OPENING KICK

► No. 7/7 Oklahoma (1-0) plays its second game of the **Brent Venables** era when it hosts Kent State (0-1) on Saturday at 6 p.m. CT at Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium in Norman. The "Stripe the Stadium" game will be televised by ESPN+ with **Mike Morgan**, **Ryan Leaf** and **Alex Chappelle** announcing.

► Saturday's matchup will mark the first between the two programs.

► Oklahoma has won its last 10 home games and 28 of its last 29.

► The game will mark the 1,313th in OU history. The Sooners rank fifth in college football annals with their .728 all-time winning percentage (928-331-53). They trail Ohio State (.732), Alabama (.731), Notre Dame (.729) and Michigan (.729). Since the end of World War II (1946 season to present), OU leads all programs with 685 wins (38 more than Alabama, the program with the next most) and with its .771 winning percentage. The Sooners also lead the country with their 240 wins since the start of the 2000 season.

► Oklahoma is 26-3 all-time as the No. 7-ranked team in the AP poll (14-1 at home). Its last home game as the AP's No. 7 team was the 2018 season opener against Florida Atlantic, a 63-14 win. OU's only home defeat as the AP's seventh-ranked team came to TCU in 2005, 17-10.

► OU was ranked No. 9 in the preseason AP poll, marking the 23rd straight year it was ranked by the AP to start the season. The Sooners have been ranked 10th or better in 20 of the last 22 preseason polls. They have also ended each of the last seven seasons ranked in the AP top 10, its first time to accomplish the feat since 1971-80 under head coaches **Chuck Fairbanks** and **Barry Switzer**.

► The Sooners are coming off a 45-13 season-opening home win over UTEP on Saturday, a game in which they led 21-0 with 6:43 left in the first quarter after scoring on their first three possessions. **Dillon Gabriel** threw for 233 yards and two touchdowns (no interceptions) and ran for a 12-yard score. **Eric Gray** rushed for a game-high 102 yards while **Marcus Major** ran for 54 and two TDs. **Brayden Willis** caught both TD passes and **Reggie Grimes** logged a career-high 2.5 sacks as OU held the Miners to 28 rushing yards on 31 carries.

► Kent State opened its season with a 45-20 loss at Washington on Saturday. The Golden Flashes, who are under fifth-year head coach **Sean Lewis**, were outgained 525 yards to 340 and by an average of 6.7 yards per play to 5.0. Quarterback **Collin Schlee** completed 12 of 24 passes for 178 yards and a touchdown (two interceptions). He also ran for 47 yards. Receiver **Dante Cephas** caught six passes for a game-high 105 yards.



Junior defensive end Reggie Grimes registered a career-high 2.5 sacks in Saturday's opener against UTEP and added a forced fumble and a QB hurry. Grimes entered the season with 3.0 career sacks (2.0 last year). The Sooners held the Miners to 28 rushing yards (fewest by an opponent since 2014) on 31 carries.

HURRY UP AND GO

OU's 21:27 time of possession Saturday against UTEP was the nation's second-lowest through one game played. Among the 5 teams with the lowest TOP, the Sooners' 45 points were 7 more than the team with next most.

KEY STORYLINES

► Oklahoma has never faced Kent State in football. The Sooners are 3-0 against teams currently in the Mid-American Conference, with all three games played under former head coach **Bob Stoops** in Norman. OU was ranked No. 2 when it beat Bowling Green 40-24 in the 2004 season opener and Ball State 62-6 in 2011. In 2015, the No. 19 Sooners downed Akron 41-3 to start the season.

► Kent State was picked by league coaches to win the Mid-American Conference East Division this season. Last year, the Golden Flashes posted a 7-7 record and went 6-2 in conference play before falling to Northern Illinois in the MAC Championship (41-23) and to Wyoming in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl (52-38). KSU set program records last season for offensive yards (6,907), first downs (362), rushing yards (3,482) and passing yards (3,425). It returned its top rusher (**Marquez Cooper**; 241 carries for 1,205 yards and 11 TDs) and top receiver (**Dante Cephas**; 82 receptions for 1,240 yards and nine TDs). Redshirt sophomore quarterback **Collin Schlee** is in his first year as the starter. Last year, he completed 17 of 24 passes (no interceptions) for 238 yards and a score.

► Saturday's game is the second of a challenging four-game Kent State non-conference schedule that includes Washington, LIU and reigning national champion Georgia.

► OU's hurry-up offense under coordinator **Jeff Lebby** was on full display in the season opener against UTEP. The Sooners possessed the ball for just 21:27, the second-lowest figure nationally through one game played. Despite the low possession time, OU ranked 34th nationally last week (there are 128 FBS teams) with its 492 yards. It averaged 8.1 yards per play. Lebby served as Mississippi's offensive coordinator the last two years. Last season, the Rebels ranked 122nd out of 130 teams with their 27:19 average time of possession and in 2020 ranked 105th out of 127 teams (27:51).

► With UCF transfer **Dillon Gabriel** taking the reins of the OU offense, the Sooners debuted a new starting quarterback in the season opener for the fifth time in the last six years (**Baker Mayfield** in 2017, **Kyler Murray** in 2018, **Jalen Hurts** in 2019 and **Spencer Rattler** in 2020 and '21). Despite missing UCF's final 10 games last season due to injury, Gabriel ranks third in the nation since the start of the 2019 season with his 72 touchdown throws. In his 27-game career (he has started his last 26 games), he has completed 60.8% of his passes for 8,270 yards while rushing for 392 yards and nine TDs. He has thrown at least one touchdown pass in all 27 games, at least two in 21 contests and at least four in seven outings.

► Forty-seven of OU's 115 players (41%) are new to the program this season, while 60 players (52%) had never played in a game for the Sooners prior to last Saturday. Of the 47 new players, 23 are on offense, 21 are on defense and three are special-teamers (one kicker, one punter and one long snapper).

RECAPPING THE WIN OVER UTEP

► Oklahoma made **Brent Venable's** first game as a head coach a memorable one as it raced to a 21-0 lead in the first 8:17 and beat UTEP 45-13. The Sooners outgained the Miners by 176 yards (492-316) and showcased a balanced offensive attack with 259 rushing yards and 233 passing yards.

► OU operated quickly and efficiently in the first quarter, scoring touchdowns on its first three possessions. The drives covered 75 yards on five plays (1:17 time of possession), 93 yards on six plays (1:48) and 55 yards in two plays (0:30). Through the first quarter, the Sooners averaged 17.6 yards per play to UTEP's 3.6.

► OU's run defense was stout, allowing the Miners just 28 yards on 31 carries (0.9 average). The 28 yards allowed were the Sooners' fewest since a 2014 game against Kansas when they gave up just 19.

► In his OU debut, redshirt junior quarterback **Dillon Gabriel** completed 15 of 23 passes (65.2%) for 233 yards and two touchdowns. He also rushed six times for 20 yards and scored on a 12-yard burst for the game's first points.

► Redshirt senior tight end **Brayden Willis** caught both of Gabriel's touchdown throws, scoring from six yards on OU's second possession and from 28 yards with 55 seconds left in the second quarter to give OU a 28-10 lead. It marked Willis' first-career multiple-touchdown game.

► Junior receiver **Marvin Mims Jr.** paced the Sooners with 81 yards on three catches. Redshirt junior **Theo Wease** returned to a starting role after missing all but one game last year due to injury and finished with three receptions for 37 yards, including a 33-yarder. Willis' four catches went for 40 yards.

► Senior **Eric Gray** rushed a team-high 16 times for 102 yards, marking his sixth-career 100-yard game on the ground and first as a Sooner. He averaged 6.4 yards per carry and registered a long of 35. Redshirt junior **Marcus Major** ran seven times for 54 yards (7.7 average) and scored from one and six yards in the third quarter.

► On his second-career play and first touch, freshman receiver **Gavin Freeman** scored on a 46-yard end-around rush in which he broke multiple tackles to give the Sooners a 21-0 lead. Freeman's dad, Jason, was an OU tight end from 1995-98.

► Sophomore safety **Billy Bowman** and sophomore linebacker **Danny Stutsman** led OU with nine tackles apiece, career highs for both. Each also registered two pass breakups while, Stutsman, who made his first career start, also logged a QB hurry. Bowman also made his kickoff returning debut, registering runbacks of 25 and 26 yards.

► Junior defensive end **Reggie Grimes** finished with a career-high 2.5 sacks, which is more than he had all of last season (2.0). He also forced a fumble and had a QB hurry.

► Freshman cornerback **Gentry Williams** recorded an interception in the end zone on UTEP's final possession. It was the only takeaway for either team on the day.

► OU registered six passing plays of at least 15 yards (five of at least 24) and seven rushing plays of at least 10 yards.

► Serving as OU's primary placekicker for the first time, redshirt sophomore **Zach Schmit** converted his lone field goal attempt (22-yarder) and all six of his PAT tries.

► OU possessed the ball for just 21:27 out of 60 minutes.

NOTING THE NEWBIES

► Twenty-four players and 21 first-year Sooners made their first appearance in an OU uniform Saturday. The 21 newcomers were redshirt seniors **Jeffery Johnson** (DL), **C.J. Colderon** (DB) and **Jonah Lulu** (DL), senior **Trey Morrison** (DB), redshirt juniors **Davis Beville** (QB), **Dillon Gabriel** (QB) and **McKade Mettauer** (OL), redshirt sophomores **LV Bunkley-Shelton** (WR), **Tyler Guyton** (OL) and **J.J. Hester** (WR), sophomore **Tawee Walker** (RB) and freshmen **Jovantae Barnes** (RB), **Gavin Freeman** (WR), **Jayden Gibson** (WR), **Gracen Halton** (DL), **Jaren Kanak** (LB), **Jason Llewellyn** (TE), **Jacob Sexton** (OL), **Jake Taylor** (OL), **R Mason Thomas** (DL) and **Gentry Williams** (DB).

FIRST-TIME STARTERS

► Seven players made their first OU starts on Saturday. They were redshirt senior transfer **Jeffery Johnson** (DL; started 44 games at Tulane), redshirt senior **Jordan Kelley** (DL), redshirt junior transfers **Dillon Gabriel** (QB; started 25 games at UCF) and **McKade Mettauer** (OL; started 28 games at Cal), redshirt sophomore transfer **Tyler Guyton** (OL; started one game at TCU as an H-back) and sophomores **Ethan Downs** (DE) and **Danny Stutsman** (LB).

BALANCED OFFENSE NOTHING NEW

► Oklahoma totaled 259 rushing yards and 233 passing yards in its season-opening win over UTEP. It was the 47th time in 93 games since the start of the 2015 season the Sooners have gained at least 200 rushing yards and 200 passing yards in a game (51% of its games over the last seven-plus seasons). It was also the 36th time in the same span that OU has rushed for at least 250 yards.

► Running a balanced offense has also been common for first-year offensive coordinator **Leff Lebby**. In his three previous years as an offensive coordinator at Ole Miss (2020-21) and UCF (2019), Lebby's offenses totaled at least 200 passing yards and 200 rushing yards 15 times in 36 games.

HOME IS WHERE THE "W" IS

► Oklahoma is 131-11 (.923) at Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since the start of the 1999 season, giving the Sooners three more Big 12 championships over the last 23 years (14) than home defeats. It is the best home winning percentage among Power Five schools over the last 23 seasons (Ohio State is next at .893). OU has outscored its opponents by an average of 43-17 in those games.

► The Sooners have posted 141 straight sellouts of originally scheduled home games dating back to the start of the 1999 season (**Bob Stoops'** first as head coach). Only Nebraska (FBS-record 382) has a longer current streak.

► OU has recorded 41 unbeaten seasons at home, including 15 in the last 23 years.

OU RANKED NINTH IN PRESEASON POLLS

► Oklahoma was ranked No. 9 in both the Associated Press preseason top 25 and the preseason USA Today Sports AFCA Coaches Poll. It marked the 20th time in the last 22 years that OU has been ranked in the AP preseason top 10.

► This is the 23rd straight year that OU has appeared in the preseason AP Top 25, which is the second-longest current streak behind Ohio State (34). It also represents the 64th time that Oklahoma has appeared in the preseason AP poll, second most behind Ohio State (69 times).

► OU's all-time average preseason AP rank is 6.6, best in the nation (Alabama is second at 7.2).

► Of its 64 appearances in the AP preseason poll, Oklahoma has been ranked ninth or higher 48 times. That has occurred in 19 of the last 22 preseason polls. This is the seventh straight year OU has been ranked in the top 10 of the preseason AP poll.

► OU finished in the AP's top 10 each of the last seven seasons, and ended the 2021 campaign ranked 10th.

VENABLES NAMED OU'S 23RD HEAD COACH

► A former 13-year Oklahoma assistant coach who won a national championship with the Sooners and two more with Clemson during an ultra-successful 10-year stint as defensive coordinator, **Brent Venables** was named OU's 23rd head football coach Dec. 5. The 51-year-old Venables served as co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at OU from 1999-2003 and as associate head coach, defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 2004-11 under former head coach **Bob Stoops**. Venables has coached in eight national championship games between his time at OU and Clemson, winning titles with the Sooners in 2000 and Tigers in 2016 and 2018.

► In 26 years as a full-time assistant coach, Venables' teams posted 26 winning seasons, won 13 conference titles, went to 30 bowl games (includes four College Football Playoff National Championship games) and won at least 10 games 21 times.

► Over the last 10 seasons at Clemson (excluding the 2021 Cheez-It Bowl, in which Venables did not coach), the Tigers ranked first nationally in sacks (445; next most is 392), tackles for loss (1,147) and opponent third-down conversion percentage (30.2%), second in opponent pass efficiency rating (111.1) and takeaways (244; tied), third in scoring defense (17.8 ppg) and opponent completion percentage (53.3), fourth in total defense (311.4 ypg) and pass defense (190.5 ypg), fifth in interceptions (148) and sixth in rushing defense (120.9 ypg). They won conference titles each year from 2015-20.

MOST APPEARANCES IN THE PRESEASON AP POLL

Oklahoma's 64 all-time preseason AP top-25 appearances rank second nationally (Ohio State leads with 69). The Sooners pace the country with their 52 preseason AP top-10 appearances (five more than the Buckeyes).

► From 1999-2011, Venables helped Oklahoma to the 2000 national championship, three other national championship game appearances (2003, '04 and '08) and seven Big 12 titles.

► Venables has received national accolades for his coaching and recruiting. He received the Frank Broyles Award in 2016 as the nation's top assistant coach after being named a finalist in 2015 and also in 2006 when the Sooners led the Big 12 in total defense and scoring defense. He was named FootballScoop's Defensive Coordinator of the Year in 2014 and Rivals.com's Recruiter of the Year in 2015.

MARVELOUS MARVIN

► Junior wide receiver **Marvin Mims Jr.** has made 13 career receptions of at least 40 yards (registered a 42-yard catch in the season opener against UTEP). **CeeDee Lamb** (2017-19) holds the school record with 24 receptions of 40 or more yards.

► Mims led the Sooners in receiving yards each of his first two seasons. He has made 72 receptions for 1,396 yards and 14 touchdowns and rushed three times for 32 yards in 25 games (13 starts). He has also returned 25 punts for 248 yards (9.92 average) and three kickoffs for 70 yards (23.3 average).

► Mims registered 32 receptions for 705 yards and five TDs as a sophomore last season. As a freshman in 2020, he led the team with 610 yards and nine touchdowns on 37 receptions. His nine TD catches tied for most in the Big 12, matched the Big 12 record for a true freshman and established a new OU freshman record. He also became the first Oklahoma wide receiver to earn FWAA Freshman All-America honors, and was a second-team All-Big 12 selection by the league's coaches and media.

► Mims set the Texas high school state record for receiving yards in a career (5,485) and in a season (2,629 to go along with 32 touchdowns on 117 catches as a senior). He played at Lone Star High School in the city of Frisco.

TURK'S KEY LEG

► Ray Guy Award semifinalist **Michael Turk** did things last season that no other punter in program history had. In his first year at OU, Turk set a single-season record by averaging 51.2 yards per punt, smashing the previous record of 47.8 yards by **Jack Jacobs** in 1940. In fact, entering 2021, the NCAA single-season record for punting average (min. 30 punts) was 51.0 by Texas A&M's Braden Mann in 2018. Turk surpassed that figure in 2021, but at 51.17 yards per punt he finished just behind San Diego State's Matt Araiza, who averaged 51.19 yards per punt on the year.

► Twenty of Turk's 35 punts in 2021 (57.1%) went at least 50 yards, and eight went at least 60. His 85-yarder vs. Texas was the FBS' second longest of the season and tied for the fourth longest over the last 10 years, and tied for the third longest in Oklahoma history.

► Turk holds five of the top 14 single-game punting averages (min. three punts) in OU annals, including the best and third-best marks (59.7 vs. TCU and 58.0 vs. Texas).

► Turk transferred to Oklahoma from Arizona State in August 2021 and promptly earned the starting job. No other punter played for the Sooners last season.

► The 2019 and '20 first-team All-Pac-12 selection averaged 46.2 yards per punt over the last two seasons at ASU and totaled 28 boots that went at least 50 yards. In 2019, he set the FBS single-game record by averaging 63.0 yards (on five punts) vs. Kent State in the season opener.

► Combining his time at ASU and OU, Turk is averaging 45.9 yards per punt (8,397 yards on 183 punts). The FBS career record (min. 150 punts) is 46.3 yards by West Virginia's Todd Sauerbrun (1991-94).

FORMER SOONERS ON STAFF

► First-year OU head coach **Brent Venables** has placed an emphasis on making alumni feel welcome around the program, and turned to several former Sooners to fill his first staff at Oklahoma.

► In addition to assistant coaches **Joe Jon Finley** (2004-07), **Brandon Hall** (1998-00), **Jeff Lebby** (2002-06) and **DeMarco Murray** (2007-10), several other former players hold staff positions as analysts, graduate assistants and as part of OU football's SOUL Mission program.

► Former linebackers **Lance Mitchell** (2002-04) and **Rufus Alexander** (2003-06) are defensive analysts while former offensive linemen **Jon Cooper** (2005-08) and **Phil Loadholt** (2007-08) serve as offensive analysts. Former quarterback **Tanner Schafer** (2016-21) and offensive lineman **Clayton Woods** (2018-19) are offensive graduate assistants.

► Former running back and receiver **Josh Norman** (1998-01) and linebackers **Caleb Kelly** (2016-21) and **Curtis Lofton** (2005-07) work with SOUL Mission (Serving Our Uncommon Legacy). SOUL Mission is dedicated to helping OU football student-athletes develop in all aspects of their lives. Five SOUL Mission pillars target every facet of off-the-field enhancement of OU's football student-athletes: civic engagement, life skills, career development/job placement, personal growth and former player development.

RECORD SPRING GAME CROWD

► Oklahoma's April 23 spring game drew a crowd of 75,360, setting a record for the event. The attendance figure was more than 20,000 higher than the previous OU spring game record and led the nation's 2022 spring games, according to 247Sports (Georgia was second at 68,002, Penn State third at 62,000, Ohio State fourth at 60,007 and Nebraska fifth at 54,357).

SEVEN 2022 NFL DRAFTTEES

► Oklahoma had seven players picked in the 2022 NFL Draft, tied for its second most since the 2005 season. Its first four selections were defensive players, the first time for that feat since 1984. Outside linebacker **Nik Bonitto** was selected in the second round by the Denver Broncos. He was followed by linebacker **Brian Asamoah** in the third round (Minnesota Vikings), defensive lineman **Perrior Winfrey** in the fourth round (Cleveland Browns), safety **Delarrin Turner-Yell** in the fifth round (Denver), wide receiver **Michael Woods II** in the sixth round (Cleveland), defensive end **Isaiah Thomas** in the seventh round (Cleveland) and offensive lineman **Marquis Hayes** in the seventh round (Arizona Cardinals). Since 2000, 111 Sooners have been selected, which is 36 more than the next-closest Big 12 program during that span (Texas, 75).

**STOOPS INDUCTED INTO COLLEGE HALL
OF FAME, WILLIAMS ON DECK**

► The owner of the most wins in Oklahoma football history and engineer of 10 Big 12 Conference titles and the 2000 national championship, **Bob Stoops** was inducted into the National Football Foundation (NFF) and College Hall of Fame on Dec. 7 in his first year of eligibility. Stoops posted a 190-48 (.798) record at Oklahoma and coached the Sooners to a school-record 18 consecutive bowl berths. He was the only coach in the BCS era to win the Fiesta Bowl, Orange Bowl, Rose Bowl, Sugar Bowl and the national championship, and accumulated more victories over the first 18 seasons of a head coaching career than anyone in the game's history.

► One of his star pupils, defensive back **Roy Williams** will join Stoops in the Hall when he is inducted Dec. 6, 2022. Williams, who helped OU to the 2000 national title as a redshirt sophomore, was a unanimous All-American in 2001 who won the Nagurski (nation's top defender) and Thorpe (top defensive back) awards. He was also named Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year and finished seventh in Heisman Trophy voting, the highest finish of the year by a non-quarterback. He ended the year with 107 tackles, 14 tackles for loss, five interceptions, 22 pass breakups and three fumble recoveries.

RECAPING 2021: 11-WIN SEASON AND ALAMO BOWL VICTORY

► Oklahoma saw its six-year streak of Big 12 championships snapped in 2021, but still finished 11-2 overall, beat No. 15 Oregon 47-32 in the Valero Alamo Bowl and finished No. 10 in the AP and coaches polls (seventh straight year finishing in the top 10 of both). It was its seventh consecutive season to lose only two games.

► OU's losses came in conference road games. After starting the year 9-0, the Sooners dropped a 27-14 contest at No. 18 Baylor on Nov. 13 and a 37-33 game at No. 7 Oklahoma State on Nov. 27. The 11 victories marked OU's 41st season with at least 10 wins (tied with Alabama for the most in the country) and nation-leading 27th with at least 11 victories.

► **Bob Stoops** took over interim head coaching duties following the departure of **Lincoln Riley** on Nov. 28. Stoops, who retired from an 18-year Oklahoma head coaching career in June 2017, directed the Sooners to the Alamo Bowl victory, upping his school-record win total to 191 (against just 48 losses). The Alamo Bowl marked the Sooners' 23rd consecutive bowl appearance, by far the longest streak in school history (the previous record was eight from the 1975-82 seasons under **Barry Switzer**). OU's 564 total yards against the Ducks (322 rushing, 242 passing) were its third-most ever in a bowl game (trailing only the 1991 Gator Bowl vs. Virginia [618 yards] and the 2020 Cotton Bowl vs. Florida [684 yards]). Its 47 points were its sixth-most ever in a bowl game (OU has scored 48 points in four bowl games and finished with 55 in the 2020 Cotton Bowl).

► Oklahoma led the nation with its 96.8% score rate in the red zone (60 scores on 62 trips) in 2021. Forty-seven of its 60 red-zone scores (75.8%) were touchdowns, good for the highest percentage among Power 5 teams. The Sooners, who ranked eighth nationally with their 39.1 points per game, posted a streak of 44 consecutive red-zone conversions.

► Running back **Kennedy Brooks** rushed for 1,253 yards on the year, becoming one of just four Sooners to compile three separate seasons of 1,000 rushing yards. He finished his career with 3,320 rushing yards, and his 7.03 yards per carry tied for second in program history among players with at least 2,000 career rushing yards. Brooks was named Alamo Bowl Most Outstanding Offensive Player after running for 142 yards and three touchdowns.

► Defensively, OU tied for the national lead with its 21 forced fumbles and 1.62 forced fumbles per game. Outside linebacker **Nik Bonitto**, who was named Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year by PFF, earned third-team AP All-America honors after finishing with 39 tackles, 7.0 sacks and team highs of 15.0 tackles for loss, nine QB hurries and three fumble recoveries (tied for third most nationally) in 12 regular season games (all starts). He also forced a fumble.

VENABLES' TOP-10 2022 CLASS COMPRISED OF 21

Head coach Brent Venables' first Oklahoma recruiting class featured 21 scholarship players — 16 during the December signing period and five more in February. The class ranked No. 8 nationally by 247Sports, On3 and Rivals, and No. 9 by ESPN. OU's class ranked fifth best nationally by On3 in terms of average player ranking.

Of the 21 signees, 19 were ranked as four-star prospects on a five-star scale by 247Sports, ESPN, On3 or Rivals, while two others received three-star designation from at least one of those outlets.

All 21 signees were high schoolers and hail from eight states: six from Texas, four each from Oklahoma and Florida, two each from California and Nevada, and one each from Colorado, Kansas and Nebraska.

Nine members of the signing class are classified as offensive players and 12 as defensive players.

Ten of the Sooners' signees enrolled at OU for the spring semester and participated in team activities. They were receivers Nic Anderson and Jayden Gibson, running back Jovantae Barnes, quarterback Nick Evers, tight ends Kaden Helms and Jason Llewellyn, linebackers Jaren Kanak, Kip Lewis and Kobie McKinzie and defensive back Robert Spears-Jennings.

► Kicker **Gabe Brkic** was one of three 2021 Lou Groza Award finalists. He made 20 of 26 field goal attempts on the season and tied for the national lead with five conversions from at least 50 yards (on seven attempts). He tied an FBS single-game record with three field goal makes of at least 50 yards (51, 56 and 55) in the season opener vs. Tulane. Brkic ranks second in OU history with his 82.6% field goal conversion rate (57 for 69) and made 99.4% of his PAT tries (159 for 160). He owns OU records for field goals of at least 50 yards (10; his nine over the 2020 and 2021 seasons tied for the national lead) and at least 40 yards (20).

► Oklahoma set the single-season school record with six wins by seven or fewer points (previous record was five in 2010 and 2019).

► OU's bowl appearance was its 55th all-time, fourth most nationally. It improved to 31-23-1 (.573) in bowl games, tied for the fourth most wins.

► The Sooners only punted 36 times in their 13 games, an average of 2.8 per contest (fourth-lowest in the country).

► Nine Sooners earned first- or second-team All-Big 12 honors. First-team picks were Turk and tight end/H-back **Jeremiah Hall**, while second-team honorees were linebacker **Brian Asamoah**, outside linebacker Bonitto, Brkic, offensive lineman **Marquis Hayes**, defensive linemen **Isaiah Thomas** and **Perrior Winfrey**, and safety **Delarrin Turner-Yell**.

► A program-record 31 Sooners were named to the Academic All-Big 12 Team, including offensive lineman Hayes, linebacker **Bryan Mead**, kicker **Zach Schmit**, quarterback **Tanner Schafer** and wide receiver **Devin Staton**, who were five of the 11 league players honored for a 4.0 GPA.

HEISMAN U

► Quarterbacks **Baker Mayfield** and **Kyler Murray** became Oklahoma's sixth and seventh Heisman Trophy winners in 2017 and '18, respectively, moving the Sooners into a tie with Notre Dame and Ohio State for the most Heisman winners. Other OU winners were QB **Sam Bradford** in 2008, QB **Jason White** in 2003, RB **Billy Sims** in 1978, RB **Steve Owens** in 1969 and RB **Billy Vessels** in 1952.

► Quarterback **Jalen Hurts** was the 2019 Heisman Trophy runner-up and became Oklahoma's 11th Heisman finalist, tied with Alabama for most of any school (finalists were first named in 1982). Miami (Fla.) ranks third with nine finalists, Florida ranks fourth with eight and Ohio State ranks fifth with seven.

► OU boasts a nation-leading 10 Heisman finalists in the last 21 years (since 2000). Alabama ranks second with nine while Ohio State and Stanford rank third with five each.

► Oklahoma is the only program to ever produce five Heisman finalists in a four-year period (Hurts in 2019 [runner-up], Murray in 2018 [won], Mayfield in 2017 [won] and Mayfield [finished third] and receiver **Dede Westbrook** [finished fourth] in 2016). With Mayfield's and Murray's wins, OU is the only program to produce different quarterback winners in consecutive seasons.

► OU is tied for the most Heisman runners-up, as well (six). OU's second-place Heisman finishers were **Kurt Burris** (1954), **Greg Pruitt** (1972), Sims (1979), **Josh Heupel** (2000), **Adrian Peterson** (2004) and Hurts (2019).

► Oklahoma has produced four Heisman Trophy winners in the last 19 years. Only four other programs have produced four winners ever (Notre Dame and Ohio State seven, USC six and Alabama four).

► An OU quarterback finished in the top four of Heisman voting in five consecutive years (Mayfield fourth in 2015, third in 2016 and first in 2017; Murray first in 2018; Hurts second in 2019).

OU'S BIG 12 DOMINATION

► Oklahoma's win over Iowa State in the 2020 Big 12 Championship resulted in the Sooners' sixth straight Big 12 title and 14th since 2000 (no other program has won more than two during the span). For perspective, the two Power Five programs with the next most conference titles this millennium are Ohio State (11 in Big Ten) and Oregon (eight in Pac-10/Pac-12).

► OU's 14 Big 12 titles are 11 more than the program with the next most. Baylor and Texas have each won three Big 12 championships and are followed by Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each). Colorado and Nebraska left the Big 12 after the 2010 season and Texas A&M departed after the 2011 campaign.

► Since 2010, OU has won eight Big 12 titles and is followed by Baylor (three) and Kansas State, Oklahoma State and TCU (one each).

► Since 2000, OU has won more Big 12 championships (14) than it has lost home games (11).

► Oklahoma is 54-8 (.871) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2015 season. Oklahoma State ranks second during that period (.42-21; .667), West Virginia third (.33-29; .532), TCU fourth (.33-30; .524) and Texas fifth (.32-30; .516).

► Oklahoma is the only program to win at least three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (2006-08 and 2015-20). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

► At 11-1, the Sooners are the only program with a winning record in Big 12 Championship games. Texas (3-3) and Baylor (1-1) have the next best marks.

► Over the last seven years, OU has posted a 54-8 (.844) record in regular season Big 12 play. The next best mark during the stretch is 42-21 (.667) by Oklahoma State.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (685) than any other program (next most is 647 by Alabama).

► OU has finished in the top 5 of the AP poll a nation-leading 33 times.

► OU leads all FBS programs with 50 all-time conference championships. The rest of the top five includes Nebraska

CALMUS, HEUPEL, SELMON ON COLLEGE HALL OF FAME BALLOT

The National Football Foundation (NFF) and College Hall of Fame announced the 2023 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame on June 6 and former University of Oklahoma standouts Rocky Calmus, Josh Heupel and Dewey Selmon earned spots among the 80 players listed on the College Hall of Fame from the Football Bowl Subdivision.

One of the nation's top defenders during OU's return to prominence at the beginning of head coach Bob Stoops' tenure, Calmus defined his position. The linebacker earned AP Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year and first-team All-America honors in 2000, won the Butkus Award as the nation's top linebacker as a senior in 2001 and was a finalist for the Nagurski and Bednarik Awards (given to the nation's best defender) and the Lombardi Award (country's top interior player).

The runner-up for the 2000 Heisman Trophy, Josh Heupel became Oklahoma's first consensus All-America quarterback and the first Sooners signal-caller to earn All-America honors since Jack Mildren in 1971. A junior college transfer, Heupel was one of Bob Stoops' first OU recruits and is largely credited with turning an offense that statistically ranked as one of the worst in the nation before his arrival into one of the country's most explosive.

One part of the famed and feared Selmon brothers defensive line trio for Oklahoma's vaunted defenses of the early and mid-1970s, Dewey Selmon starred at both defensive tackle and nose guard. In his four years on campus, the Sooners posted a 43-2-1 record, won four straight Big Eight championships and captured national titles his junior and senior seasons of 1974 and '75. In a 16-13 win over Texas in 1974, he registered 22 tackles, which still stands as the single-game school record by a defensive lineman.

(46), Michigan (43), Ohio State (39) and USC (37). The Sooners' 14 league titles since 2000 are the most among Power Five programs (Ohio State ranks second with 11).

► No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which is tied with Alabama with 41 (OU has a nation-leading 18 10-win campaigns since 2000). In addition, OU's 27 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

► Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads the country with its 11,854 points scored, which is 533 points more than second-place Boise State (11,321) and 1,084 more than third-place Oregon (10,770).

► OU's 80 consensus All-Americans since 1950 are the most nationally (Alabama ranks second with 74 and Ohio State third with 72). Since 2000, the Sooners have produced 30 consensus All-Americans, second only to Alabama.

► OU is the only program that has produced at least four NFL Draft picks each of the last 15 years.

EXTRA POINTS

► Oklahoma head coach **Brent Venables**, who is 51, is four years older than **Bud Wilkinson** was when he coached his final game for the Sooners in 1963.

► The Sooners returned exactly two pass attempts from last season, both from current redshirt freshman walk-on **Ralph Rucker**.

► Every OU freshman class from 1999-2019 has won at least one Big 12 championship and all but the 2011 freshman class have won at least two. The 2015, 2016 and 2017 freshman classes each won four Big 12 titles.

► Since 2000, OU is the only program in the country that has not had a losing record in any season.

► OU has won 78 straight games when holding opponents to 23 or fewer points. The last time OU held an opponent to 23 or fewer points and lost was in 2009 (fell 10-3 at Nebraska on Nov. 7).

► Since the start of the 2012 season, OU is 82-5 when scoring at least 35 points and 71-3 when scoring at least 40.

► Oklahoma has registered winning streaks of at least seven games in a school-record seven straight seasons. The previous program record for seven-game winning streaks was six consecutive campaigns (1953-58) under Wilkinson. Since 1980, only Boise State (11 straight seasons; 2002-12) and Alabama (10 straight seasons; 2011-20) have also posted winning streaks of at least seven games in seven consecutive years.

► Over the last seven seasons (since the start of 2015), OU leads the country with its 5.6 yards per rush and ranks fifth nationally (second in Power Five) with its 235 rushing TDs.

► The Sooners are tied for third with their four College Football Playoff appearances (2015, 2017, 2018 and 2019). They are the only Big 12 program to qualify for the CFP.

► Oklahoma is tied for the national lead with five No. 1 overall NFL Draft picks. OU has produced three No. 1 overall picks in the last 13 years alone. No other school has produced more than one during that period.

► After finishing tied for second place at 7-2 in conference play last season, OU failed to qualify for the Big 12 Championship game, snapping a string of six straight league crowns. The Sooners had won their six consecutive titles (2015-2020) in outright fashion, becoming, with Clemson the same years, the first Power Five program to win at least six straight outright conference championships since OU claimed 12 Big Six/Seven crowns in a row under Wilkinson (1948-59).

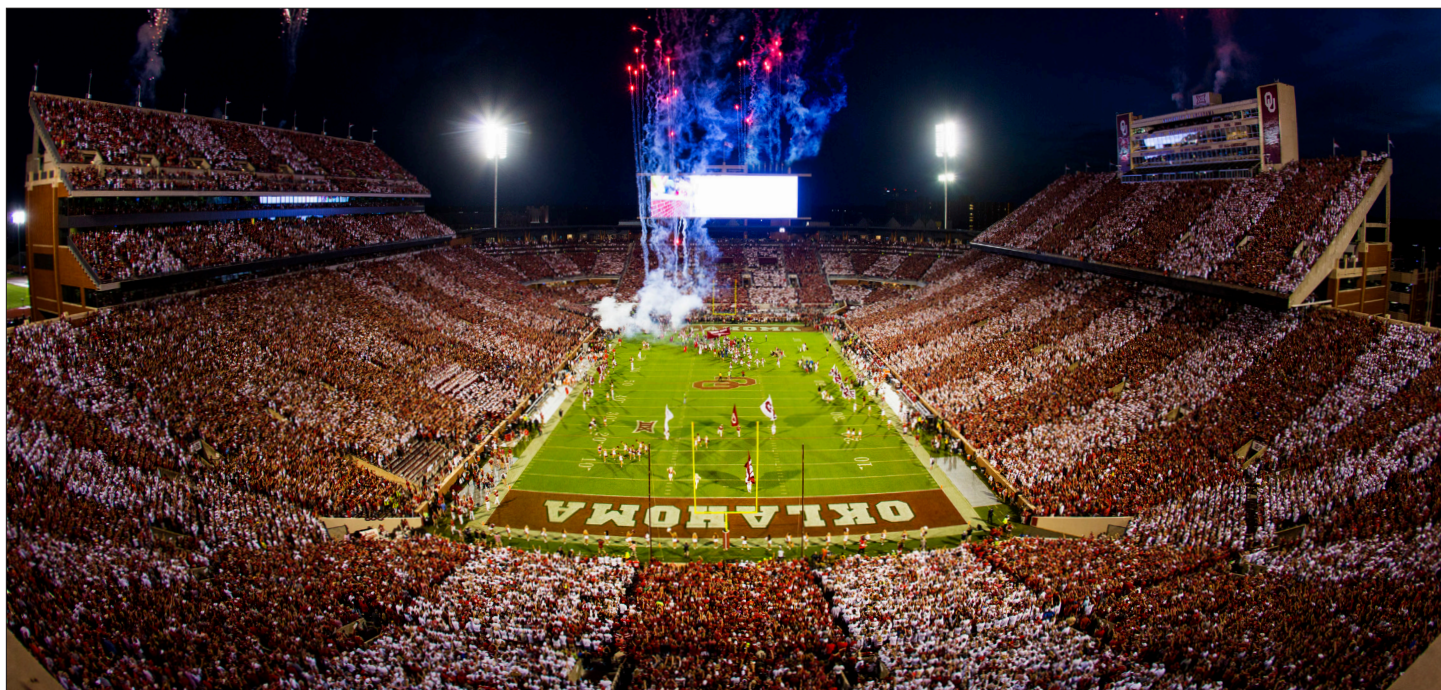
► The Sooners have won just two fewer Big 12 title the last seven seasons (six) than they have lost games against Big 12 opponents (59-8 record; includes four Big 12 Championship games).

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and a 62-foot-by-38-foot video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals, is hosting football games for the 100th year this season. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and 83,489 (2016). With last year's widening of aisles and some seats, capacity dropped to 80,126.
- In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

- The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489. The addition of handrails and some seat and aisle widening in 2019 reduced capacity to 80,126.
- The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons also benefit from two new clubs.
- Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.
- A significantly larger and more detailed video board has replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The new board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

A former 13-year University of Oklahoma assistant coach who won a national championship with the Sooners and two more with Clemson University during an ultra-successful 10-year stint as defensive coordinator, Brent Venables was named OU's 23rd head football coach Dec. 5, 2021.

The 51-year-old Venables served as co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Oklahoma from 1999-2003 and as associate head coach, defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 2004-11 under former head coach Bob Stoops. Venables has coached in eight national championship games between his time at OU and Clemson, winning titles with the Sooners in 2000 and Tigers in 2016 and 2018. In 26 years as a full-time assistant coach, Venables' teams posted 26 winning seasons, won 13 conference titles, went to 30 bowl games (includes four College Football Playoff National Championship games) and won at least 10 games 22 times.

Since joining Clemson prior to the 2012 season, Venables constructed one of the nation's top defenses. Over the last 10 years, the Tigers ranked first nationally in sacks (445; next most was 392), tackles for loss (1,159) and opponent third-down conversion percentage (30.2%), second in opponent pass efficiency rating (111.1) and takeaways (244; tied), third in scoring defense (17.8 ppg) and opponent completion percentage (53.3), fourth in total defense (311.4 ypg) and pass defense (190.5 ypg), fifth in interceptions (148) and sixth in rushing defense (120.9 ypg). They won conference titles each year from 2015-20.

Since 2000, Venables has coached eight national award winners and 18 consensus All-Americans. In that time, 57 defensive players under his guidance have been selected in the NFL Draft (12 first-rounders), including 15 linebackers, two of whom were first-round picks.

As a defensive coordinator and linebackers coach, Venables has produced winners of three Butkus Awards (OU's Rocky Calmus in 2001 and Teddy Lehman in 2003, and CU's Isaiah Simmons in 2019), two Nagurski Awards (OU's Roy Williams in 2001 and Derrick Strait in 2003), two Thorpe Awards (Williams in 2001 and Strait in 2003) and one Bednarik Award (Lehman in 2003). And in 2018, Clemson defensive tackle Christian Wilkins was the school's first winner of William V. Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman."

Venables has received national accolades for his coaching and recruiting. He received the Frank Broyles Award in 2016 as the nation's top assistant coach after being named a finalist in 2015. He was named FootballScoop's Defensive Coordinator of the Year in 2014 and Rivals.com's Recruiter of the Year in 2015.

Venables' defensive units have been remarkably consistent over the last decade. Each of the last eight Clemson defenses have ranked in the top 15 nationally in yards allowed and seven of the last eight have ranked in the top 20 in points allowed. Over the last eight years, his units have ranked first (in 2014), 10th, eighth, fourth, fifth, sixth, 15th and ninth (last season) in total defense. Additionally, his units ranked first or second in the ACC in total defense each of the last eight years (ranked first in six of those seasons).

Under Venables' tutelage this year, Clemson ranks second nationally in scoring defense (15.0 ppg) and red zone defense (62.1 conversion percentage), fourth in sacks (3.4 per game), eighth in rushing defense (98.8 ypg) and ninth in total defense (308.4 ypg).

Venables' 2020 Clemson defense tied for the national lead with 46 sacks, despite no player producing more than 4.5 sacks individually. His 2019 unit allowed fewer than 300 yards of total offense in each of its first 12 games of the season, the first defense nationally since at least 1996 to accomplish that feat. Clemson held 16 straight opponents to 20 or fewer points across the 2018-19 seasons, the best streak at the school since the 1937-40 seasons.

Clemson's 2018 squad led the nation in scoring defense (13.1 ppg) for the first time in school history and set a program record by recording 54 sacks.

Venables' Clemson defenses have ranked among the top 10 nationally in sacks each year since 2014 and ranked in the top 10 in tackles for loss from 2013-20. The units led the nation in TFLs every year from 2013-16. The Tigers also ranked among the top 50 nationally in takeaways in each of his 10 seasons.

From 1999-2011, Venables helped Oklahoma to the 2000 national championship, three other national championship game appearances (2003, '04 and '08) and seven Big 12 titles. He was a finalist for the Broyles Award in 2006 when OU led the Big 12 in total defense and scoring defense.

Oklahoma linebackers under Venables' direction earned three Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year awards, five Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year accolades and six first-team All-America honors. Ten of his OU linebackers — and 31 defensive players overall — were taken in the 2000-12 NFL Drafts.

While Venables was at Oklahoma, the Sooners ranked among the top 16 nationally in total defense eight times (including each year from 2000-06) and among the top 20 in scoring defense eight times. OU led the Big 12 in scoring defense on four occasions (2000, '04, '06, '11) and topped the league in total defense three times (2003, '04, '06).

Prior to joining Stoops' first staff at Oklahoma, Venables coached linebackers at Kansas State (1996-98), holding the title of defensive running game coordinator in 1998, and served as a graduate assistant at K-State under Bill Snyder from 1993-95.

As a player at Kansas State (1991-92), Venables earned honorable mention All-Big Eight honors in 1992 after registering 124 tackles. He began his collegiate career at Garden City (Kan.) Community College (1989-90), where he earned All-America honors after recording 276 tackles.

A native of Salina, Kan., Venables received his bachelor's degree in political science from Kansas State in 1992. He and his wife Julie have four children: sons Jake and Tyler and daughters Laney and Addie.

NORMAN — Oklahoma made Brent Venables' first game as a head coach a memorable one as it raced to a 21-0 lead in the first 8:17 and beat UTEP 45-13. The Sooners outgained the Miners by 176 yards (492-316) and showcased a balanced offensive attack with 259 rushing yards and 233 passing yards. They allowed just 28 rushing yards on 31 carries.

In his OU debut, quarterback Dillon Gabriel completed 15 of 23 passes for 233 yards and two touchdowns. He also rushed six times for 20 yards and scored on a 12-yard burst for the game's first points. Tight end Brayden Willis caught both TD passes (scoring from six and 28 yards) the second of which gave OU a 28-10 lead.

Eric Gray rushed a team-high 16 times for 102 yards, marking his sixth-career 100-yard game and first as a Sooner. Marcus Major ran seven times for 54 yards and scored from one and six yards in the third quarter. On his second-career play and first touch, freshman receiver Gavin Freeman scored on a 46-yard rushing play to give the Sooners a 21-0 lead.

Safety Billy Bowman and linebacker Danny Stutsman led OU with nine tackles apiece, career highs for both. Defensive end Reggie Grimes finished with a career-high 2.5 sacks and cornerback Gentry Williams recorded an interception in the end zone on UTEP's final possession. OU possessed the ball for just 21:27 out of 60 minutes.
