the only freshman, to have three 200-yard games in 2014.
- ▶ Perine's 21 rushing touchdowns last year were the most ever in a season by a Big 12 freshman. He led the Big 12 in the category and the total ranked as the fourth most in a season by a Sooner.
- ▶ Against Kansas (11/22/14), Perine amassed an FBS-record 427 rushing yards and five touchdowns on 34 carries. The yardage ranked seventh all-time in NCAA history for all levels and divisions.

WR SHEPARD CLIMBING THE CHARTS

- ➤ Senior receiver **Sterling Shepard** is rapidly ascending several OU career charts. A 2014 first-team All-Big 12 selection by the league's coaches, Shepard is tied for third in career 100-yard receiving games (9), ranks fifth in career receiving yards (2,515), is tied for sixth in career receptions (167) and ranks seventh in career TD receptions (18).
- ▶ Shepard was held to three catches for 68 yards in the season opener before grabbing seven balls for 74 yards and two touchdowns in the win at Tennessee. The scores came with 40 seconds left in the fourth quarter and in double-overtime. He added a 28-yard TD catch vs. West Virginia.
- ▶ Last year, Shepard totaled 911 receiving yards in OU's first seven games (130.1 average) before getting hurt on OU's first play from scrimmage at lowa State. He missed the next game and was limited the rest of the season after returning.
- ► Shepard, who shares the OU single-game record with 15 catches (last year vs. Kansas State), wears the same jersey number (3) as his late father, Derrick, who was also a Sooner receiver (1983-86).

SENSATIONAL SEIBERT

- ► Austin Seibert is the only FBS true freshman to handle his team's placekicking and punting duties, and he's been stellar through four games.
- ➤ Seibert, from Belleville, Ill., has made all seven of his field goal tries and all 21 of his point-after attempts. Only one other Sooner in history has started his career by making seven field goal attempts (**Michael Hunnicutt** in 2011). No OU player has ever made the first eight field goal tries of his career.
- ▶ Seibert leads Big 12 kickers and ranks second among all league players with his 10.5 points per game.
- ▶ Seibert ranks fourth in the Big 12 with his 45.2-yard punting average. Eight of his 21 punts have gone 50 yards or more, and nine have been downed inside the 20-yard line (only one touchback).

YOUTH IS SERVED ON O-LINE

▶ OU entered the year charged with the task of replacing three of five starters from an offensive line unit that led the nation by surrendering

only nine sacks in 2014 and that paved the way for a rushing attack that led the Big 12 with 261.2 yards a contest. Gone are LT **Tyrus Thompson** (Minnesota Vikings, 6th round), LG **Adam Shead** and RT **Daryl Williams** (Carolina Panthers, 4th round). Returning starters are senior C **Ty Darlington** (15 career starts) and senior RG **Nila Kasitati** (14 career starts).

- ▶ Three OU offensive linemen made their first career starts against Akron in the opener and two of those three played in their first career games.
- ► For the first time in school history in the game against Akron, OU started two freshmen at tackle. Redshirt freshman **Orlando Brown** started at left tackle and true freshman **Dru Samia** started on the right side. They became the ninth and 10th freshmen to start at tackle in OU history.
- ▶ Also making his first career start against Akron was sophomore left guard **Jonathan Alvarez**. Alvarez played in one game last season and that was the opener against Louisiana Tech (saw very limited action in the contest).
- ► Senior **Josiah St. John** replaced Samia in the starting lineup the last three games.
- ▶ Two games ago against Tulsa, Darlington did not play and Kasitati played sparingly, both due to injury. Alvarez took Darlington's place at center and senior **Derek Farniok** started in Alvarez's place at left guard. The unit was commended by the coaching staff after the game, and understandbly so. The Sooners amassed 773 total yards (their most since 1988), including a season-high 286 rushing yards.
- ▶ Darlington and Kasitati returned against West Virginia, and Farniok started for the second straight game at left guard.

RILEY RETURNS TO BIG 12 AS OU'S OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

- ▶ **Lincoln Riley** made his OU debut as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach vs. Akron, the same day he turned 32. From Muleshoe, Texas, Riley is no stranger to the Big 12, having played quarterback at Texas Tech under **Mike Leach** and then serving seven years on the TTU staff (the Red Raiders played in bowl games all seven years and won five).
- ▶ Riley has OU ranked 10th nationally in passing offense (358.2 yards per game), 12th in total offense (521.8 yards per game) and eighth in yards per completion (15.4). The Sooners' 773 total yards against Tulsa rank as the fourth most by an FBS team this season and the fourth most in school history.
- ▶ Riley came to Norman with the reputation as one of the brightest young coaches in the college game. He spent the last five seasons at East Carolina, where the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual records with their up-tempo, spread offensive scheme. His five squads own the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four positions for total offense in a season.
- ▶ Last season, ECU ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 yards per game) and ranked fifth in total offense (533.0 yards per game).
- ▶ The Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense in 2014. By comparison, OU has not reached that figure since recording 7,670 yards of total offense in 2008.

▶ Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

MIKE STOOPS GUIDES DEFENSE

- ▶ Oklahoma associate head coach and defensive coordinator **Mike Stoops** is in his fourth season on the staff after previously quiding the OU 'D' from 1999-03.
- ▶ Last year's Oklahoma defense ranked fourth nationally by allowing only 3.02 yards per carry. It was the lowest opponent average since OU permitted 2.80 yards per rush in 2009.
- ▶ Stoops' defenses have posted six shutouts, including five in his first stint in Norman.
- ▶ In his first OU stint, four of his five units finished No. 7 or better nationally in scoring defense and in the top 10 for total defense.
- ► From 2000-03, Stoops' defenses finished in the top 25 in pass defense and rush defense each year and in pass efficiency defense and turnovers twice.
- ► Stoops is the only coach to have an athlete win both the Nagurski and Thorpe awards in the same season, and it happened twice (**Roy Williams** in 2001 and **Derrick Strait** in 2003).

EXPERIENCED INSIDE LINEBACKERS

- ▶ The Sooners return an experienced core of inside linebackers, with three players in the group each tallying more than 90 tackles in a season.
- ▶ **Dominique Alexander** and **Jordan Evans**, who each started all 13 games last year, paced 0U with 107 and 93 tackles, respectively, as sophomores. Alexander leads the Big 12 this season with his 10.0 tackles per game.
- ▶ Alexander was a second-team All-Big 12 selection by the Associated Press last year and was on preseason watch lists this season for the Butkus, Nagurski and Rotary Lombardi Awards. Evans, an Academic All-Big 12 First Team honoree, is the son of **Scott Evans**, a three-time All-Big Eight defensive tackle for the Sooners (1988-90).
- ► Senior **Frank Shannon**, who was not enrolled at 0U last year, led the Sooners with 92 tackles in 2013. He started all 13 games and was an honorable mention All-Big 12 choice.
- ▶ The Alexander/Evans/Shannon trio has combined for 501 career tackles.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST


- ▶ Oklahoma is tied with Ohio State for most weeks ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll (101). Additionally, OU's 389 weeks in the AP's top five are more than any other school. The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.
- ▶ During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (610) and a better winning percentage (.762) than any other program.
- ▶ OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 33,515 points (in 1,224 games). Nebraska ranks second with 32,209 points (in 1,307 games).
- ▶ No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 35. In addition, OU's 21 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.
- ► Since **Bob Stoops**' arrival in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (172) and points scored (7,960).
- ▶ Only Alabama (9) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

EXTRA POINTS

- ▶ Oklahoma has played more games against Texas and Oklahoma State (109 each) than any other opponent.
- ▶ Saturday's game will mark the 125th under **Bob Stoops** that Oklahoma has been ranked in the AP's top 10 (first this season). The Sooners are 102-22 (.823) in the first 124 such contests. OU is 25-10-2 all-time against Texas when ranked in the AP's top 10 (8-1 under Stoops).
- ▶ Seven of OU's 10 wins against Texas under Stoops have been by double digits and four have been by at least 30 points.
- ▶ 0U is 51-26 (.662) against AP Top 25 teams in the 2000s, good for the second most wins nationally (LSU is 55-31 [.640]).
- ▶ Senior **Eric Striker** is OU's all-time leader in sacks among linebackers (18.0).
- ▶ In its three home games, OU is averaging 579.7 yards of total offense and 415.3 passing yards. Quarterback **Baker Mayfield** is 69 for 96 through the air for a 71.9-percent completion rate and is averaging 396.7 passing yards and 3.3 passing TDs per game.
- ▶ The Sooners are looking for their 13th season of at least 10 wins under Stoops. Oklahoma is the only FBS program to rack up 12 seasons of double-digit victories since 2000.
- ▶ Oklahoma was ranked No. 19 in both the Associated Press and Amway Coaches top 25 preseason polls, its lowest ranking in both polls to start a year since its national championship season of 2000. OU started at No. 19 in both polls that year, as well.
- ▶ In the last five seasons, 27 Sooners have been taken in the NFL Draft (the Big 12 school with the next highest total is Baylor with 17). Those 27 picks are the fifth most of any school over the last five years. Only Alabama (37), Florida State (37), LSU (33) and Georgia (28) have had more.
- ▶ OU has had at least four players selected in every NFL Draft since 2008. LSU is the only other school that can make that claim.
- ▶ Fifteen Sooners have been taken in the NFL Draft first round in the last five years. No other Big 12 school has had more than nine in that same span.

GAME 5: OKLAHOMA VS. TEXAS STADIUM NOTES

OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project will bowl in the south end of the facility and is slated to be completed in time for the 2016 season.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- ▶ Gaylord Family Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest oncampus facilities in the nation.
- ▶ In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director **Bennie Owen** suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- ▶ The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- ▶ In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998) and its existing figure of 82,112 (2003)
- ▶ In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

CURRENT RENOVATION

- ▶ The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project will be constructed entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- ▶ The first phase of the building project will be completed prior to the 2016 season and will focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect will result in completing the south end zone seating bowl, a feature that will initially increase seating capacity to more than 84,000 seats.
- ▶ The seating bowl will feature an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure will feature 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons will benefit from two new clubs.
- ▶ Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility will be a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They will each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- ▶ The new building will allow for all student-athlete services to be moved to the ground floor. That space will include a new locker room, strength and conditioning room, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building will house all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- ▶ The weight room will nearly triple in size to 26,600 square feet and include a 70-yard indoor turfed speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also will grow substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

WINNING LEGACY

- ▶ Bob Stoops is the winningest coach in Oklahoma history with a 172-44 overall record. He ranks third at OU with his .796 career winning percentage.
- ▶ Won more games in his first 16 years than any college coach.
- ▶ Reached 100 wins in 122 games (tied for ninth fastest all-time pace).
- ▶ Has led the Sooners to a school-record 16 consecutive bowl berths.
- ► Since he took over at OU in 1999, has coached Sooners to more wins than any other Power Five program has accumulated during that time span.
- ► Has directed the Sooners to the second highest winning percentage of any Power Five program since 1999, trailing only Ohio State.
- ▶ Is the only coach in the BCS era to win a national championship and every BCS bowl game (Fiesta, Orange, Rose, Sugar).
- ▶ Under his direction, Oklahoma is one of only nine Power Five programs to average 10 wins per year over the last five seasons.
- ▶ Has 12 seasons of 10 or more wins, the most of any FBS coach since 2000.
- ▶ Has led OU to a 51-26 record against AP Top 25 foes since 2000.
- ▶ Owns a 93-8 home record, which included a school-record 39-game winning streak (ninth longest in college football history) and two 19-game strings.
- ▶ The Sooners are a combined 22-10 under Stoops against their two biggest rivals (10-6 against Texas and a 12-4 vs. Oklahoma State).

CONFERENCE SUPREMACY

- ▶ Stoops has coached OU to eight Big 12 championships, more than twice as many as any other school (Texas is next with three).
- ▶ Owns a 54-15 overall mark the last five-plus years and a 33-12 league record, both of which are the best of any Big 12 team during that span.
- ▶ Has guided the Sooners to more wins against AP Top 25 teams than any Big 12 team over the last five years. OU is the only program in the conference to own a winning record in such games (16-11).

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

- ▶ Stoops has produced 34 first-team All-Americans, two AP Players of the Year and 78 NFL Draft picks as OU's head coach.
- ▶ Stoops has coached two Heisman Trophy winners (Jason White in 2003 and Sam Bradford in 2008) and five Heisman finalists.

- ► At least one of his OU players has earned each one of these accolades: the Bednarik Award, Lombardi Award, Walter Camp Award, Maxwell Award, Unitas Award, Outland Trophy, Wuerffel Trophy and the Mosi Tatupu Award.

OUARTERBACKS

6 BAKER MAYFIELD (JR.)

- ▶ Mayfield was 14 for 25 for 320 yards passing and three touchdowns against a West Virginia defense that entered the game allowing a Big 12-low 154.0 passing yards per game.
- ► Season touchdown total is at 17 (13 passing, 4 rushing), tying him with Josh Heupel (1999; 16 passing, 1 rushing) for the most by an OU player in his first four games.
- ▶ Has thrown three or more touchdowns in each of the Sooners' first four games.
- ▶ Has now topped 300 yards passing in three of his four games as a Sooner.
- ▶ Racked up 572 yards of total offense against Tulsa (9/19) to set the school single-game record. That total was also the seventh-most by a player in Big 12 history.
- ▶ Passed for a career-high 487 yards (fourth most in school history) and rushed for a career-high 85 yards against Tulsa (9/19) to earn co-Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week honors.
- ► Tied a career high with four TD passes against Tulsa (9/19) and set a career high with two TD runs
- ▶ His 226.60 passing efficiency (Tulsa, 9/19) stands as the highest mark by a Sooner with more than 30 attempts in a game.
- ▶ Against Tulsa (9/19), Mayfield became one of six players in school history to account for six touchdowns in game. He joined Landry Jones (twice), Josh Heupel (twice), Quentin Griffin, Sam Bradford and Trevor Knight.
- ▶ Led a comeback from a 17-point deficit at Tennessee on 9/12/15. Recorded three passing TDs and added another on the ground, all in the fourth quarter and two overtime periods.
- ▶ Set the OU record for passing yards in a season opener with 388 against Akron (9/5/15).
- ▶ Became one of just five Sooners to throw for more than 300 yards in their OU debut, joining Blake Bell (2013), Sam Bradford (2007), Josh Heupel (1999) and Jason White.
- ▶ Named OU's starting quarterback on Aug. 24 and made his Sooners debut vs. Akron.
- ▶ Transferred from Texas Tech after 2013 season and sat out last year (lost a year of eligibility in the intraleague transfer).
- ▶ Played in 8 games (7 starts) for Texas Tech in 2013 as a freshman, completing 218 of 340 passes for 2,315 yards with 12 TDs and 9 INTs.
- ▶ Named the Big 12 Offensive Freshman of the Year in 2013 and an honorable mention freshman All-American by College Football News.
- ► Threw for 413 yards with 4 TDs, while adding a rushing score in his collegiate debut, a 41-23 victory at SMU (8/30/12). He was named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week.

9 TREVOR KNIGHT (RS-JR.)

32 SAMAJE PERINE (SO.)

- ▶ Rushed for 65 yards against West Virginia (10/3) to give him 2,041 for his career. Reached 2,000 yards on 326 carries, getting there in fewer attempts than any player in the Stoops era.
- ▶ Posted his first 100-yard rushing performance of the season against Tulsa (9/19) with a team-leading 154 yards on 22 carries.
- ▶ Grabbed his first career receiving touchdown in the fourth quarter against Tennessee (9/12) on a two-yard pass from Mayfield. Also led Oklahoma in rushing against the Vols with 78 yards on 23 carries.
