OPENING KICK

▶ No. 18/16 Oklahoma (1-1, 0-1) plays its first road game of the season when it travels to Ames, Iowa, to face Iowa State (1-1, 1-0) on Saturday at 6:30 p.m. CT at Jack Trice Stadium. The game will be televised by ABC with Sean McDonough, Todd Blackledge, Todd McShay and Molly McGrath announcing.

▶ Oklahoma owns a 76-6-2 (.917) all-time record against Iowa State and is 37-2-1 (.938) vs. the Cyclones in Ames. In the Big 12 era, the Sooners hold a 15-1 series advantage (7-0 in Ames).

▶ Since the start of the 1999 season (which was **Bob Stoops'** first as OU head coach), the Sooners are 14-1 against Iowa State, with 13 of the 14 wins coming by double digits (the Sooners won 42-41 last year). In OU's seven road games against ISU during that period (all wins), it has outscored the Cyclones 266-109 (average of 38-16).

► The Sooners' .917 series winning percentage against Iowa State is the best by one FBS program against another (minimum of 50 games played).

• Oklahoma is 22-1 in true road games since Lincoln Riley arrived in Norman in 2015. With Riley as their head coach (he took over for Bob Stoops in June 2017), the Sooners are 13-1 in true road games (only blemish was a 48-41 loss at Kansas State on Oct. 26, 2019).

Oklahoma is 41-5 (.891) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2015 season, which coincides with Riley's arrival at OU as offensive coordinator. Oklahoma State ranks second during that period (29-17; .630) while TCU, Texas and West Virginia rank third (25-21; .543).



Freshman Marvin Mims' three touchdown receptions are the most by a Sooner in the first two games of a career since Ryan Broyles had three as a redshirt freshman in 2008. Broyles is OU's career leader in receptions, receiving yards and receiving TDs. Mims is one of three Sooner pass catchers with at least 100 receiving vards this season.

▶ OU is the only program to win at least three straight Big 12 titles, and has done so twice (2006-08 and 2015-19). Its current streak of five straight outright league championships is the longest among Power Five programs since Alabama won five in a row from 1971 to '75 (Clemson is also riding a five-game outright streak [ACC]). The last time the Sooners won at least six consecutive conference championships was 1972-80 under head coaches Chuck Fairbanks (1972) and Barry Switzer. The last current Power Five program to win six straight outright conference titles is Oklahoma (12 in a row from 1948 to '59).

> Oklahoma's No. 18 AP poll ranking this week snaps a streak of 29 polls in which it appeared in the top 10. This week also marks just the third time in the last 59 AP polls that OU hasn't been ranked in the top 10. The Sooners have not been ranked as low as No. 18 since Oct. 10, 2016, when they were 19th.

KEY STORYLINES

Oklahoma has not lost back-to-back regular season games since Oct. 2 and 9, 1999, which was Bob Stoops' first season as head coach. That's good for the nation's longest active stretch (Alabama hasn't lost consecutive regular season games since 2007). The Sooners have won 40 straight regular season contests following a regular season loss.

▶ Iowa State's only two wins against the Sooners since 1961 came in 1990 (33-31) and in 2017 (38-31), both in Norman. OU has won 24 straight games in Ames and hasn't lost there since a 10-6 defeat Nov. 5, 1960 (three days before John F. Kennedy won the presidential election). ISU's six overall wins in the series have come by 1, 2, 4, 6, 7 and 13 points. Its 13-point victory came in the first meeting in 1928 in Ames.

 OU redshirt freshman quarterback Spencer Rattler has thrown eight touchdown passes this season, one shy of the school record by players in their first two starts (redshirt freshman Landry Jones had nine in 2009). Rattler is tied for second nationally in TD passes and ranks fifth in completion percentage (.759) and passing efficiency rating (209.1). Among QBs that have played at least two games, he ranks fourth in passing yards per contest (378.5)

▶ Sooners freshman **Marvin Mims** has a team-high three touchdown catches through OU's first two games. He's the program's first player since redshirt freshman receiver **Ryan Broyles** in 2008 to register three TD receptions in his first two career games (Broyles is OU's career records holder for receptions, receiving yards and receiving TDs). Mims, who attended Lone Star High School in Frisco, Texas, is the state's high school record holder for receiving yards in a career (5,485) and in a season (2,629 on 117 receptions and 32 touchdowns last year). He has eight catches fora team-high 111 yards this season.

▶ Oklahoma ranks first nationally in opponent third-down conversion percentage, holding Missouri State and Kansas State to a combined 2-for-22 (9.1%) mark. Out of 72 FBS teams that have played at least one game this season, lowa State ranks 54th with its 37.0% conversion rate on offense (10 for 27). OU also ranks eighth in the country in total defense, allowing 267.5 yards per contest and fourth in rushing defense at just 60.0 yards per game. Iowa State running back **Breece Hall** leads the Big 12 with his 128.5 rushing yards per outing and is coming off an 18-carry, 154-yard rushing performance (7.6 average) at TCU in which he scored three TDs.

ROAD WARRIORS

Oklahoma has won 24 of its last 25 true road games, with the only loss

during that stretch coming at Kansas State, 48-41, on Oct. 26, 2019. That defeat snapped a 22-game true road winning streak (the Sooners hadn't lost since Oct 4, 2014), which was the sec-

- ond longest such streak nationally since at least the end of World War II (OU also won 25 straight from 1953 to 58).
- During the 22-game streak, OU outscored opponents 1,076-626 (49-28 average) and outgained them 12,829 yards to 9,208 (583-419 average).
- Oklahoma has outgained its opponent in 23 of its last 25 true road games.
- ▶ OU has scored at least 31 points in each of its last 30 true road games and at least 41 points in 21 of them.

RECAPPING LAST WEEK'S KANSAS STATE GAME

▶ Oklahoma outgained Kansas State by 117 yards (517-400), had 28 first downs to the Wildcats' 10 and held KSU to a 2-for-11 performance on third downs, but gave up the last 24 points (was outscored 17-0 in the fourth quarter) in a 38-35 home loss Saturday. The Sooners held leads of 28-7 and 35-14.

► The loss snapped OU's 17-game home winning streak and gave K-State a second straight victory in the series. The last time the Sooners lost games in consecutive seasons to an opponent was 2013 and '14 (Baylor). OU's 53-game streak of winning when leading after the third quarter also came to a halt.

► The Sooners led 21-7 at halftime thanks to a 17-for-19 passing performance (for 181 yards and three touchdowns) by **Spencer Rattler. Seth McGowan's** five-yard TD run with 2:46 left in the third quarter gave OU a 35-14 lead, but K-State held a 185-50 advantage in total yards the rest of the way. Oklahoma's last five drives ended in a fumble, three punts (one of them blocked) and an interception.

► The Sooners committed four turnovers on the day (K-State had none), and the Wildcats converted them into 14 points. KSU also scored a touchdown following its fourth-quarter blocked punt.

▶ Rattler finished the day 30 of 41 for a career-high 387 yards and four touchdowns, but was intercepted three times. Two of **Marvin Mims'** five catches went for touchdowns, and **Austin Stogner** and **Drake Stoops** each posted career highs in receptions and receiving yards. Stogner caught five passes for 83 yards, while Stoops had three receptions for 93 yards, one of them a 32-yarder for his first career score.

- McGowan led the Sooners in rushing for the second straight game, finishing with 73 yards on 13 carries.
- ► OU surrendered seven total points over the Wildcats' first seven possessions, but gave up 31 points over its last six. K-State managed just 98 yards in the first half and had just 107 with 6:35 left in the third quarter.

► Sixty-seven percent of Kansas State's offensive yards (267 of 400) came on five plays. It averaged just 2.9 yards on its other 46 plays.

LAST YEAR VS. IOWA STATE

► Oklahoma improved to 195-0 since 1937 when leading by at least 21 points at halftime but had to hang on to do it in a 42-41 win over Iowa State last year on Nov. 9. It was the 15th straight home victory for the Sooners, who were up 35-14 at half and 42-21 after three quarters but needed a **Parnell Motley** interception on a potential ISU gamewinning two-point conversion attempt with 24 seconds left in the contest.

▶ Iowa State held a 32:39-27:21 advantage in time of possession. The margin in the second half was 20:13 to 9:47.

► OU gained 499 yards against a Cyclones team that entered the game ranked second in the Big 12 by giving up just 347.8 per league outing. Quarterback **Jalen Hurts** accounted for five touchdowns in the first half and finished with 273 passing yards (18 for 26, three TDs, one interception) and 68 rushing yards (two scores).

► CeeDee Lamb finished with eight catches for 167 yards and two touchdowns (48-yarder in the first quarter and 63-yarder in the second). Kennedy Brooks registered his seventh career game of at least 100 rushing yards (second of the season) with a 15-carry, season-high 132-yard effort that included a 48-yard burst to give the Sooners a 42-21 lead with 3:47 left in the third quarter.

► Freshman **Trejan Bridges** caught OU's other touchdown pass, a 7-yarder in the second quarter.

Safety **Delarrin Turner-Yell** and linebacker **DaShaun** White (career high) led OU with nine tackles each.

YEAR TWO OF "SPEED D"

► Hired in January 2019, coordinator and safeties coach **Alex Grinch**, who was a 2019 Broyles Award semifinalist, oversaw major improvement on the defensive side of the ball last season.

Oklahoma ranked 17th nationally in opponent thirddown conversion percentage (32.2; in 2018 [before Grinch's arrival] it ranked 119th at 46.4), 17th in tackles for loss per game (7.4; in 2018 ranked 79th at 5.6), 32nd in rushing defense (134.1 ypg; in 2018 ranked 59th at 159.8), 34th in sacks per game (2.6; in 2018 ranked 49th at 2.1), 20th in stud defense (376.4 upp in 2010 ranked 49th at 2.1).

38th in total defense (356.4 ypg; in 2018 ranked 114th at 453.8), 58th in passing defense (222.4 ypg; in 2018 ranked 130th at 294.0) and 64th in scoring defense (27.3 ppg; in 2018 ranked 101st at 33.3).

▶ In Big 12 play, OU led the league in total defense (330.6 ypg) and passing defense (190.4 ypg), and ranked second in rushing defense (140.1 ypg), pass defense efficiency (125.7 rating) and third- and fourth-down conversion percentage (33.3 each).

▶ OU forced a punt on its opponent's first possession in 12 of 14 games.

► The Sooners allowed more than 6.0 yards per play just twice in their 14 games last season. In the 41 games from 2016-18, OU allowed at least 6.0 yards per play 20 times.

Seven of OU's top 10 tacklers last season were freshmen or sophomores. Three then-sophomore defenders (S Pat Fields, S Delarrin Turner-Yell and LB DaShaun White) started every game, and two others (DE Ronnie Perkins and DB Brendan Radley-Hiles) each started 13. Two then-redshirt freshmen (OLB Nik Bonitto [eight] and DL Jalen Redmond [three]) and two true freshmen (CB Jaden Davis and OLB David Ugwoegbu) each started at least one.

SNAKE IN THE GRASS

▶ Redshirt freshman **Spencer Rattler**, the consensus No. 1 quarterback in the 2019 recruiting class, threw for a state-record 11,083 yards (116 passing touchdowns) and ran for over 1,000 yards (14 TDs) in his career at Pinnacle High School in Phoenix, Ariz. The 2018 Elite 11 MVP was the No. 9 overall national recruit by 247Sports, No. 13 by Rivals and No. 29 by ESPN.

▶ Rattler appeared in three Oklahoma games last season, completing 7 of 11 passes for 81 yards and a touchdown without an interception. He also ran three times for 23 yards.

▶ Rattler is OU's fourth starting QB in four seasons. **Baker Mayfield** and **Kyler Murray** won the Heisman Trophy in 2017 and 2018, respectively, while **Jalen Hurts** was the 2019 Heisman runner-up.

► So far this season, Rattler ranks fourth nationally among quarterbacks who have played at least two games by averaging 338.5 passing yards per contest and with his 209.1 passing efficiency rating, and is tied for second with eight touchdown passes.

▶ In his starting debut in the season opener against Missouri State, Rattler completed 14 of 17 passes for 290 yards and four touchdowns (no interceptions) in only one half of work. He followed with 30-for-41 effort for 387 yards and four more TDs (three interceptions) against Kansas State. In the first half of play, he has completed 86.1% of his passes (31 of 36) for 471 yards and seven TDs.

YOUNG RUNNING BACKS ROOM

► Oklahoma, which has produced a Big 12-high six individual 1,000-yard-rushing seasons by running backs over the past five years (the next most in the league during that span is three) and has led the Big 12 in rushing offense in all three of **Lincoln Riley's** campaigns as head coach, is dividing its carries in 2020 among a largely inexperienced group.

▶ OU returned just 20.4% of its rushing yards and only 18.4% of its rushing touchdowns from last season.

JON-MICHAEL TERRY (R-SR., OLB) Human relations ▶ Senior **Rhamondre Stevenson** is OU's leading returning rusher, but has yet to play this season. He ran 64 times for 515 yards and six TDs in his debut season last year, and his 8.0 yards per rush led the nation among players with at least 50 carries.

► Junior **T.J. Pledger** carried 10 times for 65 yards and a score last season while redshirt freshman **Marcus Major** ran 10 times for 28 yards in his three contests. Pledger missed this year's opener against Missouri State before starting against Kansas State (41 yards on 13 carries). Major ran 11 times for 31 yards against Missouri State but did not play against KSU.

▶ Freshman **Seth McGowan** is a consensus four-star recruit who was rated as the nation's No. 13 running back by Rivals and No. 16 by 247Sports and ESPN after rushing for more than 3,700 yards and 45 touchdowns at Mesquite Poteet High School in Texas. He's led OU in rushing in both games this season (61 vs. Missouri State and 73 vs. Kansas State) and has a teamhigh three rushing TDs.

FOOT NOTE

▶ During Lincoln Riley's three-plus-year head coaching career, Oklahoma ranks second nationally with its 87.3% success rate on field goal attempts (55 for 63). The Sooners trail only Florida, which has converted 91.7% of its tries (55 for 60). TCU is the next best Big 12 school in the category (80.3%; 53 of 66).

► During the same period, the Sooners rank third nationally in PAT conversion percentage among teams with at least 150 attempts, converting 255 of 256 tries (99.6%). Only Georgia (178 for 178) and Utah State (170 for 170) have higher success rates.

HUMPHREY, BRKIC NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

► Redshirt junior center **Creed Humphrey** and redshirt sophomore kicker **Gabe Brkic** each landed multiple preseason All-America honors.

▶ Humphrey, from Shawnee, Okla., earned preseason first-team All-America honors from the Associated Press, Sporting News and the Walter Camp Foundation. The 2019 consensus second-team All-American and

first-team All-Big 12 pick was the Big 12 Co-Offensive Lineman of the Year and a finalist for the Rimington Trophy for the nation's top center after registering 98 knockdowns and not allowing a sack in his 864 plays. He has made 25 starts over the last two years, including in all 14 games in 2019. Humphrey anchored the middle of OU's O-line unit that won the Joe Moore Award in 2018 and was a semifinalist last season.

▶ Brkic, who hails from Chardon, Ohio, and was the only placekicker nationally who made all of his field goal and extra point tries in 2019 (69 for 69 combined), is a preseason first-team All-American by Sporting News and a second-team selection by the AP. A 2019 Lou Groza Award semifinalist and a second-team All-Big 12 pick, Brkic took over kicking duties prior to the Sooners' fourth game of the season and went 17 for 17 on field goal attempts and 52 for 52 on PATs to earn freshman All-America honors from the FWAA and The Athletic, and first-team All-America honors from CBS Sports. His 103 kicking points were the most by an FBS player without a miss since at least 1996.

LEAGUE-HIGH SIX SOONERS RECEIVE PRESEASON BIG 12 HONORS

A conference-high six Sooners received Big 12 preseason honors and five were named to the 2020 Preseason All-Big 12 Football Team that was selected by media who cover the league.

Redshirt junior wide receiver Charleston Rambo, redshirt junior offensive linemen Creed Humphrey and Adrian Ealy, junior defensive end Ronnie Perkins and redshirt sophomore placekicker Gabe Brkic were among the 29 players to earn preseason all-league recognition by position. Redshirt freshman quarterback Spencer Rattler was selected as the Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year.

► Oklahoma's six overall player selections were the most in the league while OU and Texas tied for the most honorees on the preseason team with five. OU's four offensive players were also more than any other school (Oklahoma State had three).

CAIN, MURRAY IN FIRST YEAR ON COACHING STAFF

► The season-opener vs. Missouri State marked the first game as Oklahoma assistants for outside linebackers and defensive ends coach **Jamar Cain** and running backs coach **DeMarco Murray**. The pair was hired in January.

► Cain arrived in Norman from Arizona State where he served the 2019 season as defensive line coach. He held the same title at Fresno State during the 2017-18 seasons and spent the 2014-16 campaigns at FCS powerhouse North Dakota State coaching the defensive ends. NDSU went 40-5 during his tenure and captured the 2014 and 2015 FCS National Championships under current Kansas State head coach **Chris Klieman**.

▶ Murray, who starred at running back for the Sooners from the 2007 through 2010 seasons and is OU's career leader in all-purpose yards and touchdowns, is in his second season as a collegiate coach. He served as running backs coach at Arizona in 2019. Murray enjoyed a decorated seven-year NFL career with the Dallas Cowboys, Philadelphia Eagles and Tennessee Titans (he was the 2014 NFL Offensive Player of the Year with Dallas) before serving a one-year stint as a TV analyst in the broadcast booth with FOX Sports.

NO. 1 ON BOTH SIDES OF THE BALL

► The 2019 season marked the first in the 24-year history of the Big 12 the Sooners led the conference in both total offense (526.9 ypg; next most was 462.8) and total defense (330.6 ypg; next fewest was 357.6) in league play. The only other team to do it was co-national champion Nebraska in 1997.

OU is the only program nationally that can boast four coaches who each registered at least 100 career wins (Bennie Owen, 122; Bud Wilkinson, 145; Barry Switzer, 157; Bob Stoops, 190). With 37 wins, current head coach Lincoln Riley is more than a third of the way to 100 victories after just 44 games, and owns the best winning percentage of the quintet.

"AIR RAID" A MISNOMER

► Fans and media have often referred to Oklahoma's offense under **Lincoln Riley** as the "Air Raid." The label is not exactly accurate, however, as the Sooners have rushed more than they've thrown in each of the five years since Riley arrived in Norman, and that's counting plays in which the quarterback was sacked as pass plays (officially they are recorded as rushes). OU's rushing play percentage was 52.6 in 2015, 57.7 in 2016, 53.1 in 2017, 54.7 in 2018 and 57.3 last season. This season has been different so far, with the Sooners running only 42.9 percent of the time.

RILEY'S FAST START

▶ The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach

(33) at the time of his hiring, Lincoln Riley became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a fouryear college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. At 24-4 and 36-6, he also holds the OU record for most wins by a head coach in his first two and first three seasons (**Barry Switze**r held the records of 21 and 32). No one in the last 125 years has won more games in their first three seasons as a college head coach (Penn's George Woodruff from 1892 to '94).

▶ Riley is one of just four FBS head coach since at least 1996 to win three conference titles in his first three years as a head coach. Marshall's Bob Pruett [1997-99], Miami's Larry Coker [2001-03] and Oregon's Chip Kelly [2009-11] also accomplished the feat.

OFFENSE HAS ROLLED UNDER RILEY

► Oklahoma owns the nation's most productive offense since the start of the 2015 season, which was **Lincoln Riley's** first year as OU's offensive coordinator. Riley still calls plays as head coach.

▶ Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in scoring (44.6 ppg; next most is 41.5), total offense (555.1; next most is 516.9), yards per play (7.8; next most is 6.9), touchdowns from scrimmage (393), pass efficiency rating (189.4; next best is 168.2) and yards per pass attempt (10.8), second in completion percentage (69.4), third in passing offense (325.1) and tied for ninth in rushing offense (229.9).

▶ In 70 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 51 times (next most is 41), including in 41 of the last 53 outings, topped the 600-yard mark on 25 occasions and gone over 700 yards seven times. Similarly, OU has scored at least 30 points in 62 of 70 games since Riley's arrival, at least 40 points 45 times, at least 50 points 25 times and at least 60 points eight times.

▶ The Sooners have registered at least 700 yards of offense 13 times in their history, and seven of those occasions have come since the start of the 2015 season: 854 at Texas Tech in 2016, 785 at Oklahoma State in 2017, 773 vs. Tulsa in 2015, 733 vs. South Dakota in 2019, 710 at Kansas in 2015, 702 vs. Kansas State in 2018 and 702 vs. Oklahoma State in 2018.

HEISMAN U

▶ Quarterbacks **Baker Mayfield** and **Kyler Murray** became Oklahoma's sixth and seventh Heisman Trophy winners in 2017 and '18, respectively, moving the Sooners into a tie with Notre Dame and Ohio State for the most Heisman winners. Other OU winners were QB **Sam Bradford** in 2008, QB **Jason White** in 2003, RB **Billy Sims** in 1978, RB **Steve Owens** in 1969 and RB **Billy Vessels** in 1952.

▶ Quarterback Jalen Hurts was the 2019 Heisman Trophy runner-up and became Oklahoma's 11th Heisman finalist, most of any school (finalists were first named in 1982). Miami (Fla.) ranks second with nine finalists, Alabama ranks third with eight and Florida ranks fourth with seven.

• Oklahoma boasts 10 Heisman finalists in the last 20 years (since 2000), which is four more than the program with the next most during that span (Alabama has six).

► OU is the first program to ever produce five Heisman finalists in a four-year period (Hurts, Murray in 2018 [won], Mayfield in 2017 [won] and Mayfield [finished third] and receiver **Dede Westbrook** [finished fourth] in 2016). With Mayfield's and Murray's wins, Oklahoma is the only program to produce different quarterback winners in consecutive seasons.

▶ OU is tied for the most Heisman runners-up, as well (six). OU's second-place Heisman finishers were **Kurt Burris** (1954), **Greg Pruitt** (1972), Sims (1979), **Josh Heupel** (2000), **Adrian Peterson** (2004) and Hurts (2019).

► Oklahoma has produced four Heisman Trophy winners in the last 17 years. Only three other programs have produced four winners ever.

An Oklahoma quarterback has finished in the top four of Heisman voting in each of **Lincoln Riley's** five years with the Sooners (Mayfield fourth in 2015, third in 2016 and first in 2017; Murray first in 2018; Hurts second in 2019).

RILEY SECURES ANOTHER TOP-10 RECRUITING CLASS

OU's 23-member 2020 recruiting class ranked No. 10 nationally by ESPN, giving the Sooners a fourth consecutive top-10 group. Eighteen signees ranked at least a four-star prospect on a five-star scale by 247Sports, ESPN or Rivals, while the other five earned consensus threestar designation.

The class is comprised of 12 offensive players and 11 defensive players. Ten signees enrolled at OU for the spring semester: defensive linemen Josh Ellison and Perrion Winfrey (both junior college products), cornerback D.J. Graham, safety Bryson Washington, linebacker Shane Whitter, tight end/Hback Mikey Henderson, running back Seth McGowan, wide receiver Marvin Mims and offensive linemen Noah Nelson and Andrew Raym.

OU TRIO ON HALL OF FAME BALLOT

The National Football Foundation (NFF) and College Hall of Fame announced the 2021 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame in June and former Oklahoma standouts **Bob Stoops**, **Josh Heupel** and **Roy Williams** earned spots among the seven coaches and 78 players listed from the Football Bowl Subdivision. The announcement of the class will be made in early 2021 and the class will be officially inducted on Dec. 7, 2021, in New York City.

OU's leader in all-time wins, Stoops coached the Sooners to a 190-48 (.798) record from 1999-2016 and captured 10 Big 12 championships and the 2000 national title.

Heupel was the quarterback on OU'S 2000 national championship team. He was a consensus All-American and Heisman Trophy runner-up that season.

Safety Roy Williams also starred on the 2000 squad. In 2001 he won the Nagurski Award (nation's best defensive player) and Thorpe Award (best defensive back), the same year he was a unanimous All-American.

FOUR NFL DRAFTEES; TWO IN FIRST ROUND

► Oklahoma had four players picked in the 2020 NFL Draft, and for the second straight year produced a pair of first-round selections. Wide receiver **CeeDee Lamb** (17th overall pick; Dallas) was the first Big 12 player selected, while linebacker **Kenneth Murray** (No. 23 overall pick; Los Angeles Chargers) was the first Big 12 defensive player chosen. The duo was joined in the draft by quarterback Jalen Hurts (second round; Philadelphia) and defensive lineman **Neville Gallimore** (third round; Dallas). Since 2000, 99 Sooners have been selected, which is 29 more than the next-closest Big 12 program during that span (Texas, 70) and 48 more than the second-closest (TCU, 51).

► Undrafted free agent cornerback **Parnell Motley**, who finished his collegiate career ranked fifth in OU history with 33 pass breakups, made the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' 53-man roster.

OKLAHOMA'S BIG 12 FIVE-PEAT

Oklahoma's 2019 Big 12 title marked the program's fifth straight league crown. The last time OU won at least five consecutive conference championships was 1972-80 under head coaches Chuck Fairbanks (1972) and Barry Switzer. ▶ OU is the only program to win at least three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (also from 2006-08). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

▶ OU's and Clemson's current streaks of five straight outright league championships are the longest among Power Five programs since Alabama won five in a row from 1971 to '75. The last current Power Five program to win six straight outright conference titles is Oklahoma (12 in a row from 1948 to '59).

BIG 12'S BELL COW

▶ Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed 13 league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each). All 13 of the Sooners' titles have come since the start of the 2000 campaign, with no other program during that span winning more than two. OU is 140-30 (.824) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2000 season. That's 24 more wins than the program with the next most victories during that period (Texas; 116-54) and 45 more than the program with the third most (Oklahoma State; 95-75).

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

▶ During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (665) than any other program (next most is 621 by Ohio State).

▶ Oklahoma is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 36,466 points (in 1,290 games).

▶ OU leads all FBS programs with 49 all-time conference championships. The rest of the top five includes Nebraska (46), Michigan (42), Ohio State (38) and USC (37). The Sooners' 13 league titles since 2000 are the most among Power Five programs (Ohio State ranks second with 10).

▶ No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 40 (including a nation-leading 17 since 2000). In addition, OU's 26 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

▶ Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (227) and points scored (10,863).

> Only Alabama (122) and Ohio State (105) have been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (101).

► The Sooners have made 421 all-time appearances in the AP poll's top five, more than any other program (Alabama is next with 415 and Ohio State third with 388). That means OU has been in the top five in 36 percent of all AP polls (1,172 total polls), which started in 1936. OU has made 26 AP top-5 appearances since the start of 2017.

- ▶ Only Ohio State (641) has more all-time top-10 AP poll appearances than OU (607).
- > Only Alabama (10) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

EXTRA POINTS

▶ OU defensive coordinator **Alex Grinch** and Iowa State head coach **Matt Campbell** were teammates at the University of Mount Union in Alliance, Ohio, from 1999 through 2001 and won NCAA Division III titles in 2000 and 2001 (Grinch also won one in 1998 and Campbell won another in 2002). Grinch was a safety under head coach Larry Kehres while Campbell was a defensive lineman.

Oklahoma has absolutely dominated the first quarter this season, outscoring Missouri State (31-0) and Kansas State (7-0) by a combined 38-0 margin. The Sooners limited the two opponents to 13 total yards on 24 plays (-0.5 average) in the opening 15 minutes. OU holds a 62-7 first-half scoring advantage and has given up just 135 yards on 47 plays (2.9 average) in the opening half of play.

Every Oklahoma freshman class since 1999 has won at least two Big 12 championships. Baylor's 2011, 2012 and 2013 freshman classes are the only other ones that have won two Big 12 titles (BU won league crowns in 2013 and '14).

▶ OU has ranked in the top seven nationally in total offense each of **Lincoln Riley's** five years calling plays and in the top three each of the last four seasons (7th in 2015 [530.2 ypg]; 2nd in 2016 [554.8]; 1st in 2017 [579.6]; 1st in 2018 [570.3]; and 3rd in 2019 [537.6]).

► Since Riley joined the OU program as offensive coordinator before the 2015 season, the Sooners rank third nationally by averaging 324.2 passing yards per game and lead the country in passing efficiency rating (189.8; next best is 168.1) and yards per pass attempt (10.8). During the same five-year span, OU paces the nation with eight individual 1,00-yard rushing seasons (**Samaje Perine** in 2015, Perine and **Joe Mixon** in 2016, **Rodney Anderson** in 2017, **Kennedy Brooks** and **Kyler Murray** in 2018 and Brooks and **Jalen Hurts** in 2019).

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

► Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.

▶ In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.

▶ The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).

▶ In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.

Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and 83,489 (2016). With this year's widening of aisles and some seats, capacity has dropped to 80,126.

▶ In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

▶ The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.

► The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.

▶ The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons also benefit from two new clubs.

Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.

All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.

The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

A significantly larger and more more detailed video board has replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The new board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

LINCOLN RILEY

FOURTH SEASON AS HEAD COACH • 37-7 RECORD (.841) • 2018 CO-BIG 12 COACH OF THE YEAR OWNS OU RECORDS FOR WINS IN DEBUT SEASON (12), FIRST TWO (24) & THREE (36) SEASONS DIRECTED SOONERS TO BIG 12 TITLES AND COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF BERTHS IN 2017, '18 & '19 WINNER OF 2015 BROYLES AWARD AS NATION'S TOP ASSISTANT COACH

fter presiding over two of the most prolific offenses in OU history as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2015 and 2016, Lincoln Riley took over the program's head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last quarter century in Bob Stoops. OU's 22nd head coach, all Riley has done in his first three years at the helm is lead the Sooners to their 11th, 12th and 13th Big 12 titles and to three College Football Playoff berths. He was also named the 2018 Co-Big 12 Coach of the Year.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, Riley became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. At 24-4 and 36-6, he also holds the OU record for most wins by a head coach in his first two and first three seasons (Barry Switzer held the records of 21 and 32). No one has won more games in their first three seasons as a college head coach since Penn's George Woodruff from 1892 to '94.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley, who continues to call Oklahoma's offensive plays as head coach, has made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing an explosive — and balanced — OU offense the last five seasons.

Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in scoring (44.6 ppg; next most is 41.5), total offense (555.1; next most is 516.9), yards per play (9.0), touchdowns from scrimmage (393), pass efficiency rating (189.4; next best is 168.2) and yards per pass attempt (10.8), second in completion percentage (69.4), third in passing offense (325.1) and ninth in rushing offense (229.9). With that kind of offensive production, it's no surprise the Sooners have posted a 59-11 (.843) record since his arrival (41-6 in Big 12 play). OU's overall mark since 2015 is fourth best nationally, with only Clemson (71-5), Alabama (67-6) and Ohio State (61-7) owning better records.

Individual player honors and accomplishments have poured in under Riley, highlighted by quarterbacks Baker Mayfield and Kyler Murray becoming OU's sixth and seventh Heisman Trophy winners in 2017 and 2018. QB Jalen Hurts was the 2019 Heisman runner-up. Mayfield also won the Maxwell, Davey O'Brien, Manning and Walter Camp Player of the Year Awards, was named AP Player of the Year and was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft. Murray also won the O'Brien and Manning Awards, was named AP Player of the Year and was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2019 NFL Draft. Receiver Dede Westbrook finished fourth in Heisman voting in 2016 and became OU's first winner of the Biletnikoff Award, while tight end Mark Andrews claimed the school's first Mackey Award in 2017. Eight Sooners have earned first-team All-America honors the last three years. Running back Joe Mixon set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose yards in 2016, while backfield mate Samaje Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only three seasons.

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after he caught the eye of Stoops during a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley's numbers at ECU made him the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offensive scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual school offensive records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season. He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent secondround NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in 2016).

In addition to overseeing Mayfield's and Murray's recordsetting careers, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 yards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.

NORMAN - Oklahoma outgained FCS foe Missouri State by 473 yards (608-135) and posted its first shutout since 2015 in a 48-0 season-opening win.

Redshirt freshman quarterback Spencer Rattler was stellar in his first career start, completing 14 of 17 passes for 290 yards and four touchdowns without an interception in just one half of work. He helped stake the Sooners to a 31-0 first-quarter lead and to a 41-0 halftime advantage, and was named Big 12 Rookie of the Week.

Rattler's 303.3 passing efficiency rating set OU and Big 12 freshman records, and he set school frosh standards for yards per completion (23.7) and yards per pass attempt (17.1). He became the second OU freshman QB in his starting debut (Sam Bradford) with two TD passes of at least 50 yards (58 to freshman Marvin Mims and 53 to redshirt junior Charleston Rambo). Mims finished with 80 receiving yards and 68 punt return yards, good for 148 all-purpose yards, second most by an OU freshman in a career debut. Fellow true freshman Seth McGowan paced the Sooners with 61 rushing yards on 11 carries and tallied a 1-yard TD run and a 37-yard TD reception.

Oklahoma started the game with seven straight three-and-outs on defense and seven straight scores on offense. It held MSU to seven first downs and forced nine punts. Junior safety Delarrin Turner-Yell registered his first career interception in the third quarter and returned it 42 yards.

Redshirt senior kicker Stephen Johnson, who played in place of preseason All-American Gabe Brkic, was named Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week after making both of his field goal attempts (42 and 22 yards) and all five of his PAT tries.

NORMAN - Oklahoma outgained Kansas State by 117 yards (517-400), had 28 first downs to the Wildcats' 10 and held KSU to a 2-for-11 performance on third downs, but was outscored 17-0 in the fourth guarter in a 38-35 home loss.

The Sooners held leads of 28-7 and 35-14, but four turnovers and a fourth quarter that included a blocked punt, two more punts and an interception spelled doom for OU. K-State became the first program since 2013 and '14 to post wins in consecutive seasons over the Sooners.

Quarterback Spencer Rattler completed 30 of 41 passes on the day for a career-high 387 yards and four touchdowns against three interceptions. He became only the fourth OU guarterback to throw at least eight TD passes in his first two career starts, joining Josh Heupel in 1999 (eight), Sam Bradford in 2007 (eight) and Landry Jones in 2009 (nine).

Rattler threw touchdown passes to freshman Marvin Mims (11 and 9 yards), redshirt sophomore Drake Stoops (32 yards; first of his career) and Jeremiah Hall (21 yards) to give OU a 28-7 with 6:35 to go in the third quarter. The Sooners pushed their lead to 35-14 when freshman Seth McGowan registered a 5-yard TD run with 2:46 to go in the third. But the Wildcats scored the game's final 24 points, knotting the score with 8:17 left and taking the lead on a 50-yard field goal with 4:32 remaining.
